
Convicted felon found with drugs, loaded weapon


Man charged with shoplifting after hotel visit tools & hardware

The victim said Gonzalez hit her on the right side of her face with his closed fist.


Mr. Gonzalez had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and he stated she would not let him out of the room and when he got out he went downstairs.






