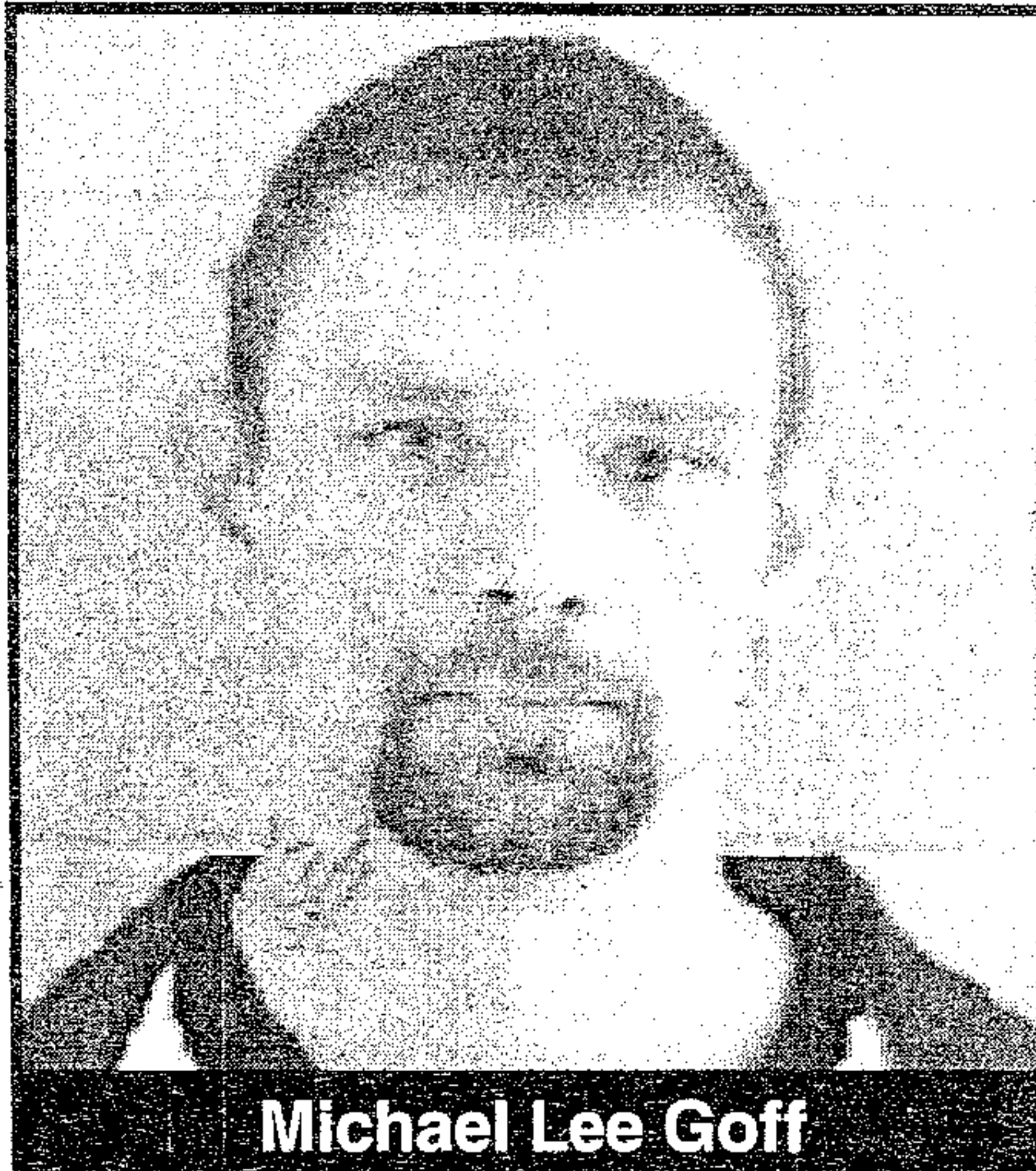


**LCPD charges man with 2009 theft from tattoo business**

Michael Lee Goff, 32, Simpson Road, Lenoir City was charged with theft over \$1000 and failure to appear.

