

Clear plastic bags were found in Williams's front pockets, and a white powder substance believed to be methamphetamine weighing approximately 1 gram, four green oval pills marked with S 902 believed to be alprazolam, and a green plant material

believed to be marijuana weighing approximately 1.5 grams were all discovered in different bags on her person.

A metal pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana and a syringe were also discovered in Williams's pocket. Ms. Williams claimed ownership of the items and was placed under arrest.

Michele L. Rich was also at the residence and a clear plastic bag containing a white powder substance believed to be methamphetamine was in an ashtray in plain view of the officers, and within reach of Ms. Rich. The substance field tested positive for methamphetamine and weighed around 0.5 grams.

Ms. Rich claimed ownership of the substance. Her vehicle was on the property and she gave consent for it to be searched as well.

Deputy Jenkins deployed K9 Diego for a drug sniff of the vehicle and he alerted before being deployed inside the vehicle where he alerted to the center console. A purple glass pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana and a spoon with burn marks on the bottom of it were discovered.

Ms. Rich was placed under arrest and before being transported to the jail was asked if she had anything on her person and she said no. Once at the jail, Corporal Angie Martin, LCSO performed a search on Ms. Rich and found a clear plastic bag with a white powder residue believed to be methamphetamine and a straw with white powder residue inside of it.





Travel

The Tennessee Department of Transportation is once again halting all lane closure activity on interstates and state highways in anticipation of higher traffic volumes across the state.

No temporary lanc closures will be allowed for construction on Tennessee roadways from 8:00 a.m. on Friday, December 24 through 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 3.

"This is one of the busiest travel periods

of the entire year and we know many Tennesseans will be hitting the roads to visit family and friends during the holidays," said TDOT Commissioner Gerald Nicely. "We want to ensure that motorists traveling in Tennessee arrive at their destinations safely and with as little disruption as possible."

Except for a few longterm closures which must remain in place for safety, all construction related closures will be suspended. Workers will also be on

site in some construction zones. Drivers should obey all posted speed limits, particularly in construction areas. Slower speeds are necessary in work zones due to the temporary layout of the roadway and will be enforced. Drivers convicted of speeding through work zones where workers are present face a fine of \$250 to \$500, plus court fees and possible increased insurance premiums.

"Drivers can expect to see increased law enforcement on the roads

with a particular focus on stopping drivers who are impaired." said Governor's Highway Safety Office Director Kendell Poole. "We want everyone to have a safe holiday so remember to buckle up, drive the speed limit and don't get behind the wheel of a vehicle if you've had anything to drink."

AAA predicts holiday travel will increase nearly 4% in Tennessee this year, with more than 2 million expected to travel by automobile in the volunteer state between the Christmas and New Year's holidays. Across the U.S. 85.7 million people are expected to drive to their year-end holiday destinations.
