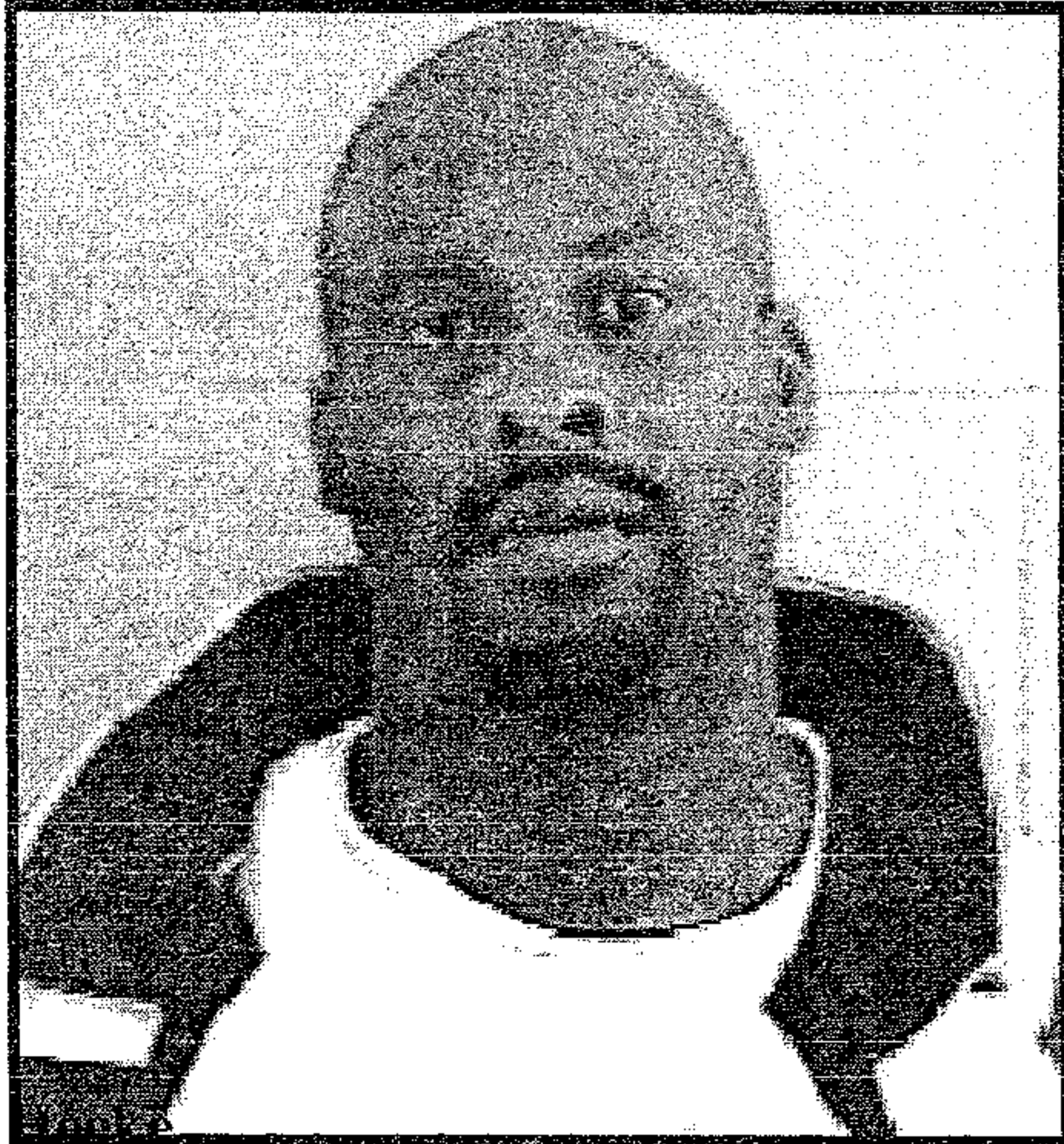
Convicted felon found with drugs, loaded