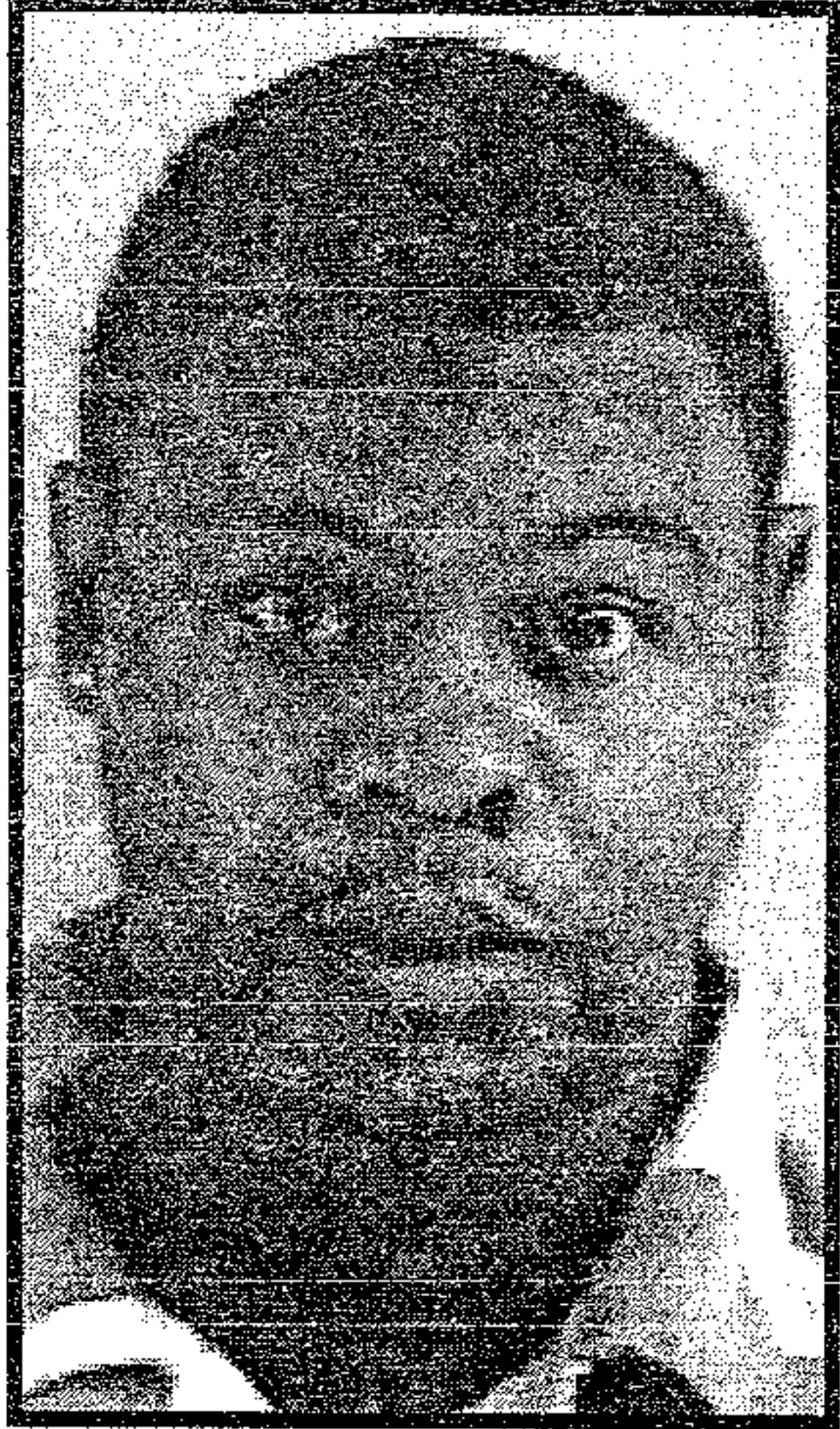


Fist-a-cuffs at market results in charges for 2

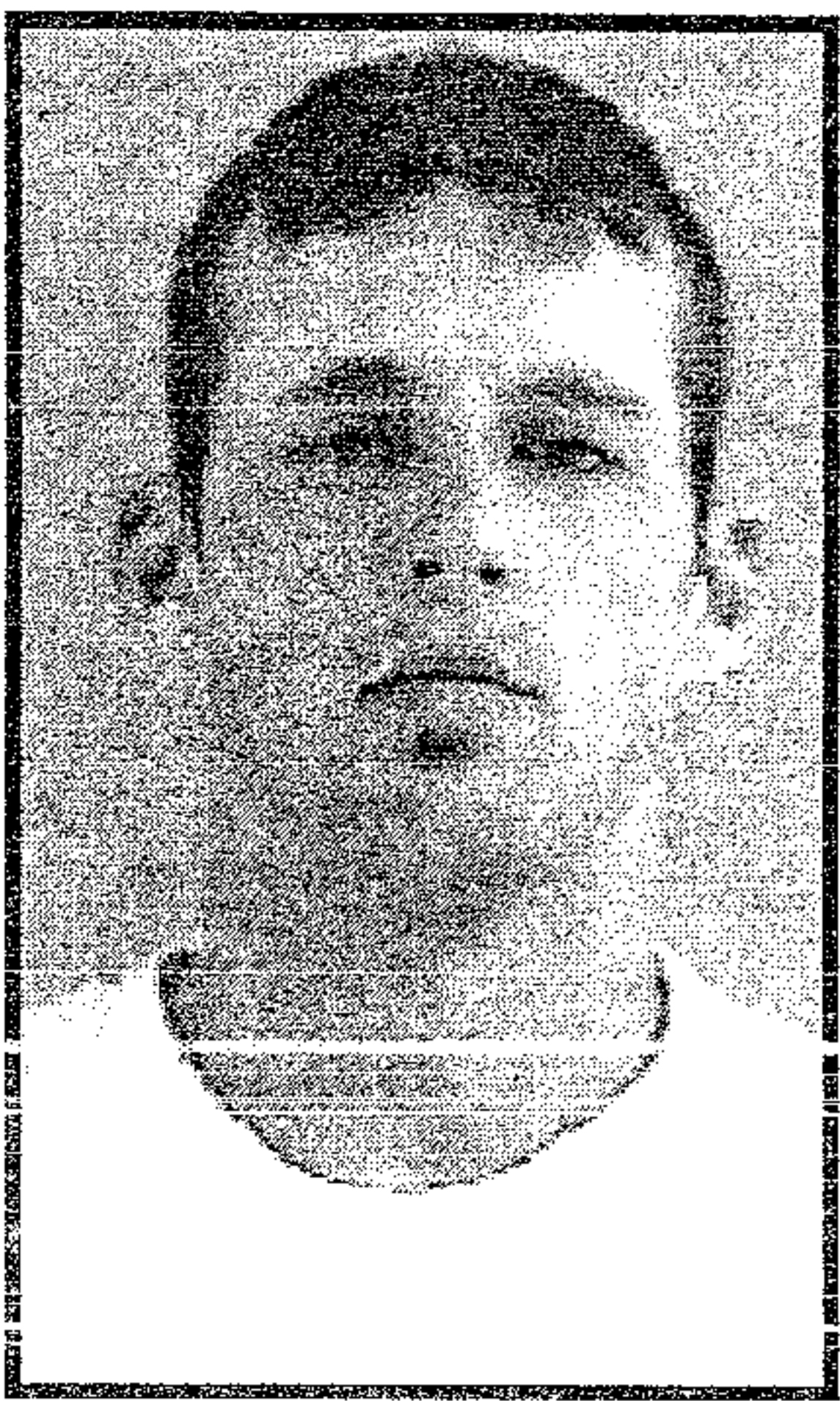

Deer Archery Hunters See Increase in Opening Weekend Harvest

NASHVILLE --- Tennessee's deer archery hunters saw an increase in their harvest from 2009 on the opening weekend of the 2010 season. A total of

2,401 deer were taken, an increase of 163, with all 95 counties reporting harvests.

Montgomery County led the opening weekend (Sept. 25-26) totals

with 75 harvests, edging the 2009 leader, Giles County's reporting total of 72.

Other top county totals were Stewart 68, Roane 61, Henry 59,

with domestic assault and aggravated assault.

Danny Wayne Folston, Ashbury Drive, Chattanooga was charged with criminal impersonation and violation of probation in Knox County.

According to affidavits filed by Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD; officers responded to a fight call Saturday at West Hills Market after dispatch advised there were several subjects fighting in the parking lot. While en route, offices learned one of the parties involved had left the scene and was walking down West Hills toward 10th Avenue and the other party was leaving in a green Honda. The caller also said the driver of the Honda was driving toward the other man and swerved toward him in an attempt to run him over.

Records further indicate Folston was charged after the investigation revealed Folston, who gave the name Gregory Hale, was indeed Danny Folston instead of Gregory Hale. Folston also gave a false social security number as well as a false name to avoid arrest. Folston had an active warrant from Knox County for violation of probation.

Officers Gentry and Allen Bean, LCPD, made the arrests.

Norris was a passenger in a red HHR driven by a 15 year old female and had to be extricated from the vehicle prior to transport.

According to officers, the young driver failed to yield to oncoming traffic and turned in front of Hodge's pickup. Hodge was unable to stop before striking the car on the passenger side. The collision sent both vehicles careening down the hill toward the interstate, and narrowly missed a large pole. Neither vehicle rolled down the embankment and the drivers were out of

No charges are expected to be filed on connection with the accident and the 15 year old female does have a valid learners permit.