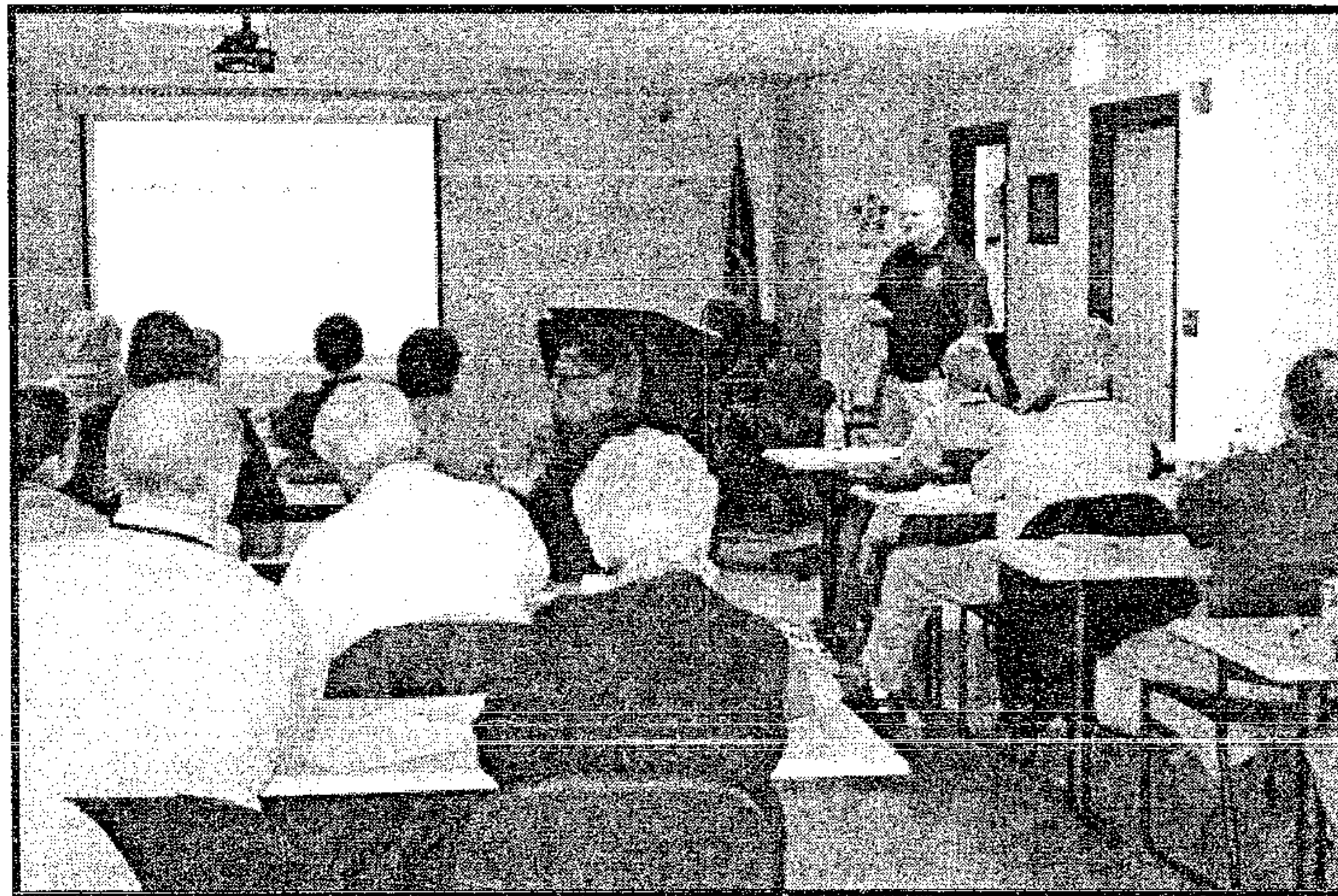

Citizens pay rapt attention to