





when an off-duty officer reported her for possible DUI after she hit a mailbox while driving down the road.

Baldwin Kimberly Phillips, 50, Andalusian Way, Knoxville was charged Saturday with DUI 1st offense, resisting stop, arrest, search, and violation of implied consent law.

The report states, Deputy Steve Helms, LCSO was off duty and in his personal vehicle when he notified fellow officers of a possible intoxicated driver operating a gold Honda Odyssey van in the area of Highway 11 and Old Stage Road.

According to Deputy Helms, the van had struck a mailbox on Old Stage Road.

Another deputy spotted the Honda on Highway 70 East and Wilkerson Road and stopped it. The driver, later identified as Kimberly Phillips, had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on her person, bloodshot eyes and slurred speech.

Ms. Phillips was asked to exit the vehicle to perform field sobriety tasks and she refused. She was asked several more times

to exit the vehicle and still Phillips refused, so she was physically taken out of the car.

Ms. Phillips made several attempts to prevent being placed under arrest by hiding her arms, pulling away and trying to run away. After a brief struggle she was placed under arrest and read the Tennessee Implied Consent Law, which she refused.

#### Veterans

Nov. 11.

Passed by the General Assembly earlier this year, the new policy calls for a yearly, special state parks day to honor Tennessee's resident veterans. Tennessee State Parks chose each Nov. 11 as that designated day, offering one free night of camping and complimentary greens fees for 18 holes of golf with appropriate identification. The new free day will go into effect this Veterans Day and will occur on Nov. 11 each year.

"Veterans Day was the most appropriate choice and the new policy gives Tennessee State Parks an additional way to honor the men and women who served our country," said Environment and Conservation Commissioner

Jim Fyke. "The purpose of this new policy is to extend our current state park discounts to Tennessee's Veterans, paying tribute to their dedication and offering them an opportunity to enjoy the great outdoors." The new free day on Nov. 11 is in addition to Tennessee State Parks' current veterans' policy, which includes a camping discount within the state parks system and is available annually beginning November 1 through March 31, offering a 15 to 25 percent reduction off the standard nightly base rates (depending on the type of site chosen). This camping discount is available to Tennessee residents showing proof of prior military duty.

A special state park discount also is in place for active duty military personnel and members of the Tennessee National Guard. This yearround discount is given to all U.S. military - regardless of their branch of service or where they are stationed. Disabled Veterans also are eligible for the Tennessee State Parks yeaf-round ADA discount that provides a 25 to 50 percent discount for campsites. According to affidavits; on November 2nd, 2010, with the assistance of the Loudon Police Department, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF conducted a traffic stop on a 2000 Ford Taurus on Highway 72 and Highway 11 in the City of Loudon. The vehicle had an improperly displayed registration that was not visible on the back of the car.

The occupants were identified as Jamie Nealy and Sherri Fisher. While speaking with Ms. Nealy and Ms. Fisher it was determined they had come to Loudon to purchase a psuedoephedrine based product, which is a precursor for the manufac-

turing of methamphetamine, to exchange for \$50 dollars in US currency or I gram of methamphetamine.

Ms. Nealy was also in possession of numerous types of drug paraphernalia including cut straws, 2 glass pipes, rolling papers and scales. She stated she was on her way to deliver the psuedoephedrine to a unnamed individual in Madisonville.

Ms. Fisher told the officers she was fully aware the product was intended to be used to manufacture methamphetamine.

Agent DeBoer made the arrests. Agent Jeff Vittatoe, 9th DTF, and Officer April Farmer, LPD were also on scene.