weapon

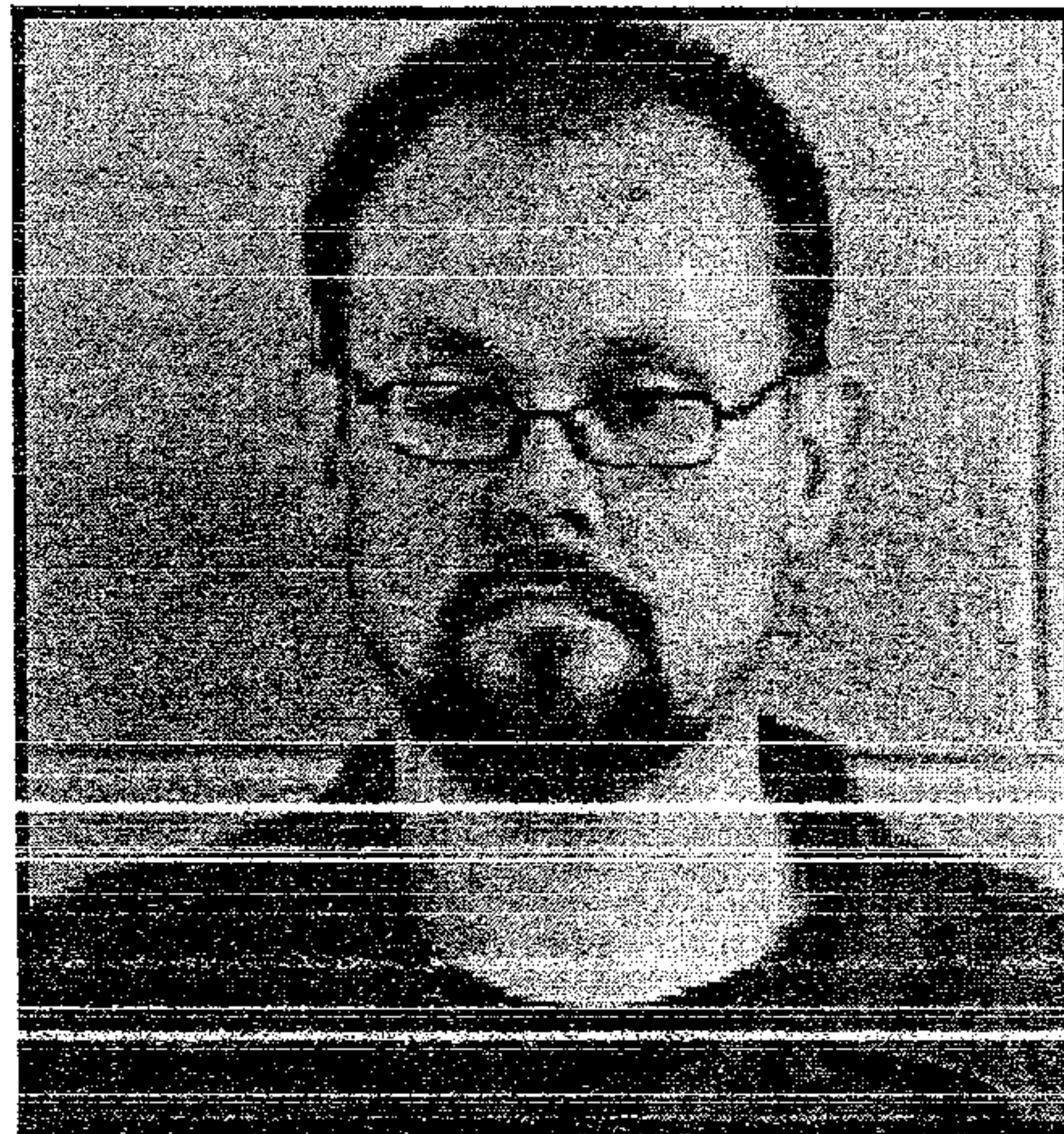
Man charged with