officers teaching every day operations to students during the second Citizens Law Enforcement Academy

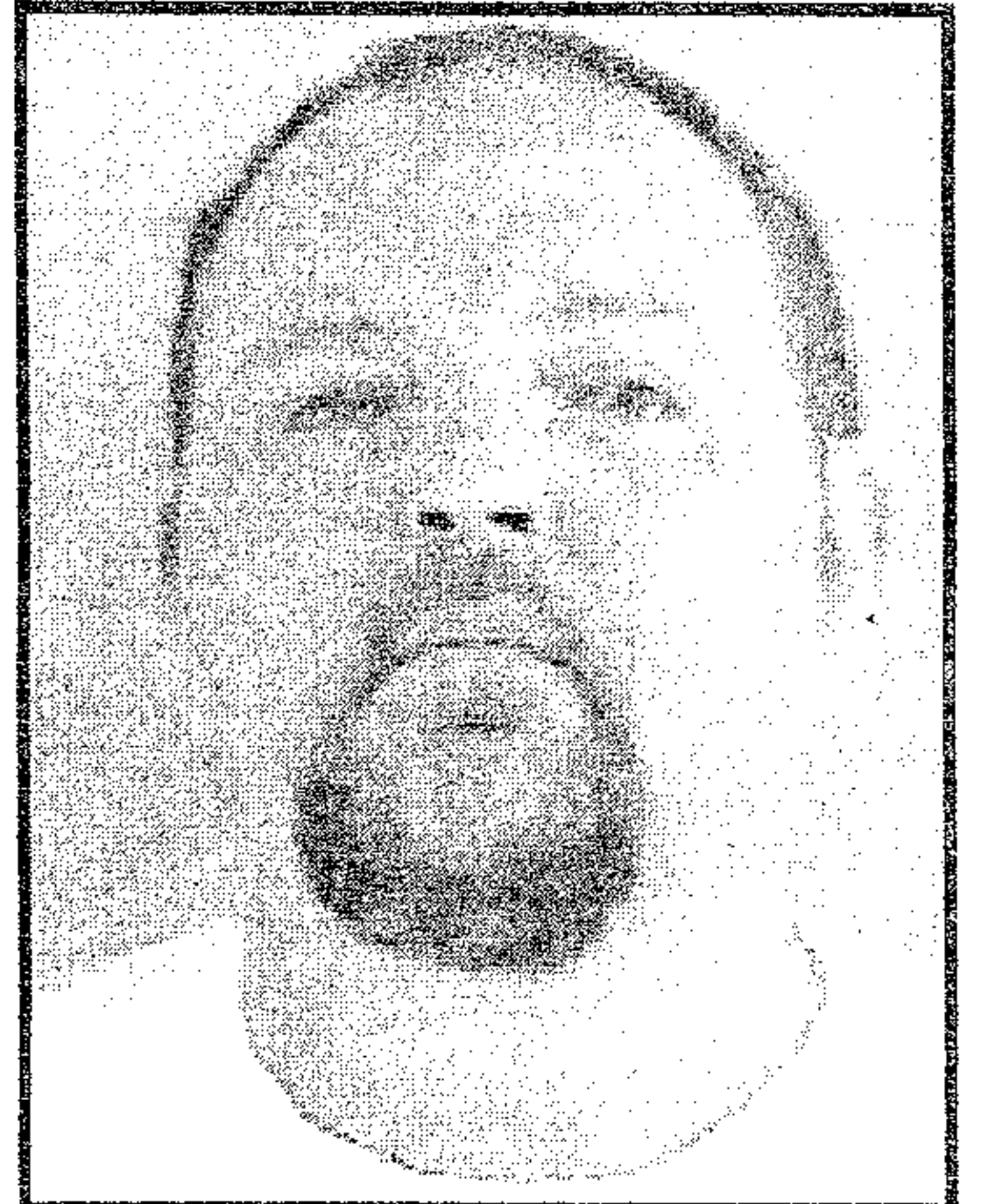

