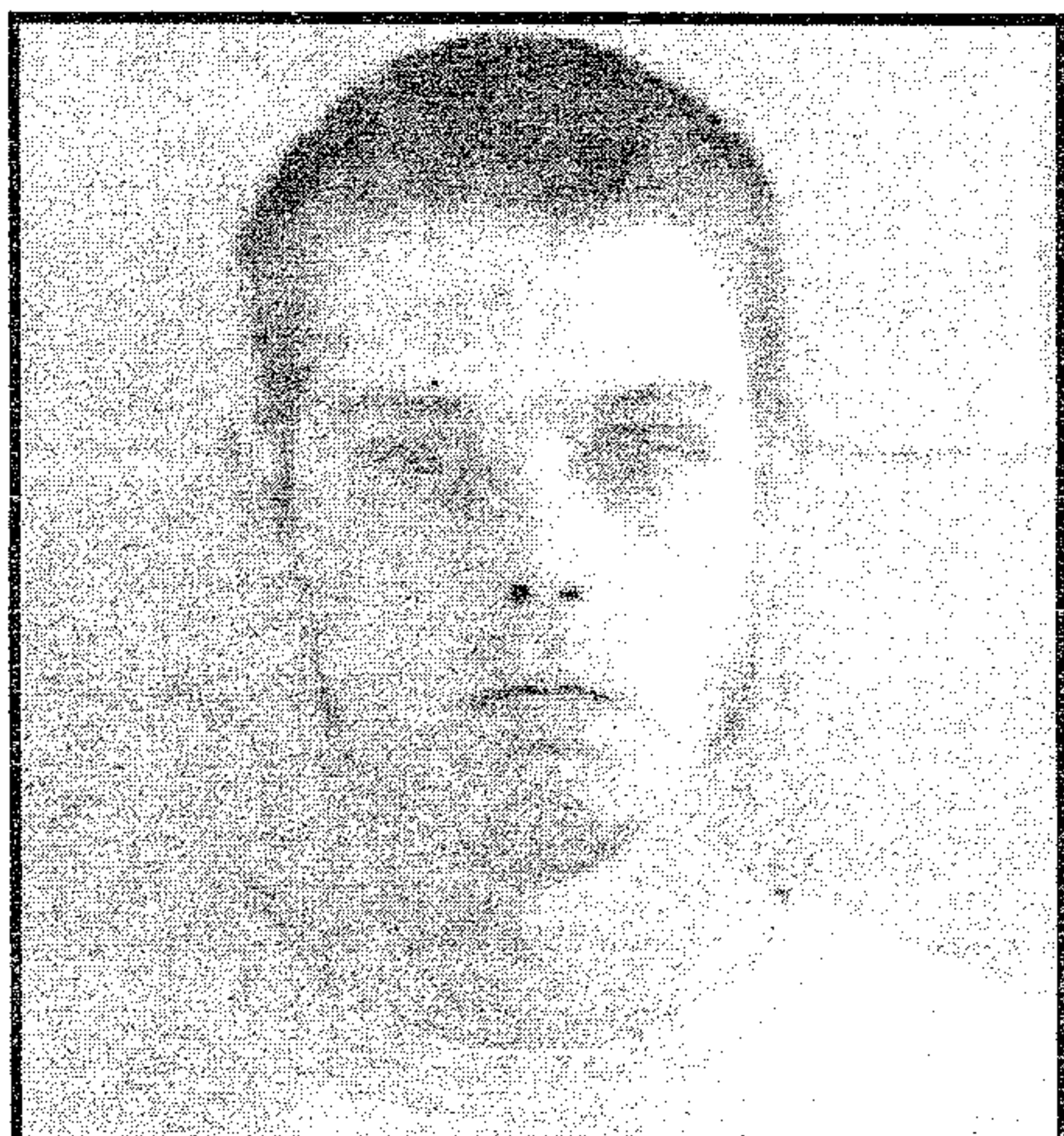

Hawk's new record for the quillback surpassed the mark of 2 lbs., 9 ozs. Bill Davis, also a Knoxville resident, set the old mark May 20, 2009 while fishing at Bull Creek Run on Melton Reservoir in Anderson County.

To land his latest record fish, Hawk used a spinning reel with a rapala lure on an 8 lb. test line. He made the catch at 8 p.m.

The criteria to be considered for a state record fish along with the new record application and instructions, state records and fishing license information are in the 2010 TWRA Tennessee Fishing Guide. Information is also available on the TWRA Web site.

