LC woman charged with forging stolen checks for court costs

A Lenoir City woman is accused of forging at least two stolen checks and using them to pay on her court costs at the Loudon County Justice Center.

Lisa Lynn McCord, 43, White Wing Road, Lenoir City was charged with two counts of forgery.

According to affidavits, filed by Investigator Jason R. Smith, LCSO-CID; on Thursday, August 26th, 2010 and Thursday, September 16th, 2010, Ms. Lisa McCord presented a check to the Loudon County General Sessions Court at the Justice Center, both in the

Young Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with possession of schedule IV, possession of drug paraphernalia and simple possession of schedule VI.

According to reports, Wednesday, at approximately 5:26 pm, Investigator Jason Butler, LCPD-Narcotics Division made contact with William Young for a follow up investigation. Young gave Investigator Butler and other officers consent to search his residence.

Upon searching Young's residence, officers found approximately 3 pills, identified as alprazolam, a schedule IV controlled substance in his bedroom. Young stated he did not have a prescription for alprazolam.

Officers also discovered a small quantity of a green plant substance, believed to be marijuana, several small straws containing a white powdery residue, commonly used to snort controlled substances and 1 small pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana.

Investigator Butler made the arrest. 9th DTF Agent Brendan DeBoer was also on scene.

and the GHSO are also asking all Tennesseans to step up and talk to teens about important issues like wearing a safety belt, avoiding distracted driving and underage drinking.

"Traffic crashes are still the leading cause of death for teens in America and it is up to all of us to work to reverse this trend," said GHSO Director Kendell Poole. "Our employees and partners are in schools every week talking to teens about safe driving practices and these efforts are working, but it takes the entire community - parents, teachers, neighbors, friends and teens themselves - to promote safe driving and stop teen

driving deaths." Over the last three years, Tennessee has reduced the number of teens killed in traffic crashes by 70. In 2007, 166 teens died on Tennessee roadways. That dropped to 113 in 2008 and preliminary statistics show a drop to 96 in 2009. Still, teenaged drivers are more likely to be involved in a fatal crash than any other age group.

TDOT and the GHSO remind teens that distracted driving can have deadly results. Never text, tweet or talk on a cell phone while driving. Texting while driving is against the law in Tennessee and using a cell phone while driving is a violation of Tennessee's Graduated Driver License rules for teens. Teens should always avoid alcohol and parents should never promote underage drinking. It is against the law and comes with adult consequences. Teens should always wear a seat belt whether driving across town or around the block. It's the best protection from injury or death in the event of a traffic crash and it's the law in Tennessee. Wearing a seat belt costs nothing, but not wearing one could cost a life.

