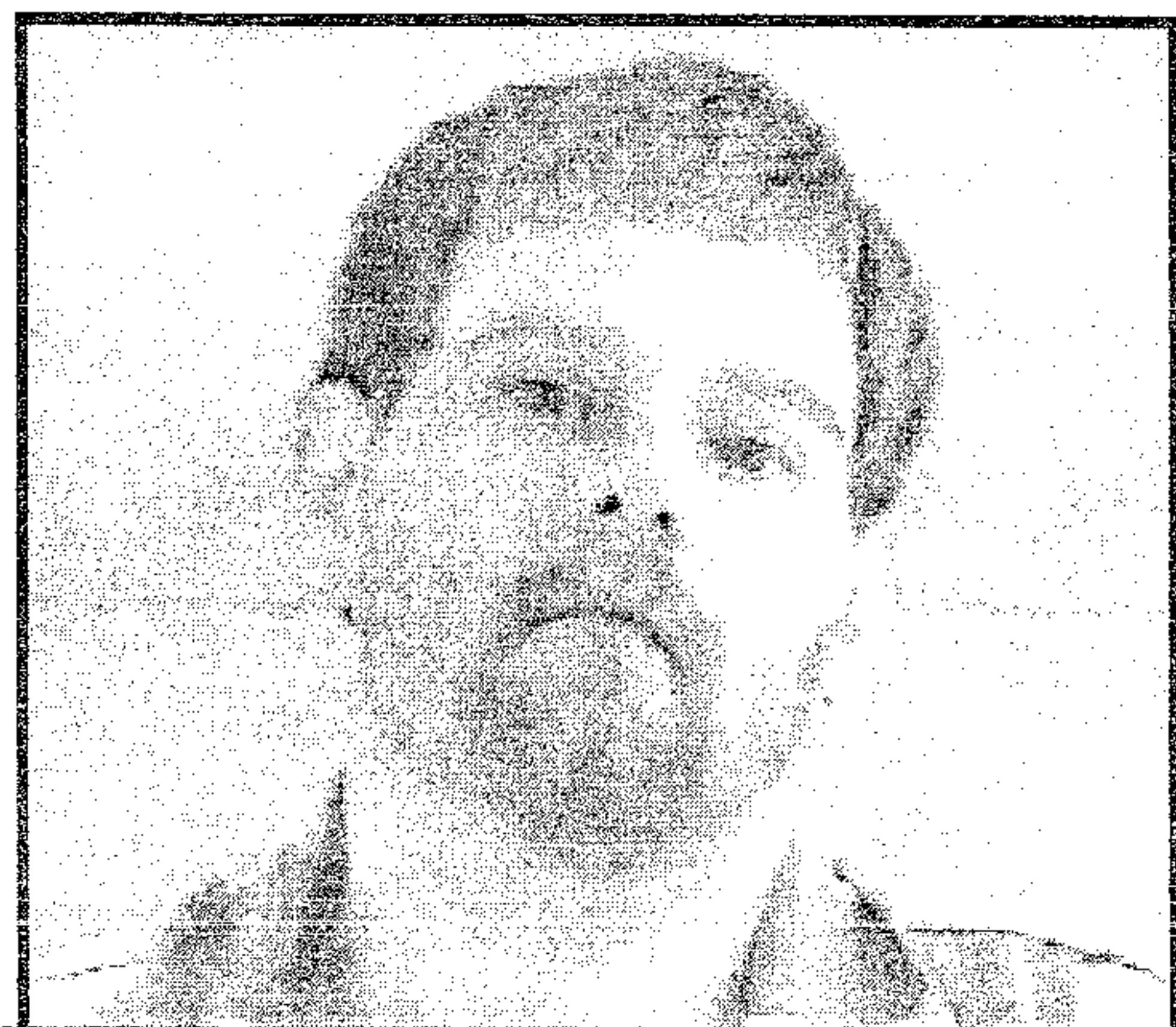

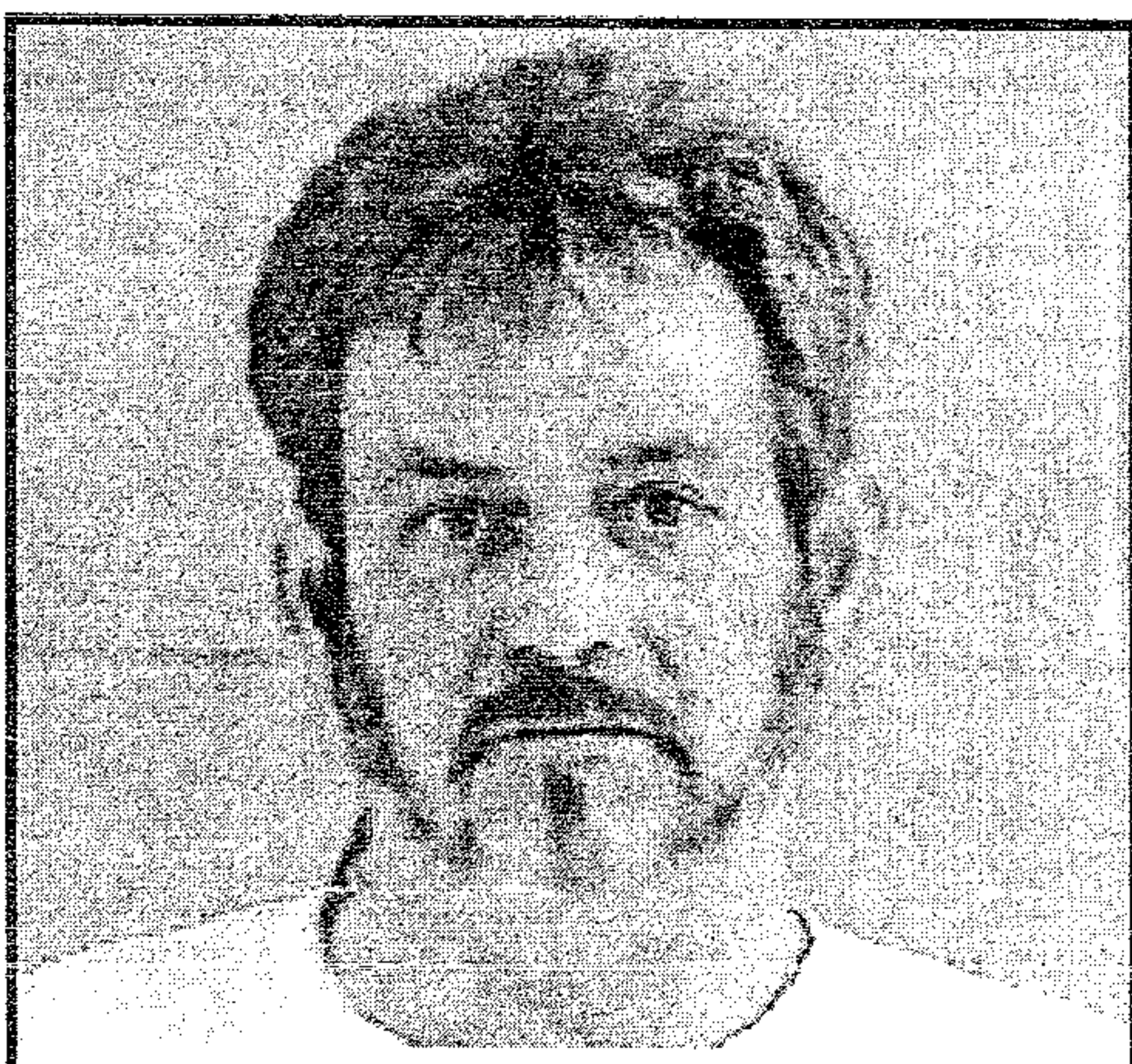

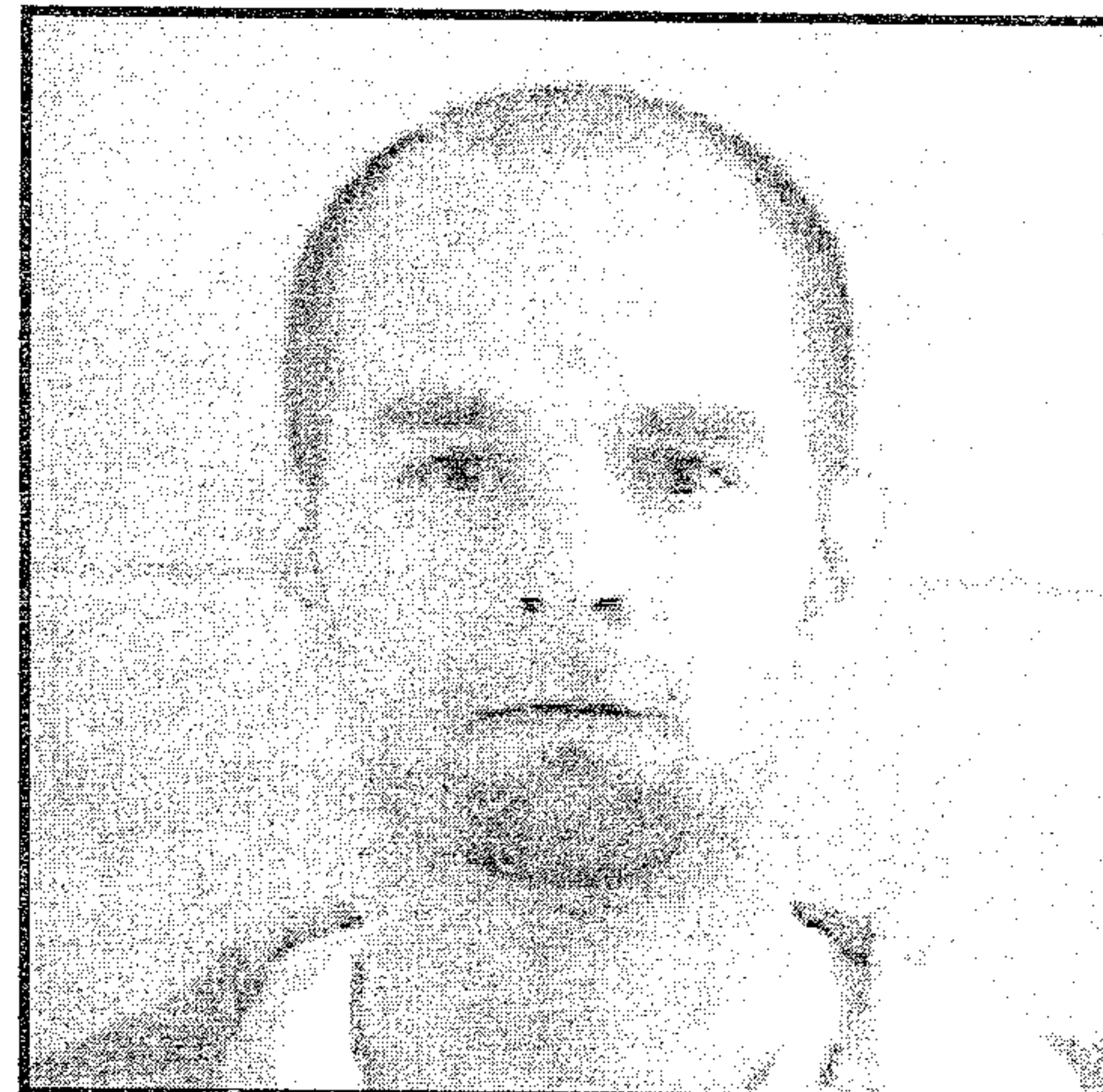

LCPD officials charged a local homeless man with the theft of a 32" television, numerous tools and other items from a house on Bussell Ferry Road.

Philip Lawrence Jenkins, 25, homeless was charged with theft over \$1000.

According to an affidavit filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; according to the witness statement, on

March 18th, 2010, at approximately 9:15 AM, the witness observed Philip L. Jenkins carrying a 32 inch television from a residence on Bussell Ferry Road and put it into an older model green Jimmy or Chevrolet Blazer, then jump in the vehicle and drive off.

Upon inspection of the residence after Jenkins left, the witness and the victim discovered other items were missing,

which included a 10 inch DeWalt mitre saw, a 12 inch Ryobi Mitre Saw, an air compressor with 3 nail guns, a bench top sander, a flip video camera, two PlayStation 3 Games, a Skil saw, a drill press, a band saw and a digital camera. The total amount of the items missing was estimated at \$2170.

The second elk hunt will be held Oct. 18-22, 2010 at the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area, located off I-75, north of Knoxville. Once again, there will be five Elk Hunting

As in the first hunt, five individuals will be selected to participate. Four of the participants will be selected through a computer drawing conducted by the TWRA. The fifth participant will be the recipient of a permit that is donated to a NGO (Non-Governmental Organization) which this year will be the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. Fund-raising proceeds are designated to the TWRA Elk Program.

