LCPD charges McGhee Square man with 'script forgery'

LCPD Detective Jonathan Sartin arrested a McGhee Square man on charges he altered a prescription by adding a pain killer to it.

Michael Lee 'Mikie' Lane, 29, Kelly Lane, Lenoir City was charged with prescription forgery.

According to the affidavit filed by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about January 11th, 2010, Michael Lane went to Walgreens on Highway 321 in Lenoir City where he took a prescription into the pharmacy to have it filled.

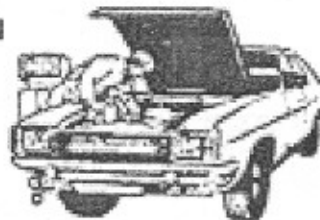

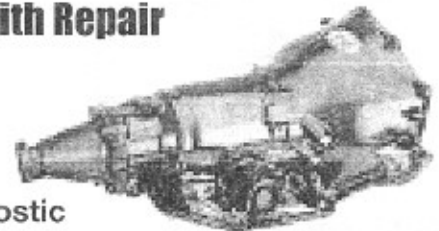


Christopher Jeffrey 'Chris' Bratten, 23,
