

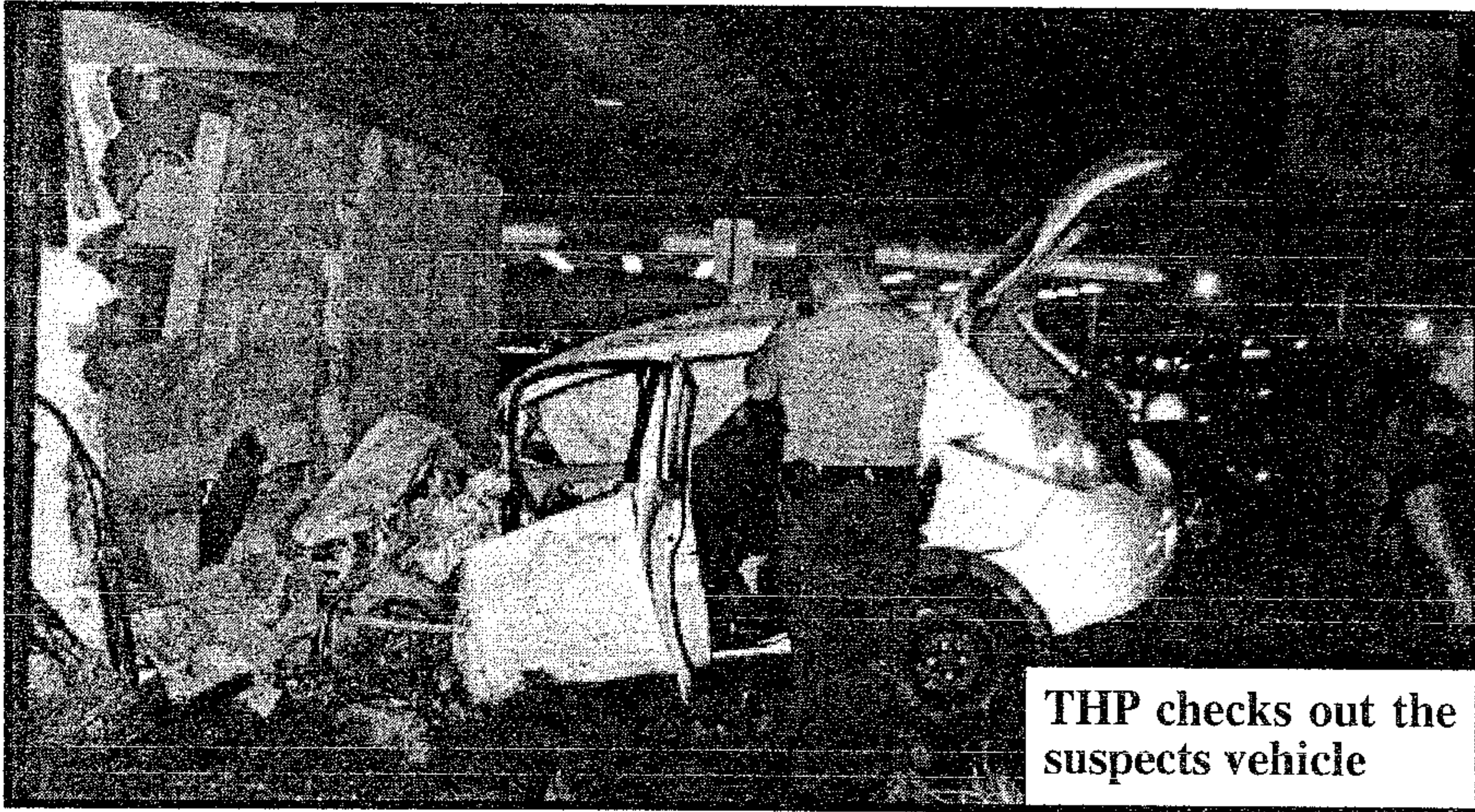

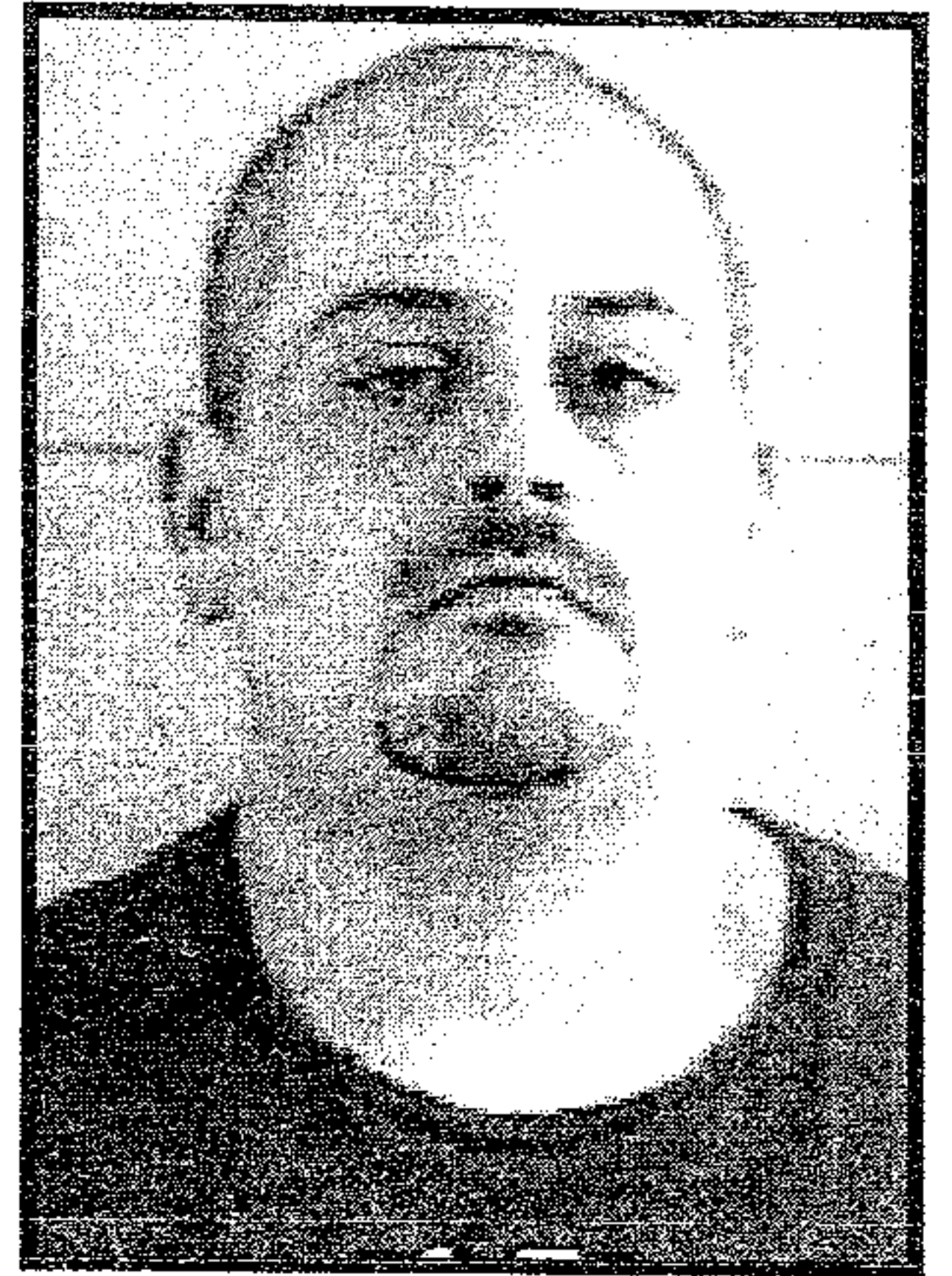

## Restrictions

Director Bo Irvin said, "Maintaining public safety is the Board of Probation and Parole's primary mission. We put these restrictions in writing to make sure the sex offenders we supervise know what activities are inappropriate for them."

The letters advise sex offenders that:

- \* Neither they, nor anyone in their home, can answer the door to trick or treaters on Halloween;
- \* They cannot pass out candy;
- \* Their homes cannot be decorated for Halloween, either inside or outside;
- \* They cannot host Halloween parties at their homes;
- \* They cannot go to haunted houses, corn mazes, hay rides or any other seasonal activity;
- \* They cannot be at any function where children are gathered, including private residences;
- \* They cannot give any Halloween treats to chil-

dren;

\* They cannot wear costumes and

\* They cannot take any child trick or treating.

BOPP officers will enforce the restrictions throughout the month. BOPP Field Services Director Gary Tullock said, "During the rest of the Halloween season, officers will make additional visits, both announced and unannounced, to verify that the sex offenders on their caseloads are in compliance with these restrictions. On many of these visits, the probation and parole officers will be accompanied by local law enforcement officers for added emphasis on the seriousness of our restrictions."

The Board of Probation and Parole (<http://www.tn.gov/bopp/>) is an independent seven-member board whose

members are appointed by the Governor. The Board is charged with the responsibility of deciding which eligible felony offenders will be granted parole and released from incarceration to community-based supervision. Along with the supervision of those granted parole, the Board is also responsible for supervising felony offenders who are placed on probation by criminal courts.

