A Loudon man reportedly violated the conditions of his bail when he allegedly beat his girlfriend bloody, then threatened to cut her and her mother's heads off when her mother came to pick her up.

Ronnie Lynn Helton, 37, West Lee Highway, Loudon was charged with aggravated assault (domestic violence) and aggravated assault.

The report states, on Wednesday, around 11:16 PM, Sgt. Jimmey J. Wiggins. LCSO responded to a domestic violence call on West Lee Highway and

upon arrival found a woman and her mother sitting in a van at the end of the driveway. Ronnie Helton was inside a trailer at the address.

Sgt. Wiggins, Sgt. AJ Yokely and Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSO went to the trailer and knocked on the door. One of the officers saw Helton walk toward the back bedroom in the trailer. After several minutes he opened the door.

The glass window had been busted out of the front door and there was blood spatters on the couch, carpet and on the front porch of the residence.

Mr. Helton advised he and his girlfriend had been arguing because she wasn't

supposed to be there. The woman locked him out of the house and he busted the window to get back in. He said he didn't hit her.

Deputy Wiggins went to speak to the complainant in the van. She was sitting in the passenger side. The woman had blood all over her face. She also had a place on her bottom lip that had been torn off, a swollen red area on her right cheek and temple and her top teeth seemed to be loose and bleeding.

The victim stated they were arguing at Helton's mother's house and he pushed her down and hit her. She called her mother and asked her to come and get her. Helton then carried the woman down the

driveway from his mom's house to the trailer and threw her down onto the floor.

When the victim's mother arrived, she saw her daughter in the floor and tried to get her up. The victim's mother called Ronnie's mom's house to try and get assistance in getting her daughter. She went to the bedroom to get some of her daughter's clothes and when Helton came into the trailer he asked his girlfriend where her mom was and then told her mother to get out. He then hit his girlfriend several times in the head and face. causing lacerations. bruising and loose teeth.

At one point, Helton is accused of pulling a knife from his pocket and threatening to cut his girlfriend's and her mother's heads off. This caused the mother to fear for her and her daughter's

life and safety. She was trying to get her daughter out of the trailer and into the van. When they walked out onto the front porch Helton pushed them both and threatened to cut their heads off again.

The women got in the van and drove down the driveway, where they called 911.

Ronnie Helton did have some red, swollen areas on his hands and knuckles and some minor bleeding. Ronnie Helton is under a condition of bail for a prior domestic violence arrest on his girlfriend.

At an earlier TWRC meeting, there were several proposals for new license types including a one-day non-resident fishing, and a one-day resident trout license. TWRA officials will review the proposals and also present information on implementing a new fishing quide license.