shoplifting tools & hardware

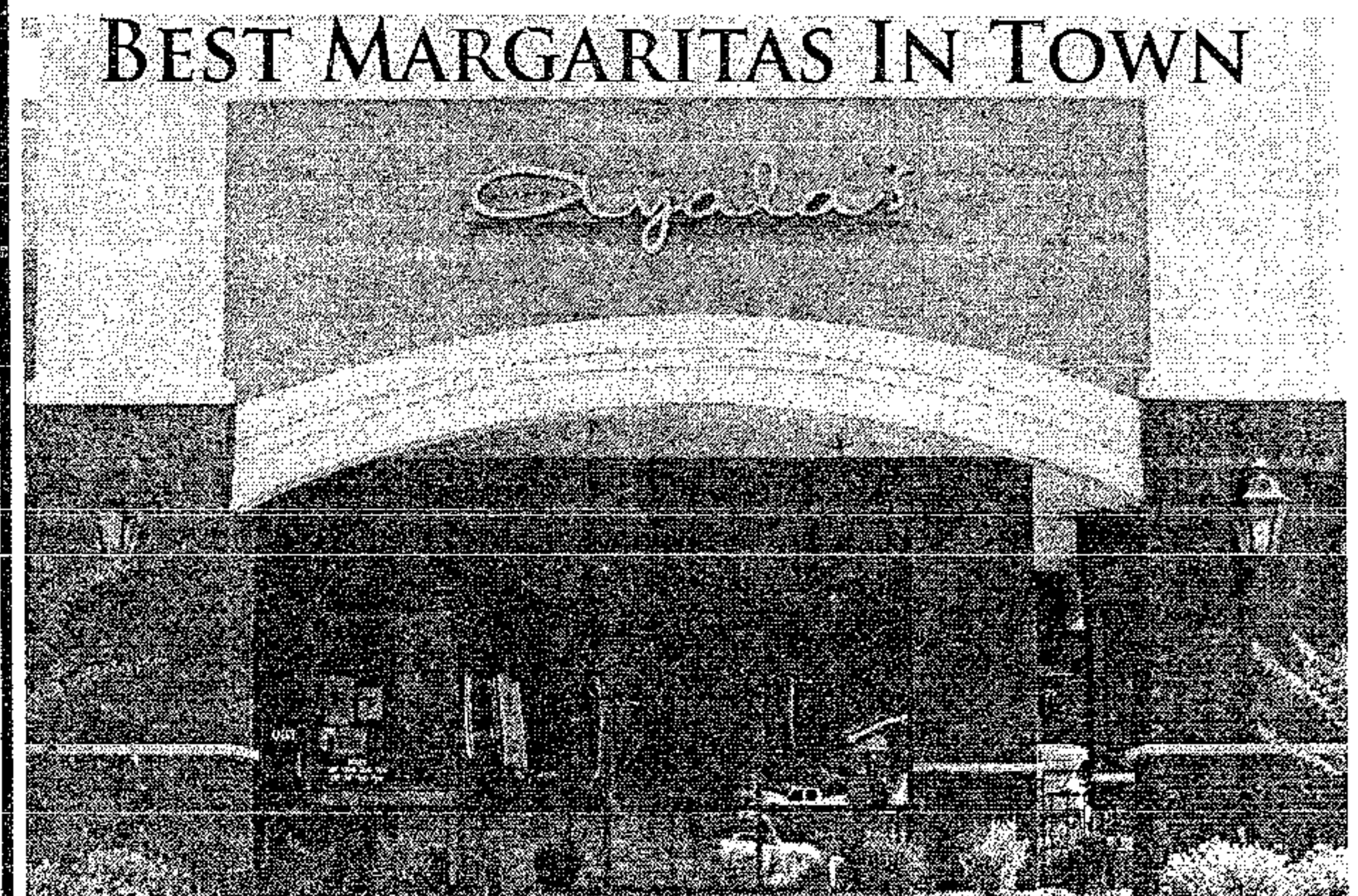

