Department of Safety. The highest number of people killed during a Thanksgiving holiday period happened in 1966, when 34 people were killed in crashes on Tennessee roadways. In 2008, there fatalities were during the four-day Thanksgiving holiday weekend and 13 fatalities were recorded in 2007.

Twelve people were killed in 10 fatal crashes during the 2010 Thanksgiving holiday period. Seven

of the victims were not wearing seat belts. The 10 crashes occurred in Campbell, Davidson, Grainger, Hamilton, Marshall, Lawrence, McNairy, Rutherford, Shelby, and Union counties. The crash in Lawrence County was a double fatality that killed two teenagers, ages 15 and 17. Neither victim was wearing a safety restraint.

To kickoff the holiday period, the Tennessee Highway Patrol conducted its Combined Accident Reduction Enforcement or "C.A.R.E. Across Tennessee" campaign, which State saw Troopers stationed at every 10-mile stretch of road on both the eastbound and westbound lanes of travel on Interstate 40. The

goal was to encourage travelers to drive safe, wear seat belts and obey the rules of the road.

Additionally, the

Additionally, the THP conducted more than 80 sobriety and driver license checkpoints across the state, issuing citations to drivers and passengers who were not wearing seat belts as part of a ramped up "Click it or Ticket" campaign. Troopers also arrested motorists for driving under the influence and cited drivers for speeding.
