A local woman called authorities after her brother allegedly took her vehicle without her permission, and ultimately wrecked it before running away on foot.

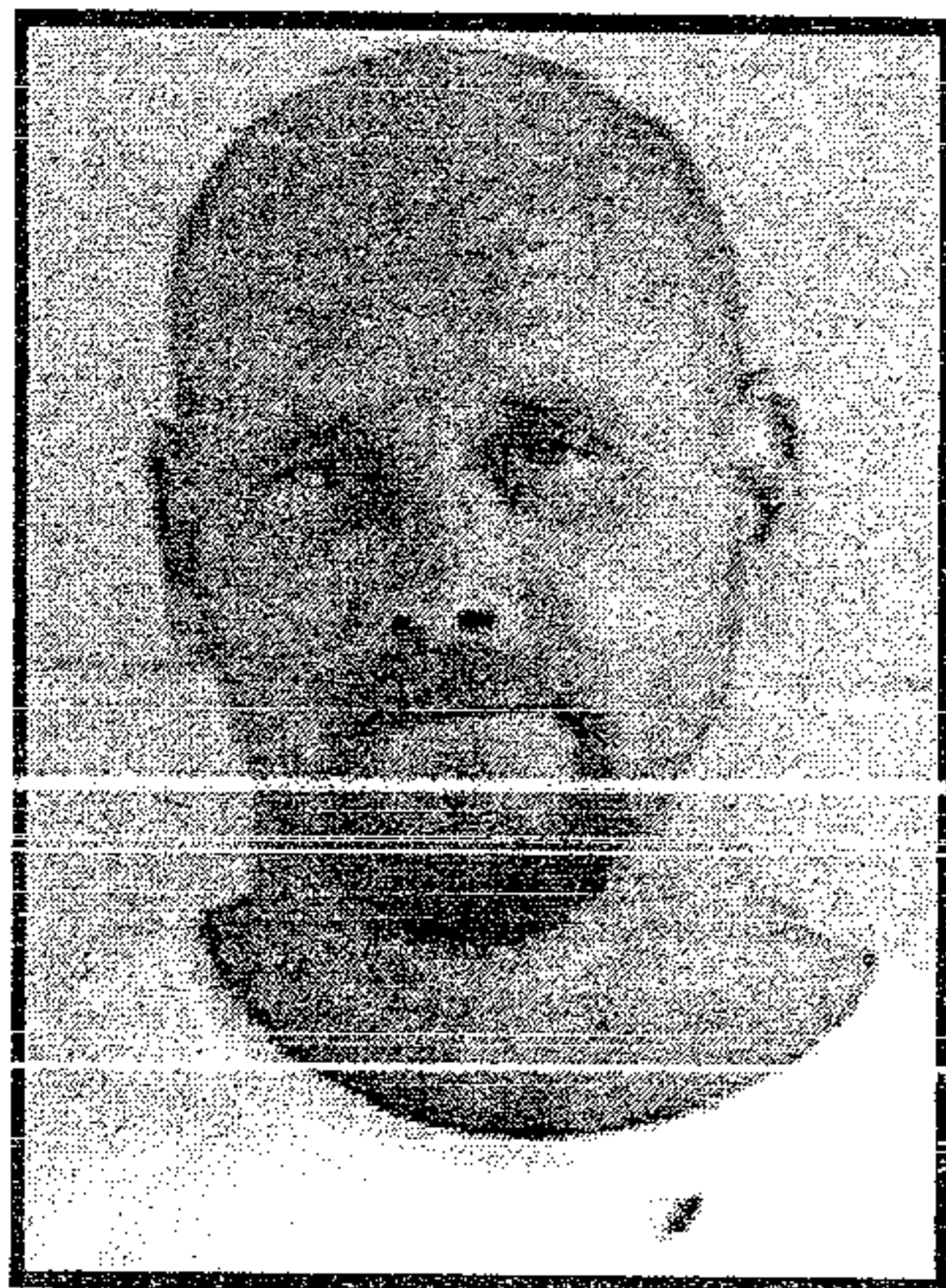

Carmen Jeanae Stegall, 18, Old Holderford Road, Kingston, was charged with introduction of intoxicants and or drugs into a penal institution, possession of schedule II (oxycodone), theft and theft x 2.

