Jack Fine, LCPD received a report from the victim, a Wolf

creek Road, Spring City man that he had four checks written to the Ingles Store on Highway 321 in Lenoir City totaling \$1610.

On December 14th, 2007, the victim filed a theft report with the Alcoa Police Department where his check book was stolen out of his room at the Cornerstone of Recovery in Blount County sometime between November 17th and December 12th, 2007.

While in the process of Detective Fine's investigation, it was discovered that Bradley Lucas Brooks took

the checks into Ingles on November 27th and 28th, and December 5th and 19th of 2007 and cashed one check for each of those days for the total amount of \$1610.

Deputy Robert Gray, LCSO made the arrest Monday at the Roane County Jail.

Murphy

Murphy Circle, Sevierville was charged with possession of Schedule VI (marijuana), possession of schedule II (oxycontin) and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The report states, on Saturday, at ap-

proximately 8:40 PM, Officer Blake Norman, LPD, noticed a Honda Accord swerve off the roadway and back on, while traveling west on Highway 72, in Loudon. He stopped the vehicle at Holt Drive. The driver, Mr. Daniel Murphy, had very glossy eyes and there was an odor of marijuana coming from the car. Officer Norman asked for consent to search his vehicle, so Mr. Murphy advised he had a small baggie of marijuana and a glass pipe that he used to smoke marijuana. A search of the vehicle uncovered the marijuana on the drivers side floor board. A search of Mr. Murphy revealed a syringe in his right front pocket and a 30 mg oxycontin in his right front watch pocket. He advised, he used the syringe to inject the oxycontin.