Sarah Jane Lynn, 38, Parris Road, Sweetwater was charged Friday with speeding arrest.

According to records, Deputy Michael Watkins, LCSO observed a white Ford Explorer traveling on Pond Creek Road near Highway 1.1 with a bent, old license plate displayed on the rear of the vehicle. The deputy ran the plate through NCIC and it showed it was registered to a 2000 red Chevy truck.

Deputy Watkins attempted to stop the vehicle on Pond Creek Road near McQuery Lane. It continued on and turned onto Allison Town Road and sped up to a speed of 30-40 mph and still refused to stop. The Explorer continued almost to

the dead end of Allison Town Road, approximately 1/4 mile until it reached 1184 Allison Town Road and then it stopped.

Ms. Lynn produced her Tennessee drivers license to the officer. When asked why she refused to stop she stated, "she was told not to stop for the police and she could not trust the police."

Lynn was arrested for evading and received a citation for registration violation, and was booked in at the Loudon County jail just before 10:00 PM.

phone had been taken from her vehicle and said a black LG Dare phone, valued at \$290, had been in her vehicle for approximately four months. Ms. Pace advised on February 22nd, 2010, she discovered the phone was not

in the vehicle anymore and began to check the phone's usage.

Pace advised the phone was used without her permission on Monday, February 22nd, 2010 to make calls, send texts and use the internet.

According to Ms. Pace, the total charges to the account were

\$825.85.

Pace said she thinks the phone may have been taken from her vehicle while she was at work on Leeper Parkway in Lenoir City. Ms. Pace advised she did not authorize anyone to use the phone and it was done without her knowledge.

The case is under investigation.

trict of Tennessee in Greeneville, to a total of 11 counts of robbery, which included nine (9) banks, one (1) credit union and one (1) retail store. Additionally, Schaffner pled guilty to 11 counts of use of a firearm during these robberies. Details of Wednesday's guilty pleas by Schaffner are outlined in the six (6) plea agreements on file

in United States District Court, Greeneville, Tennessee, and attached to this release.

Wednesday's guilty pleas are in addition to the ones entered by Schaffner in December 2009, to two (2) counts of bank robbery and two (2) counts of use of a firearm during and in relation to a violent crime for the armed robberies of the Community National Bank in Jefferson City,

Tennessee, and the First Tennessee Bank in Morristown, Tennessee. Today's guilty pleas were to robberies committed in the Western District of North Carolina, Eastern District of North Carolina, District of South Carolina, Western District of Kentucky, Southern District of Indiana, and Southern District of Illinois.

Schaffner is scheduled to be sentenced on December 8, 2010, at 1:30 p.m., in the United States District Court in Greeneville, Tennessee.

After a nationwide manhunt, Schaffner was arrested in Missouri where he admitted to robbing Community National Bank and First Tennessee Bank to agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). He told the agents that he began robbing banks to support his drug addiction.

He also admitted to robbing banks in Ken-

tucky, North Carolina, South Carolina, Illinois and Indiana.

Schaffner further admitted to using and brandishing two different firearms during the course of these robberies, one of which was recovered from a motel room Schaffner occupied. Both robberies were recorded on video.

Schaffner's girlfriend, Linda Christina Davis, pled guilty on December 7, 2009, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee in Greeneville, to accessory after the fact to the two Tennessee bank robberies. Davis was arrested with Schaffner in Missouri. She confessed to allowing Schaffner to use her car after the Morristown and Jefferson County robberies and renting motel rooms in various states to allow him to avoid apprehension. Complete details of her involvement can be found in her plea agreement on file with the United States District Court in Greeneville, Tennessee. Davis faces up to twelve and a half

years for her role. Davis is scheduled to be sentenced on August 9, 2010 at 9:00 a.m., in the United States District Court in Greeneville.

The cases were investigated by the FBI with assistance from local authorities in the other states. The Morristown Police Department and Jefferson City Police Department worked with the FBI on the Tennessee cases. Assistant U.S. Attorney Rob Reeves represented the United States in the United States District Court in Greeneville, Tennessee, and was assisted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas Murphy, Eastern District of North Carolina; Assistant U.S. Attorney Don Gast, Western District of North Carolina; Assistant U.S. Attorney Alston Badger, District of South Carolina; Assistant U.S. Attorney Randy Ream, Western District of Kentucky; Assistant U.S. Attorney Bradley Shepard, Southern District of Indiana; and, Assistant U.S. Attorney Deirdre Durborow, Southern District of Illinois.