According to reports, Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO observed a blue Suzuki Farenza traveling east on Highway 321 Saturday and identified the driver as Andy Yelverton. Having prior knowledge Mr. Yelverton didn't have a drivers license the deputy conducted a traffic stop in front of the Tractor Supply. A drivers license check through NCIC showed Yelverton's license were revoked for failure to file

the search a round metal container was found in her vaginal area. Inside of the container were 15 round blue pills believed to be oxycodone.

Ms. Stegall did not have a prescription for the pills and claimed ownership of them.

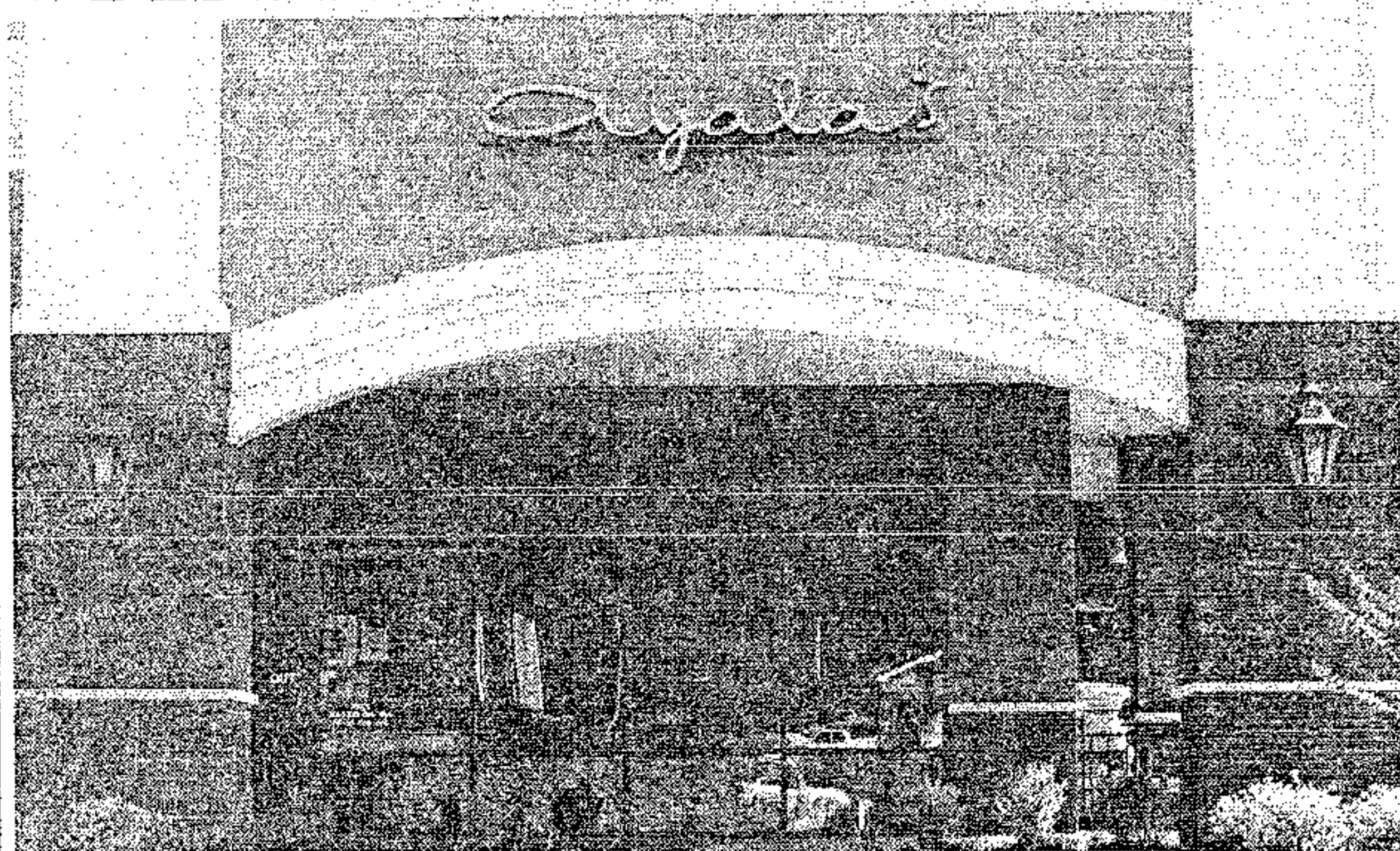