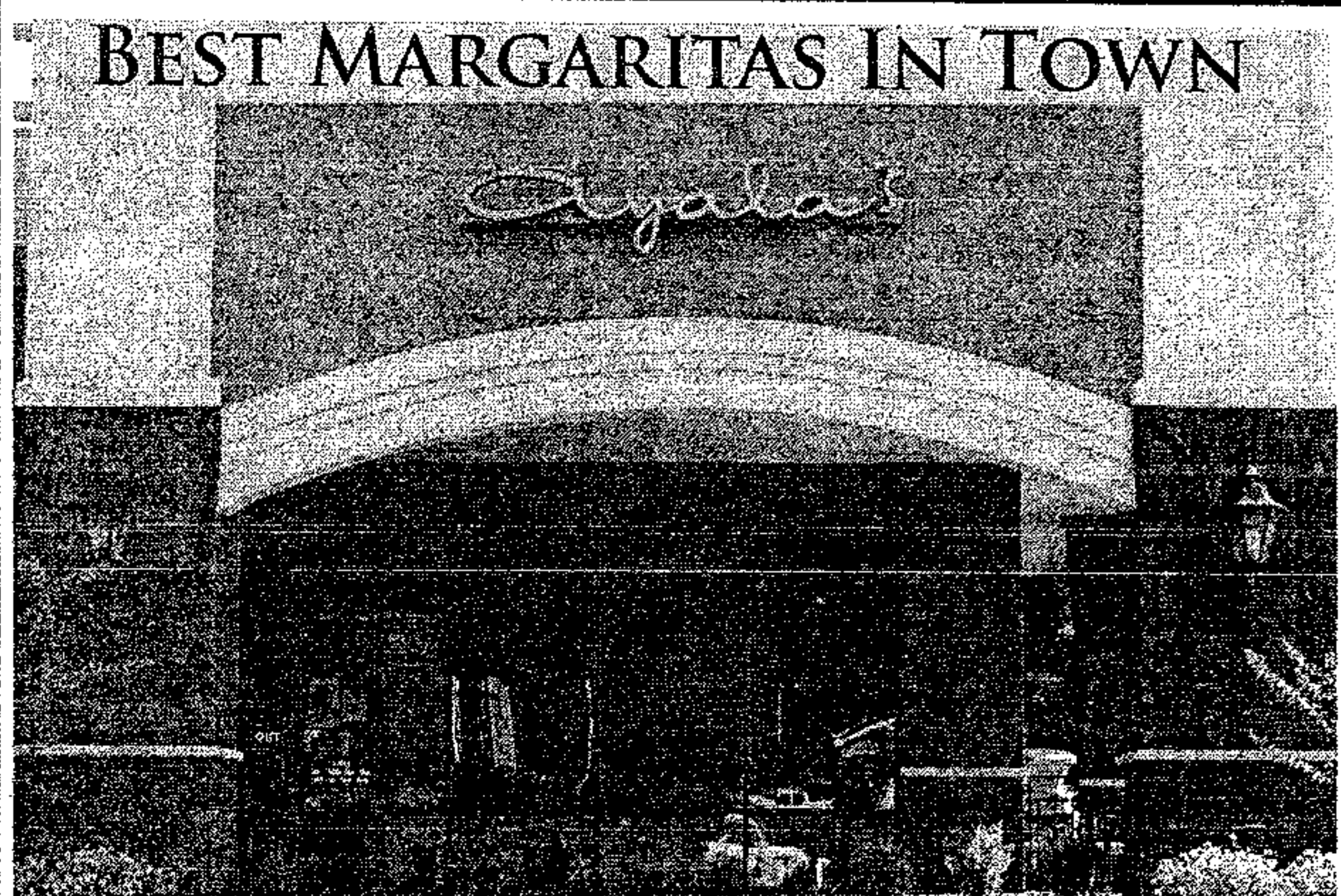

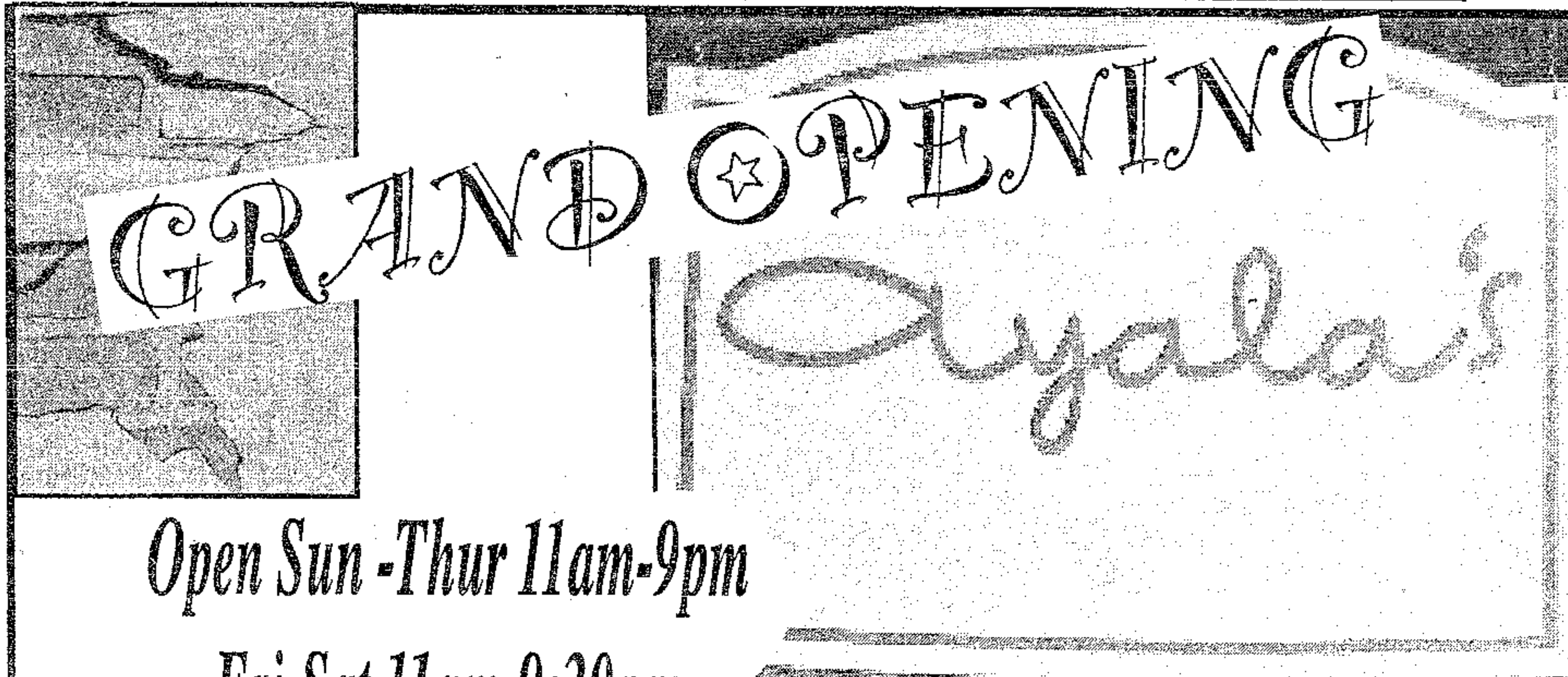

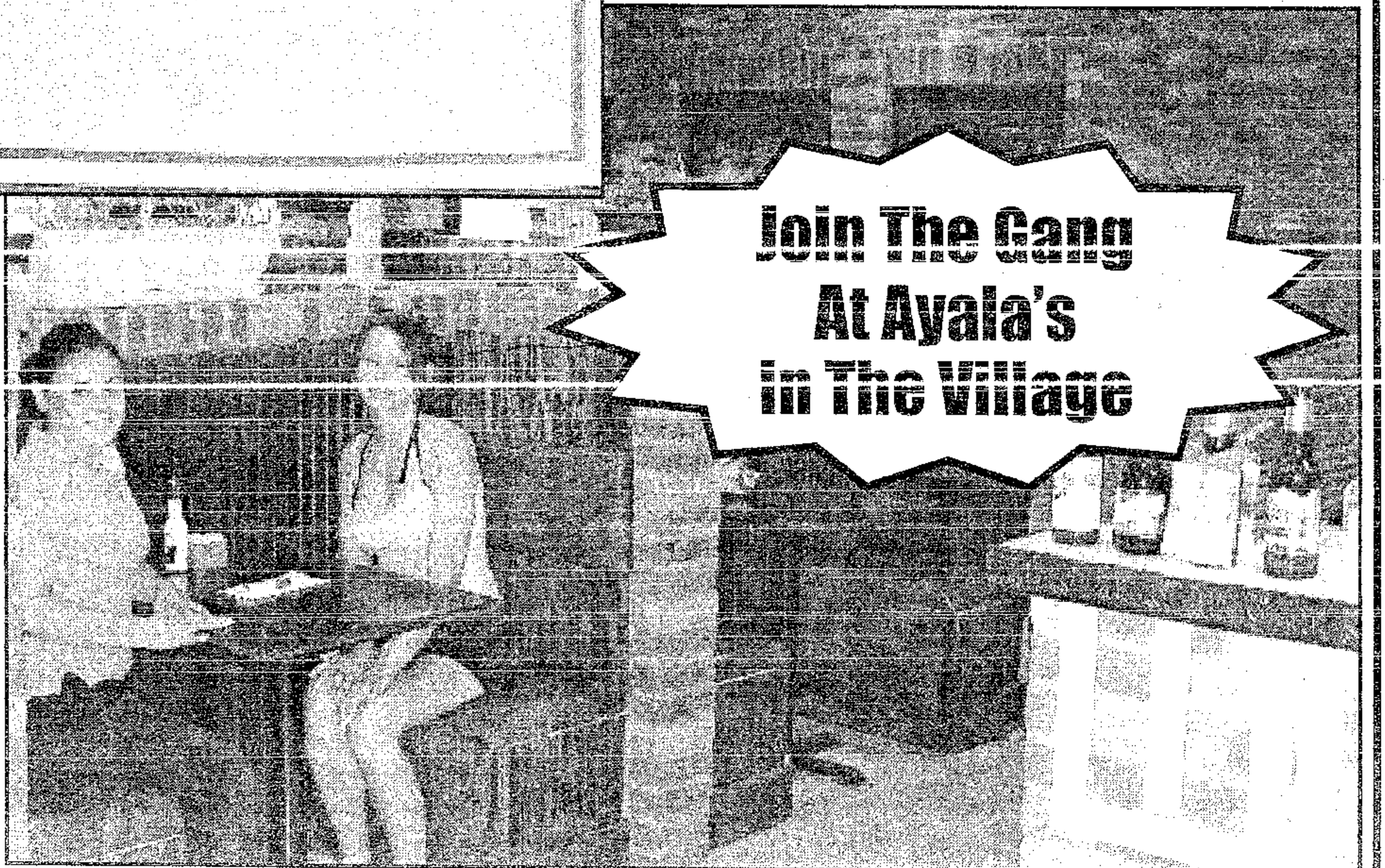

Ms. Sarno was seen attempting to conceal the plas-

tic baggy in her pants during the initial interview. She was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail by Loudon City Unit C2. Trooper Eric Miller, THP, made the arrests.