In the inaugural hunt, all five participants harvested an elk. Four came on the opening day of the hunt.

There is no application fee for current Tennessee Annual Sportsman License holders, Lifetime Sportsman License holders, or senior citizen hunters (Type 166) with an Annual Senior Citizen Permit (Type 167). All other applicants will be charged a \$10 non-refundable permit fee, a \$2 internet usage fee (if applying online) and

\$0.50 drawing fee (the internet and drawing fees are charged by the internet provider). For those applying at a license agent, there is a \$1 agent fee in addition to the \$10 non-refundable permit fee.

Persons may apply at any TWRA license agent, TWRA regional office or online at www.tnelkhunt.org. Persons may begin applying at 8 a.m. (CDT) on April 1 and the deadline is midnight (CDT) on May 31. Mailed applications will not be accepted.

The successful applicants will be announced at the June meeting of the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission. Successful applicants will not be allowed to reapply for an elk quota permit for 10 years following a successful draw.

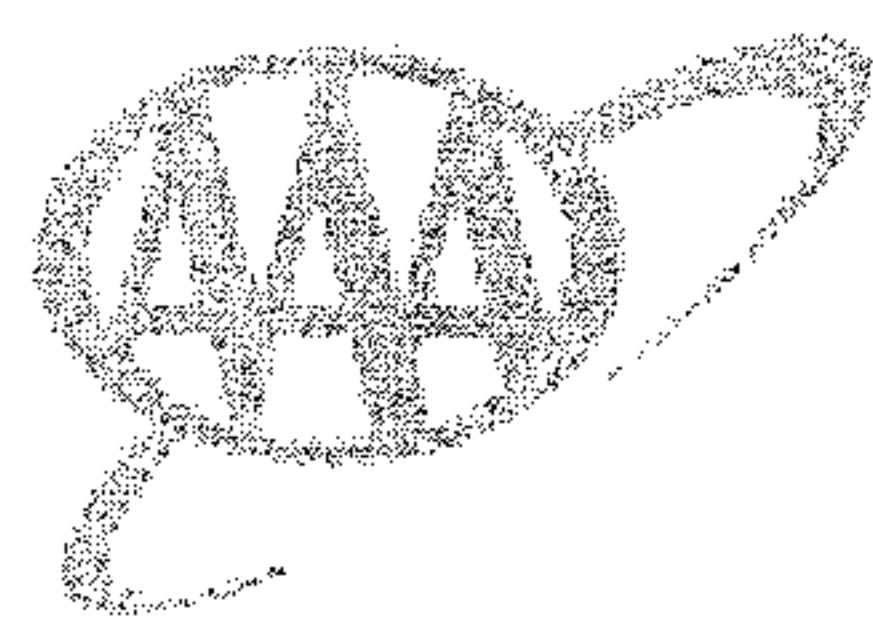

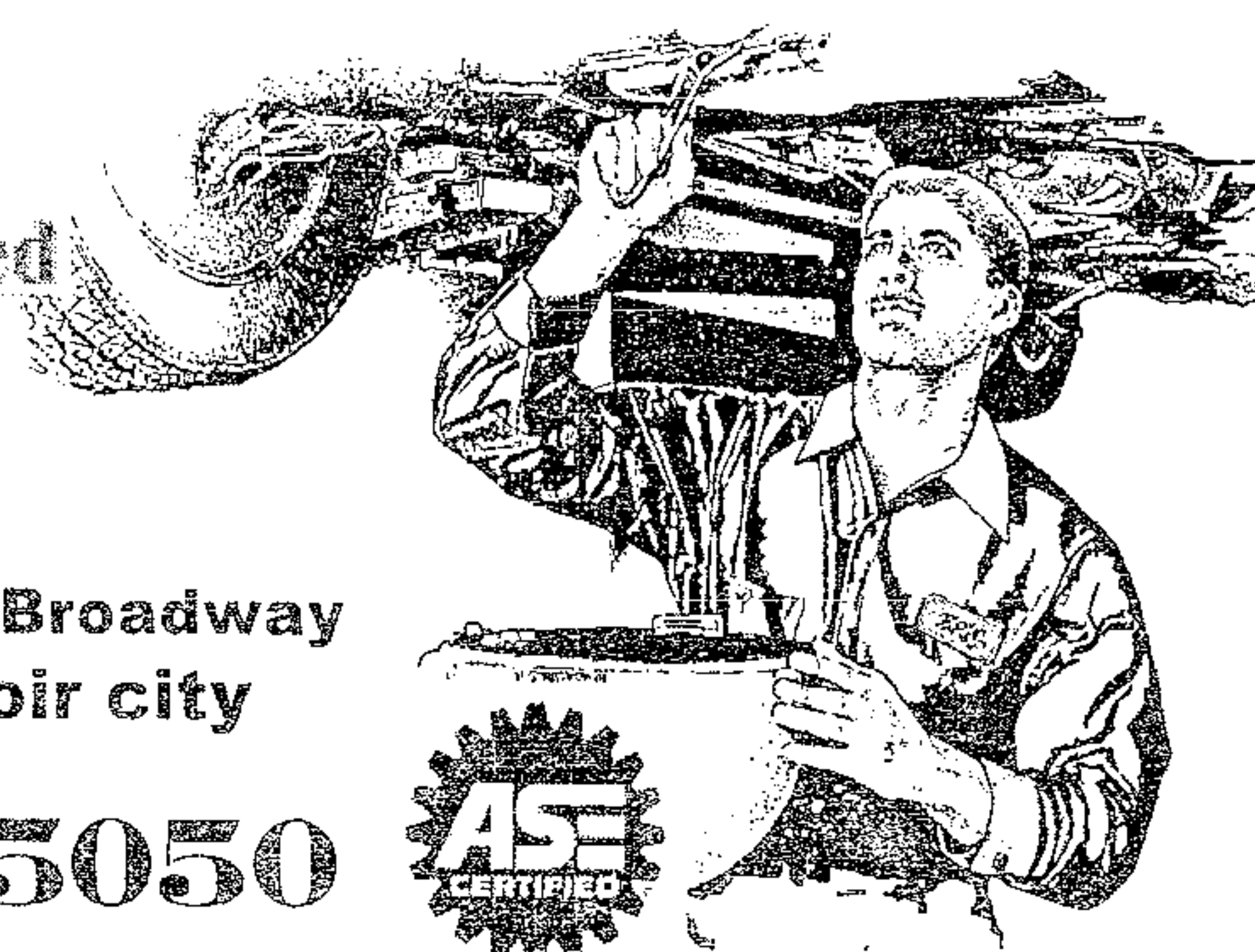

A local homeless man is accused of trying to run from officers who were attempting to serve a warrant on him, and reportedly decided to yield to police just moments after being seized.

Ronald Douglas Tutterow, 52, Ferry Street, Loudon was charged with violation of probation and resisting arrest.

According to the affidavit filed by Officer Bobby Lankford, LPD; on March 16th, 2010, around 2:00 PM, Officer Lankford was looking for Ronald Tutterow along the banks of the Tennessee River below the Loudon Bridge. Officer Lankford had

