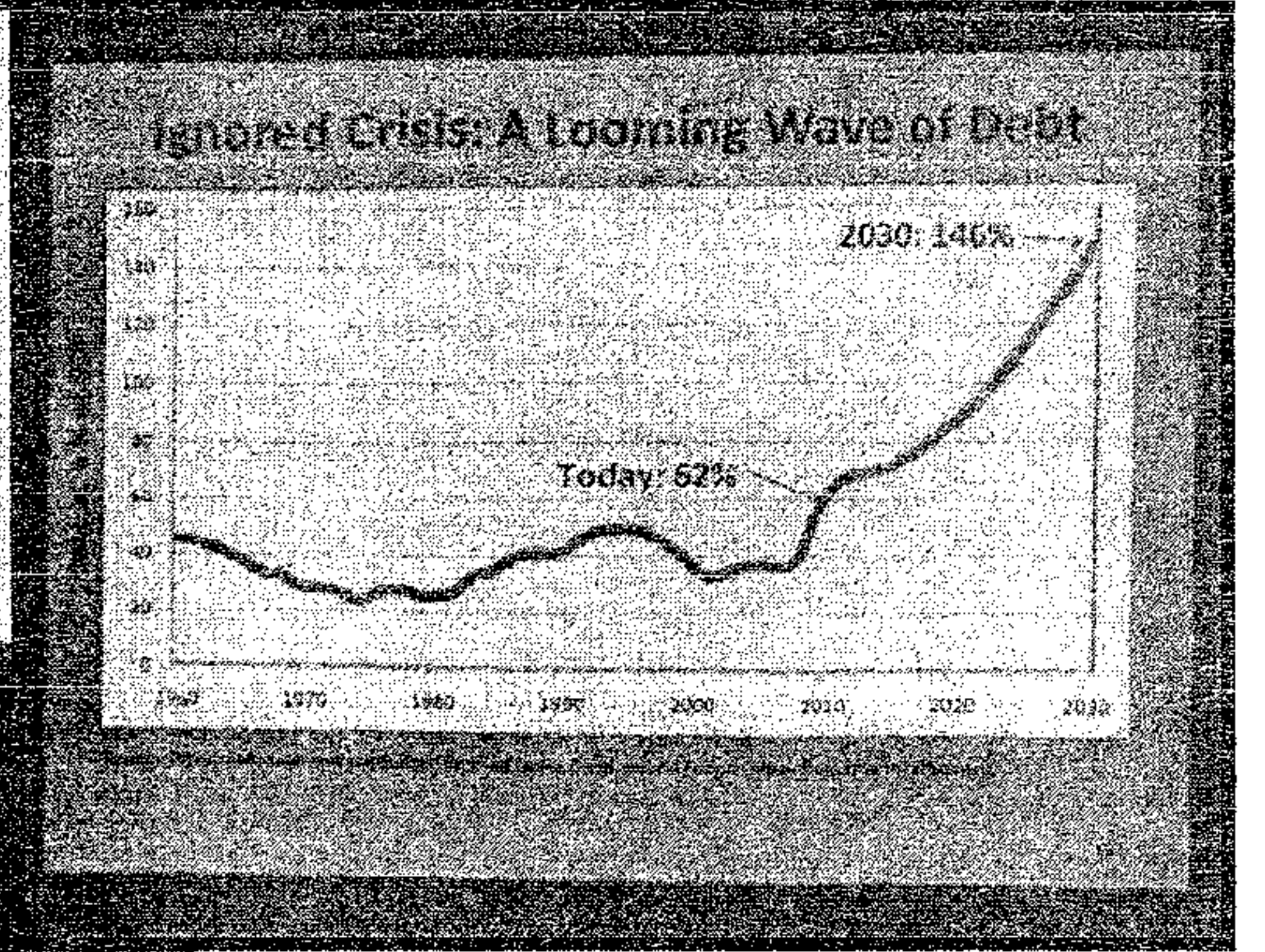

learned he was in possession of a stolen vehicle.

Samuel Donathan Bruner, 24, Nicholasville, Kentucky was charged with theft of property \$1000-\$10,000, felony reckless endangerment by vehicle and felony evading.

According to affidavits filed by Officer Jamie Pistole, LPD; on October 5th, 2010, around 10:00 PM, Officer Pistole was at the Skate Park in Loudon County and was advised by 3 subjects there was a suspicious vehicle at the Jiffy. It was a small red/orange car with Kentucky tags and had a male and female inside who appeared to be intoxicated and were asking for money.

Officer Pistole reported she located the vehicle in the Food City Parking lot and witnessed it fail to stop at the stop sign entering onto Highway 72.

The officer initiated blue lights at Maremont Parkway and Highland Avenue, but the vehicle failed to yield to audible and visual emergency equipment and subsequently reached speeds in excess of 80 mph in the city of Loudon.

The vehicle drove recklessly by failing to maintain it's lane and by driving into oncoming traffic, putting multiple people in risk of death or serious bodily injury.

The vehicle finally came to rest in a ditch on Highway 322 and Reed Springs Road in Monroe County approximately 40 minutes later. At that time Officer Pistole identified the driver as Samuel Bruner.

The vehicle was identified as being stolen out of Nicholasville Kentucky. Mr. Bruner spontaneously advised the officer during arrest that he had stolen the vehicle in question.

Officer Pistole made the arrest at 11:30 PM. Sgt. Bill Evans, LPD, and Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSO, were also on scene.
