Thieves burgle LC home while owners at hospital

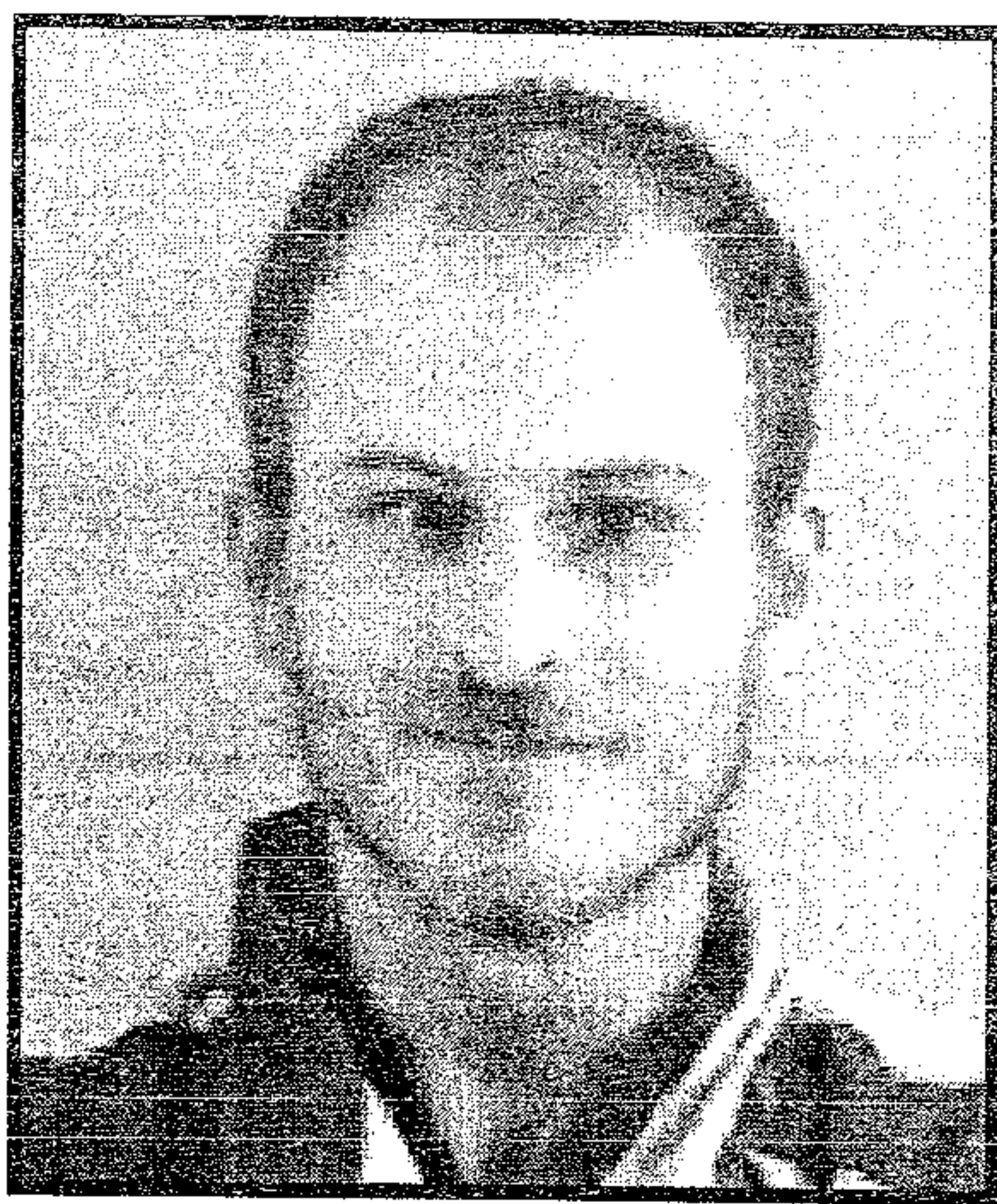

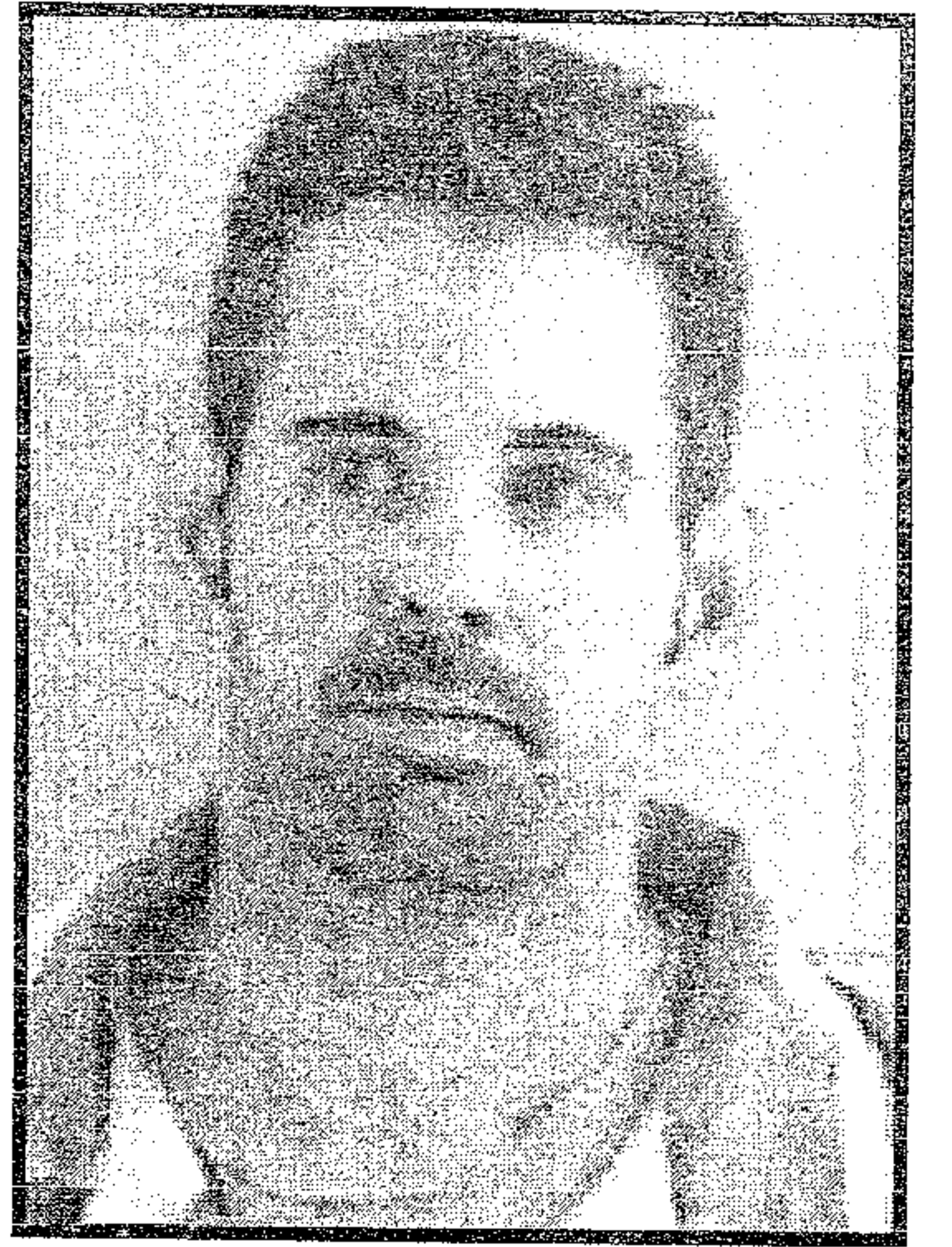

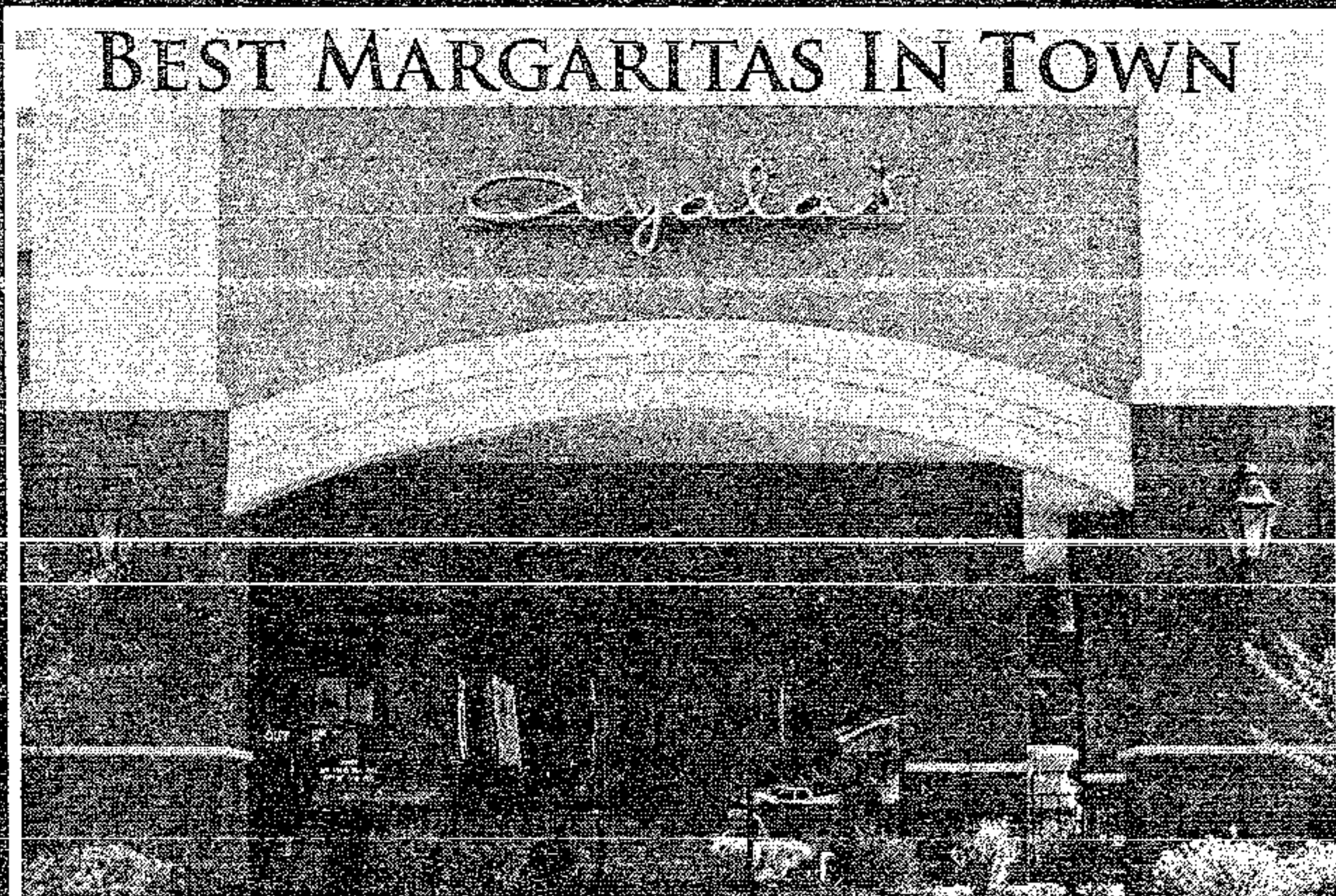

According to affidavits; on Thursday, December 2nd, 2010, Investigator Jason Smith, LCSO-CID responded to Shaw Ferry Road in reference to a burglary and spoke with the homeowner, who stated she left her residence on Thursday, November 25th, 2010, to visit her husband in the hospital and returned December 2nd, to discover her house had been ransacked.

Investigator Smith observed numerous drawers emptied and

closets opened and gone through.

The victim said she went through her jewelry box and discovered several items of jewelry missing. A pistol was also discovered missing.

Two of the woman's rings were sold to Tennessee Gold Buyers at West Town Mall, 7600 Kingston Pike, Knoxville. The rings were sold by Zachary Plemons on November 29th. The items were picked up and identified by the female victim as coming from her residence.