prior knowledge of an outstanding warrant for Mr. Tutterow, out of Loudon County General Sessions Court.

Ronald Tutterow was trying to flee the scene and stated he was not going to jail and resisted verbal commands.

Officer Lankford deployed his Taser but Tutterow continued to flee, however he quickly advised he was giving up and was taken into custody.

The report states, Tuesday, around 6:14 PM, Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSO clocked a white Nissan Sentra on radar going 68 mph in a 45 mph zone traveling west on Highway 11 near Pond Creek Road. The deputy activated his blue lights to stop the vehicle for speeding and it pulled into the gas pump area at the Sunoco

Gas Station at Pond Creek Road.

The officer could visually see the vehicle was occupied by two black males. The Nissan then took off at a high rate of speed and went Highway 11 West towards Monroe County. The officer gave chase and pursued the vehicle into Monroe County.

The vehicle would not stop and reached speeds up to 90 mph, passing several vehicles on a solid double yellow line and on blind hills.

Deputy Rayfield pursued the Nissan all the way to the Sweetwater city limits on Highway 11 and terminated the pursuit because speeds were too fast and it was too dangerous to other motorists to keep up at those speeds.

About three minutes later, dispatch advised the deputy Sweetwater Police were chasing the Nissan and it hit a pole at Fair Street and Oakland Road.

Deputy Rayfield re-

sponded to the accident scene and took the driver, Joshua McCleary, into custody.

The officer asked Mr. McCleary why he ran and he replied "my license are suspended."

McCleary was cited for financial responsibility and speeding. Mr. McCleary also had a failure to appear warrant out of Knox County.
