The box was left outside the church.





Sales tax collections were \$1.0 million more than the estimate for September. The September growth rate was 2.15%.

Franchise and excise taxes combined were \$22.9 million above the September budgeted estimate of \$246.6 million. The September growth rate was 10.36%.

Gasoline and motor fuel collections for September increased by 15.08% and they were \$3.9 million above the budgeted estimate of \$70.8 million.

Tobacco tax collections for the month were under collected by \$1.2 million, and the growth rate was negative

Privilege tax collections were \$3.8 million less than the budgeted estimate of \$17.5 million.

Inheritance and Estate tax collections were \$2.7 million above the budgeted estimate.

All other taxes were over collected by a net of \$15.5 million.

Year-to date collections for two months were \$35.6 million more than the budgeted estimate. The general fund was over collected by \$17.8 million and the four other funds were over collected by \$17.8 million.

The budgeted revenue estimates for 2010-2011 are based on the State Funding Board's recommendation consensus of April 7, 2010 and adopted by the second session of the 106th General Assembly in June. They are available on the state's website at http://




