Man uses his own ID in check forgery

When a Maryville man reported the theft of one of his checks, an investigation revealed his former neighbor had taken it and forged it in Greenback, using his own driver's license number.

Torrey Lee Durmer, 29, Brookfield Lane, Maryville was charged with forgery.

According to the affidavit filed by Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO-CID; on

September 13th, 2010, Mr. James McNally, also of Brookfield Lane, Maryville, reported the theft of a check from his residence. The check was number 493 and was found to have been forged on September 3rd, 2010, at the IGA Store in Greenback, in the amount of \$88. Mr. McNally advised the only person that had been in his home was Mr. Torrey Durmer

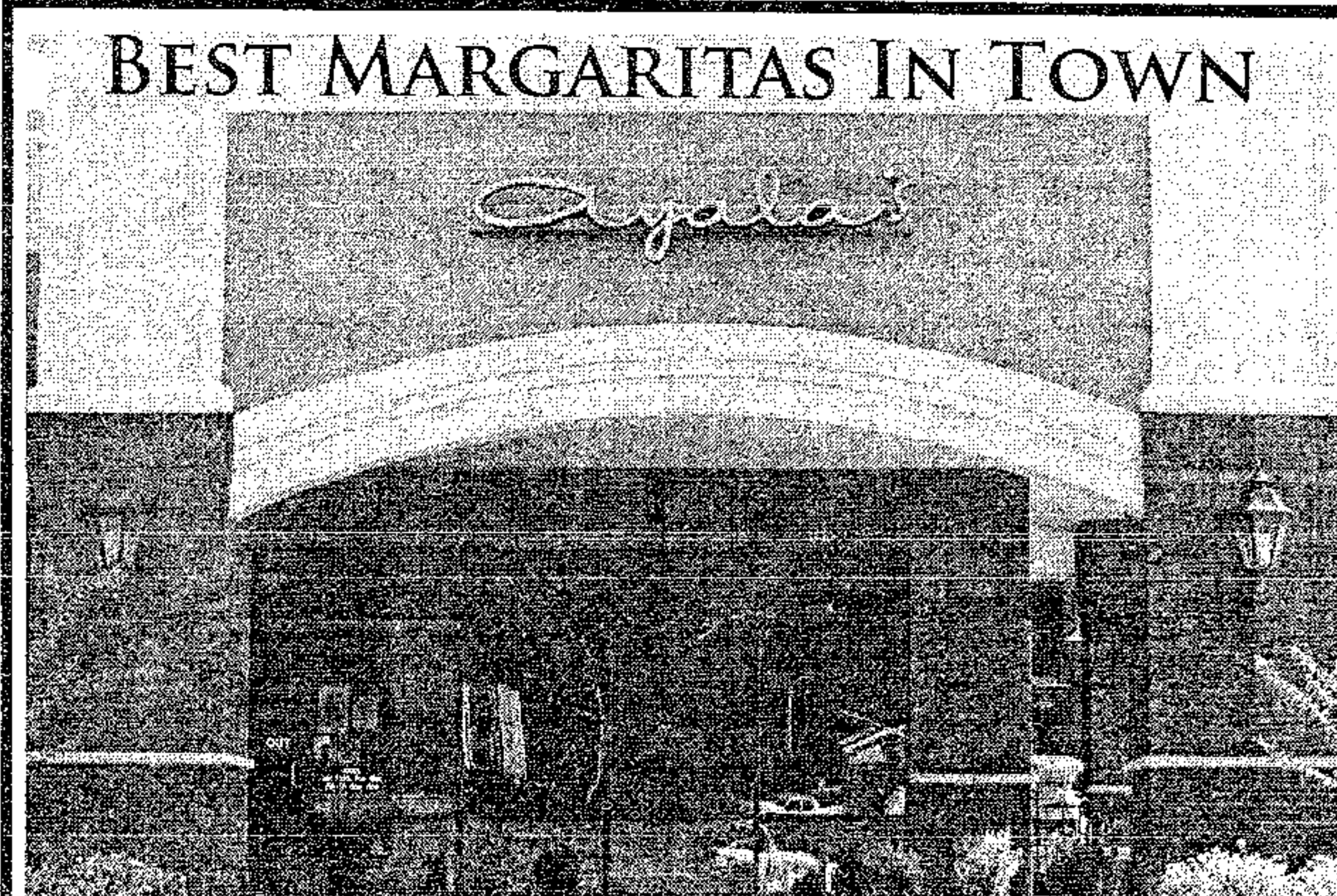

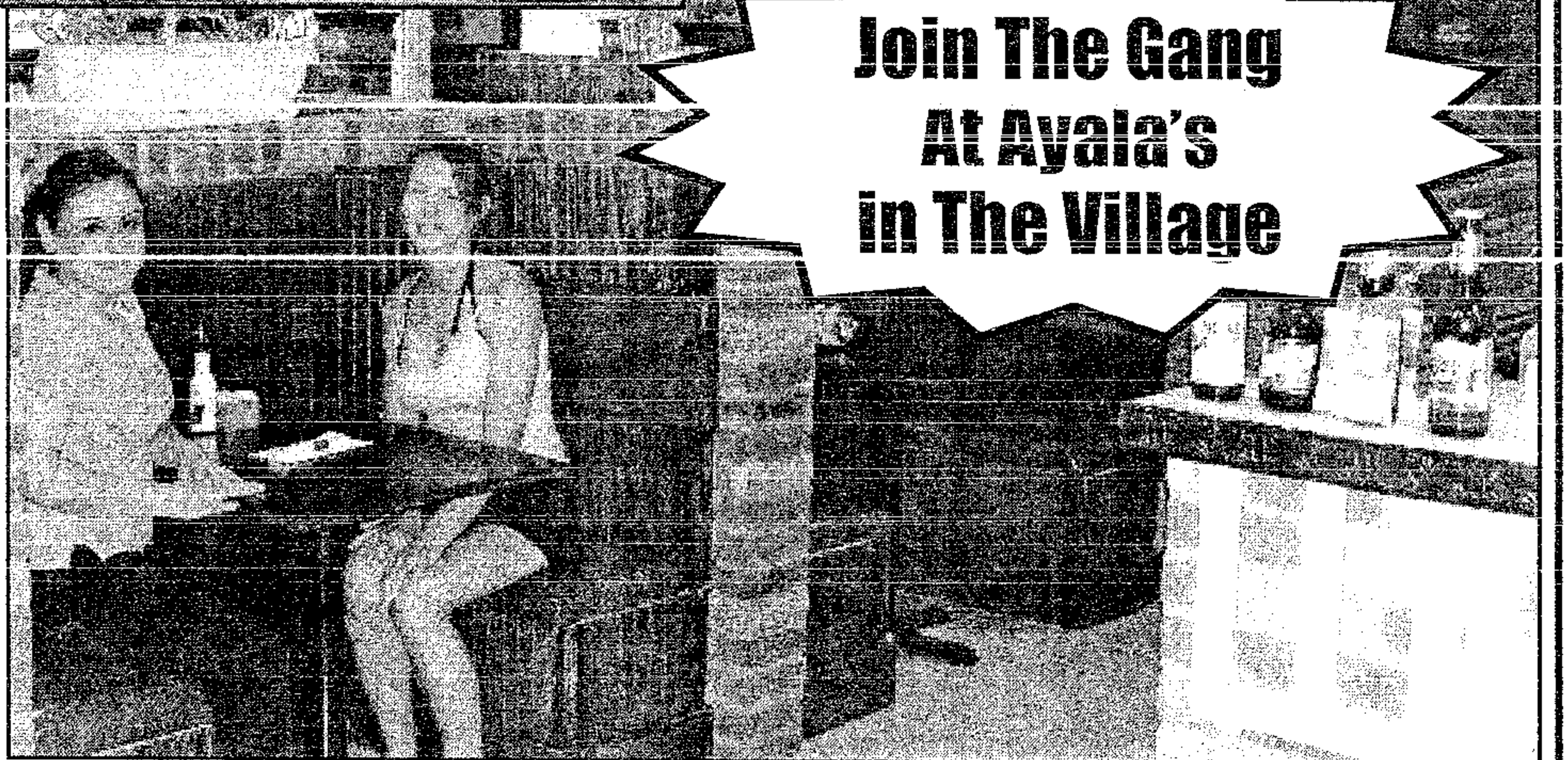