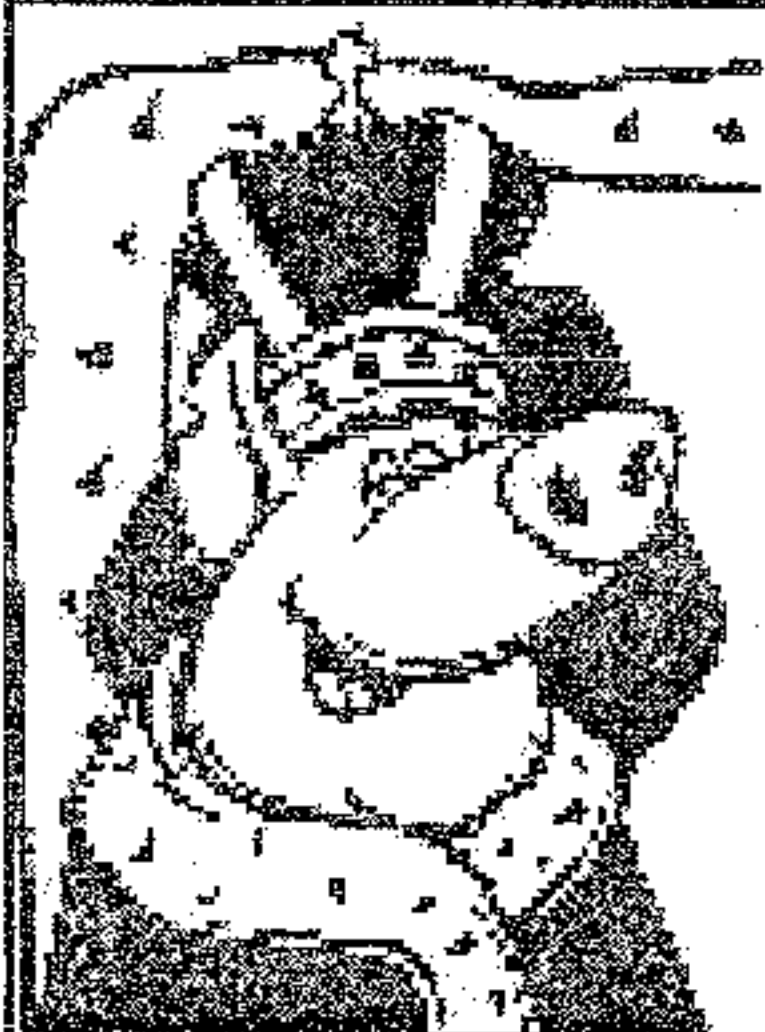

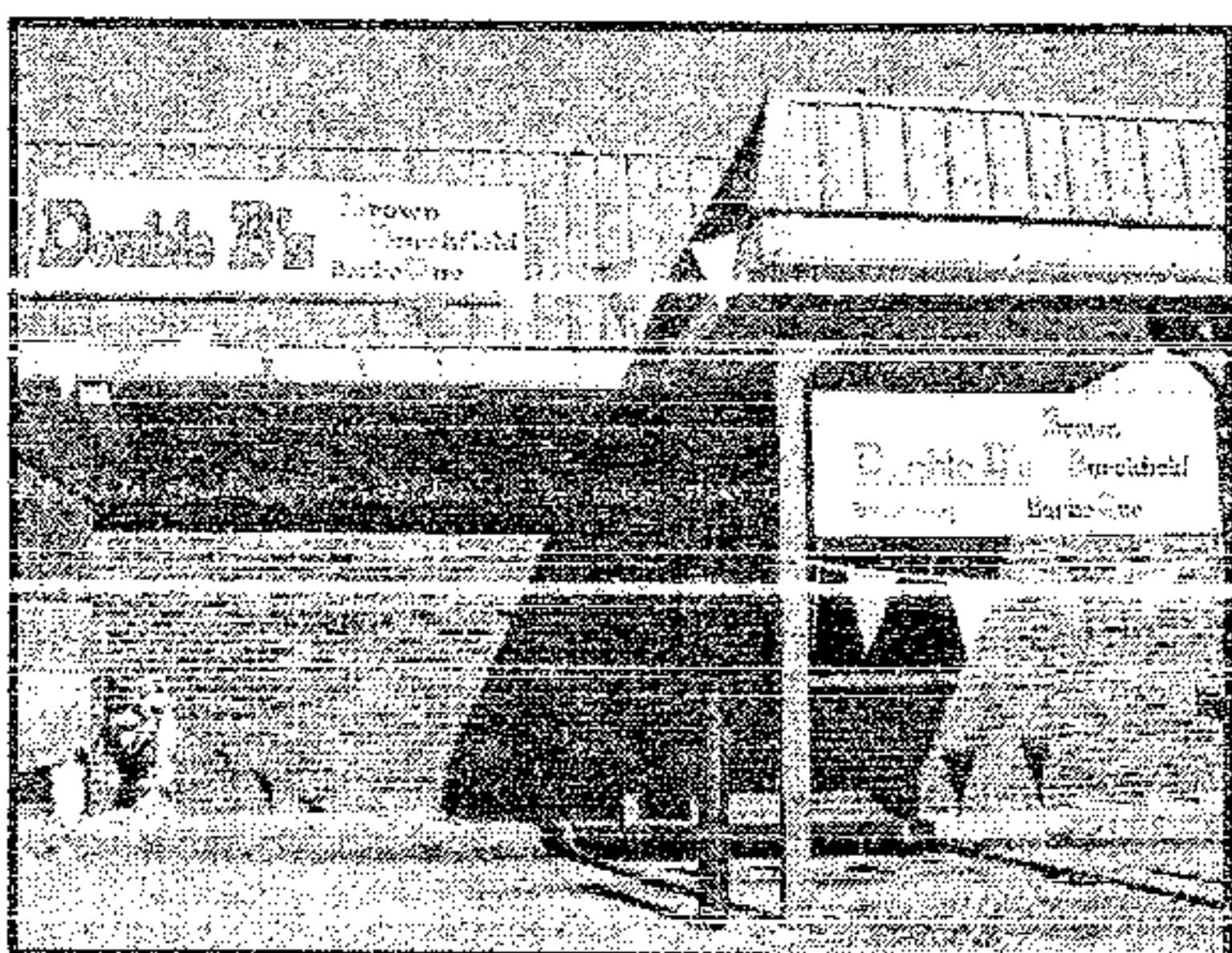
