A Philadelphia man was charged with driving on a suspended license after he left a wreck scene and then was told by Officer Bobby Lankford, LPD to return.

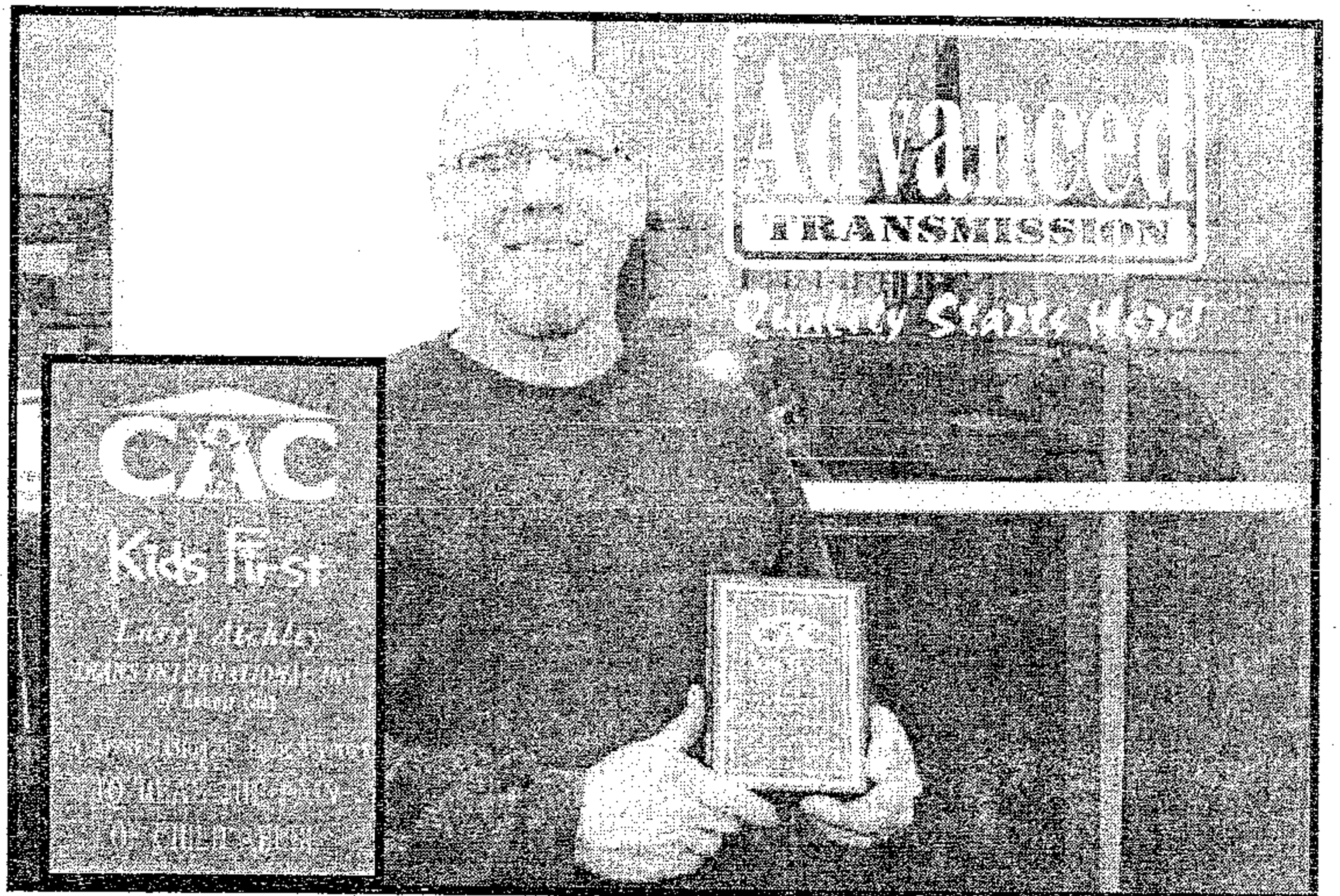
