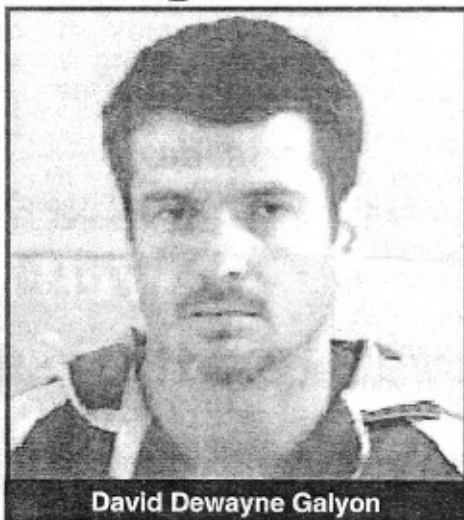

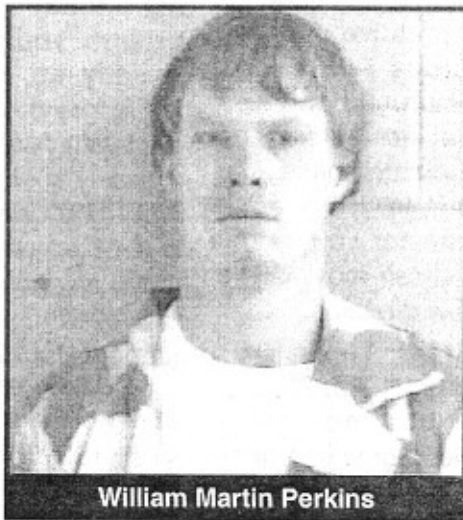

According to reports, Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD was dispatched to

Walmart Friday in reference to a shoplifter and Asset Protection personnel stated they witnessed Mr. Patton take a CD from the electronics department to hardware.

Mr. Patton opened a BBQ container and placed the CD into the container before going to sporting goods where he got a knife case. Patton then proceeded to go to furniture and took the knife out of the case and placed it in his front pocket before going to pay for his other items.

Patton passed all points of sale.

The items totaled \$22.88. The CD was damaged and Walmart is seeking restitution of \$22.88.

According to the report, Deputy

Bobby Hamilton, LCSO responded to a Browder Hollow Road residence at around 8:27 AM, to a domestic involving a gun and upon arrival talked to David Galyon, who stated his girlfriend's son shot at him. When Deputy Hamilton talked with the accused and his mother and sister, they stated at about 4:00 AM Galyon was in his girlfriend's son's room drinking, when his girlfriend, identified as Buffy Cusick, asked him what he was doing.

Galyon reportedly began to cuss at Cusick, then began to hit himself and grabbed a gun. Cusick tried to get the gun away from him and he started hitting her in the head, telling her he would kill her and her son.

Cusick reported she got the gun

from Galyon. Galyon was still upset and would not calm down. He grabbed the gun again and began to threaten Cusick's son.

Both told Galyon to leave, and he went downstairs, but would not leave. The son had a 20 gauge shot gun and told Galyon to leave and he refused. Cusick's son fired a shot into the air to try to make Galyon leave. Galyon told him to kill him, then got on his cell phone and called his father and told him to bring his brothers and a gun to kill Cusick and her son.

Galyon does have a active no contact order of protection on him out of General Session Court in Loudon County. The petitioner is Buffy Cusick.

Buffy Belinda Cusick, 35, Browder Hollow Road, Lenoir City was charged with violation of domestic violence order. Records indicate Cusick was in violation of her own order of protection due to being in the presence of Galyon.

The security officer

said he stopped Ms. Roberts in the exit area after she passed all points of sale and the final point of sale.

The stolen merchandise totaled \$45. All items were recovered and no restitution was sought.

Tennessee.