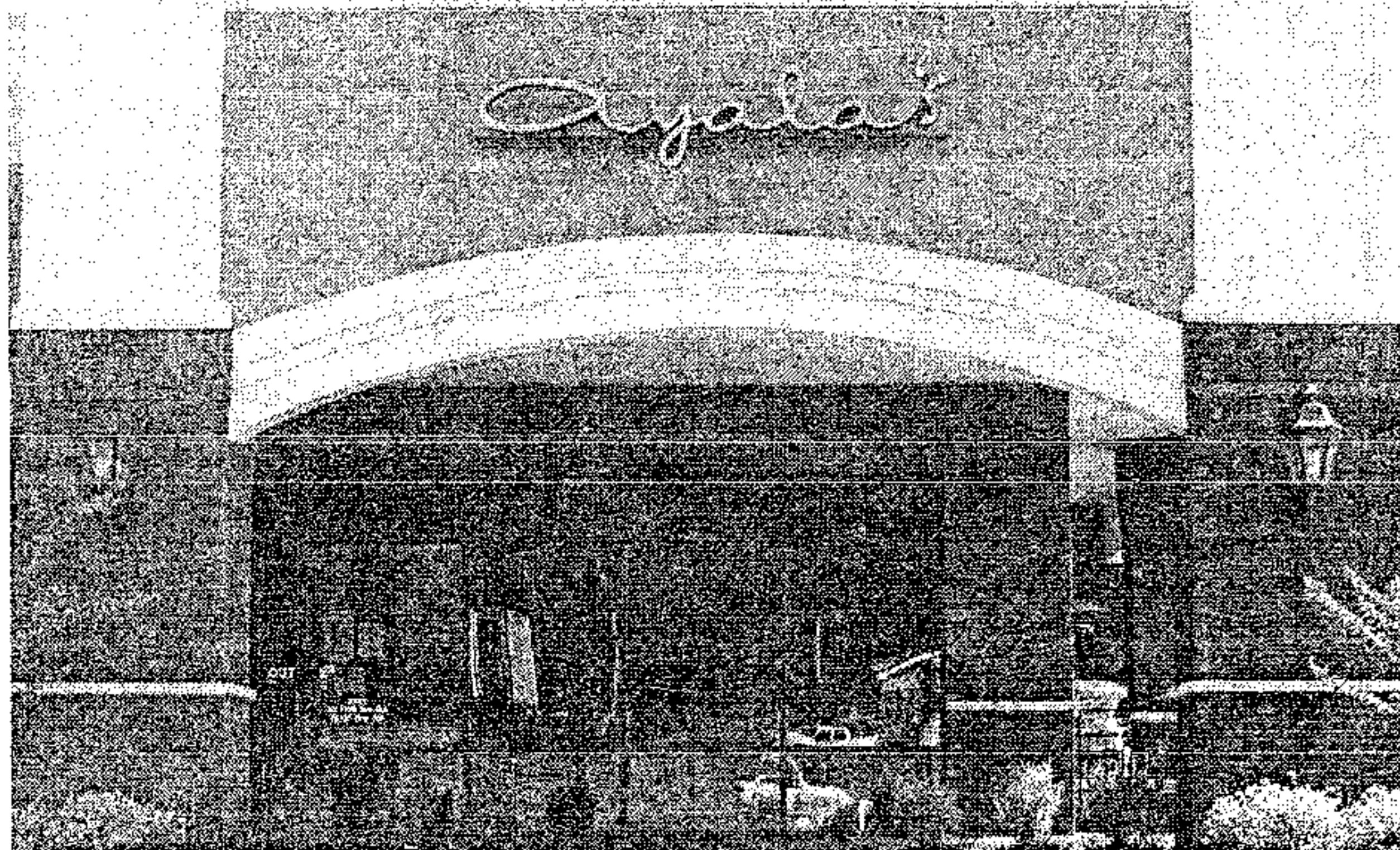

Smith 55, Maury 50, Jackson 49, Sumner 48, Hardeman and Hamilton 46, Carter and Wilson 45.

Of the total harvest, 776 were antlered harvested. There were 1,504 does harvested, 101 buttons, and 20 antlerless bucks.

The antlered deer bag limit is a total of three for the year. A hunter may take his or her three antlered deer during any season, but no more than one per day. There is no longer the requirement to change units or seasons in order to take three antlered deer.

The first segment of the deer archery season continues through Oct. 29. The remaining two segments are Nov. 1-5, and Dec. 6-17.

For better wildlife management, Tennessee is divided into the three deer units-A, B, and L. The antlerless deer bag limit for each unit is: Unit A -4; Unit B -2; and Unit L -3 per day. (A map identifying the Deer Management Units can be found on page 24 of the 2010 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide and on the TWRA website).

Anyone born on or after January 1, 1969 is required to carry proof of satisfactory completion of a hunter education class or be in possession of the Apprentice Hunting License (along with other required licenses) while hunting any species in Tennessee.