### Chase

According to Chief Deputy Tony Aikens, LCSO, Officers from the 10th Judicial Task Force in McMinn County were the first to make contact with the individual in a Nissan Versa on a routine traffic stop. As officers approached the vehicle, the driver from Ohio sped off. We were contacted after Monroe County was unable to stop the suspect, Aikens stated.

McMinn officers lost the subject but he was shortly

spotted by officers in Monroe county who attempted to stop the vehicle. However the driver chose to flee yet again.

As the driver fled through Monroe County, Loudon County officers were notified of the chase heading into Loudon County on Hwy 11. Just minutes later the suspect entered Loudon County where Loudon County officers picked up the pursuit.

The chase continued north on Hwy. 11 through Philadelphia, the city of Loudon and

Lenoir City at incredibly high speeds of 80-90 mph.

The driver of the Nissan lost control of the car at Dixie Lee Junction and slammed head on into the front of the First National Bank.

It was also reported the driver either jumped or was ejected from his car just before the car hit the building. The driver slammed into the side of the building and sustained multiple injuries from the impact but was conscious and speaking to officers at the scene.

The suspect told officers he had warrants out of Georgia was why he ran.

The entire chase lasted close to 30 minutes.

Tramell stated a wire chain was cut and tracks in the grass indicated a vehicle was used to load the four-wheeler.

The value of the four-wheeler was estimated at \$1500. The case is under investigation.
