



James Kenneth Henderson, 64, Old Lee Highway, Philadelphia, was charged with possession of marijuana for resale, possession of drug parphernalia, possession of schedule II - III - IV for resale and possession of legend drug.

The report states, on Monday, January 11th, 2010, at 7:33 pm, The Loudon County Narcotics Division assisted by LCSO Patrol Division, served a search warrant at the home of James K. Henderson, on Old Lee Highway, in Philadelphia.

While searching

Henderson's room, a cooler containing three bags of a plant substance believed to be marijuana and several pill bottles containing schedule II, III and IV pills were discovered in his closet, along with another bag of a plant substance believed to be marijuana in a coat pocket.

A plastic bag containing legend drugs, postal scales and another bag of a plant substance believed to be marijuana was found in his night stand. A set of digital scales, used to weigh marijuana was discovered in the bottom of a gun case, also in

Henderson's room.

Another plastic bag containing a plant substance, believed to be marijuana was found in the garage. The total weight of the marijuana, discovered during the search warrant was approximately 4 ounces. A total of 11 oxicodone pills (schedule II), 29 hydrocodone pills (schedule III), 10 diazepam, 32 alprazolam pills (schedule IV), were discovered, as well as 46 cyclobenzaprine (legend drug).

Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO - ND, made the arrest. Sgt. Billy Hall, LCSO - ND, was also on the scene.