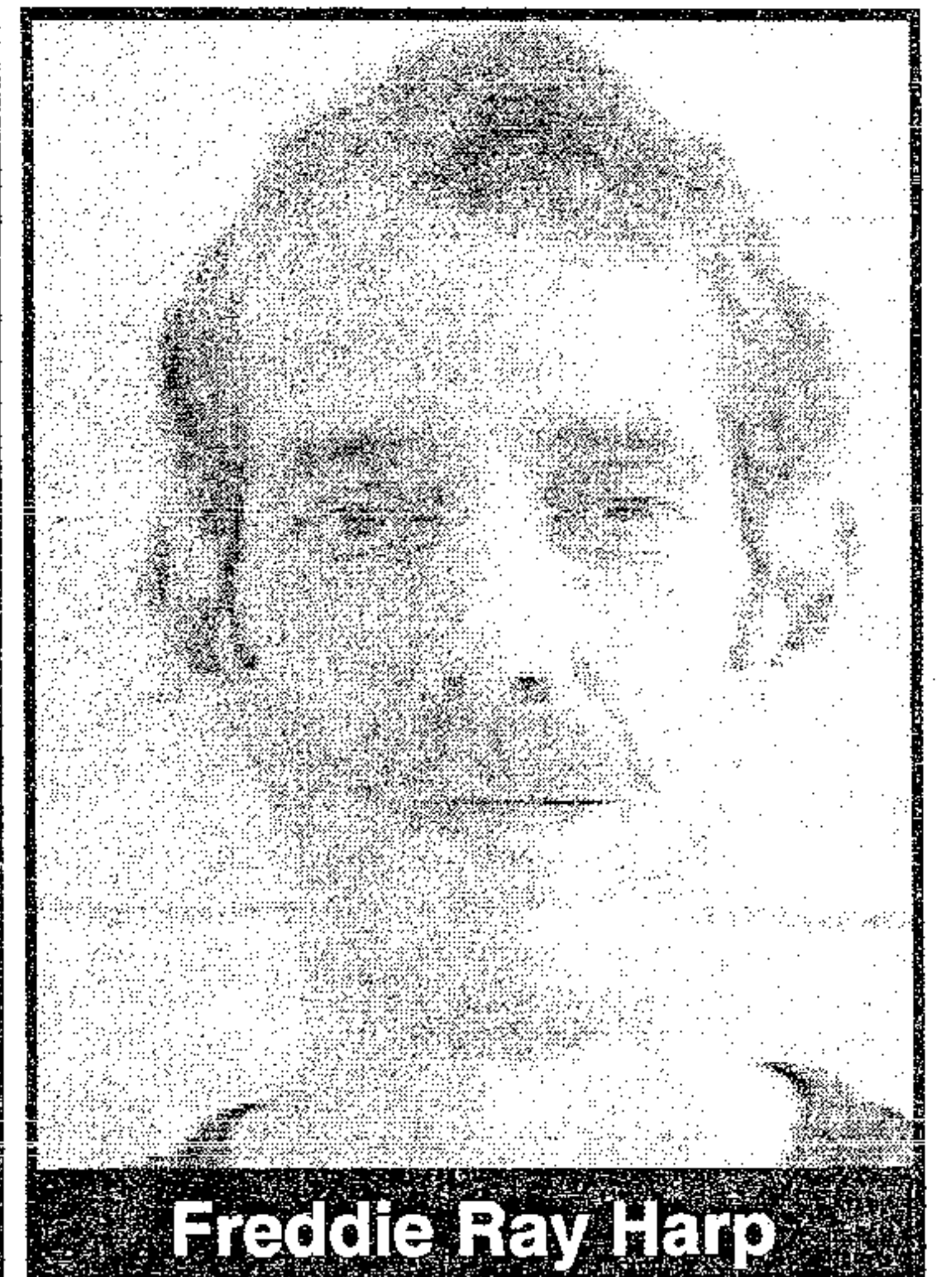

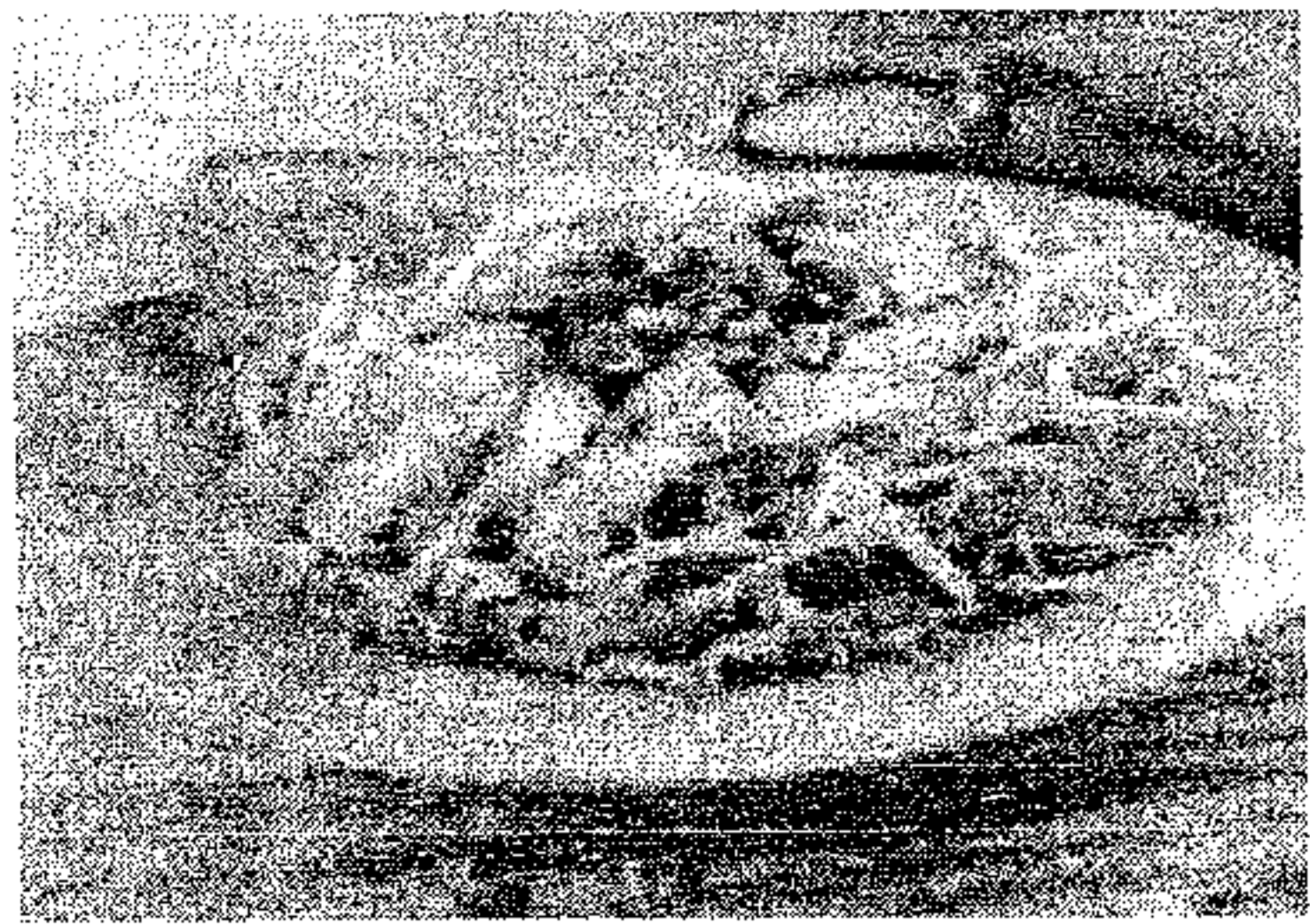
