LCSO-NU nabs Matlock as alleged pill pusher

When LCSO officials stopped a local woman for reckless driving, the Narcotics Unit was called in when numerous illicit pills were found on her passenger. Once at the jail, the man reportedly was found to have hidden another quantity of pills in the upper region of his derriere.

Syeisha Teresa Kilby, 28, Beals Chapel Road, Lenoir City was charged Thursday with driving on revoked license.

According to reports, Deputy Deland, LCSO was patrolling the area of Forest Heights Circle. At the intersection of Forest Heights

and Muddy Creek Road, he noticed a silver Chrysler driving reckless on Muddy Creek. The vehicle came to an abrupt stop at the intersection of Muddy Creek and Forest Heights and left 20' of black marks from the tires on the pavement.

Deputy Deland turned around and followed the Chrysler to a residence on Forest Heights Circle. The driver was identified as Syeisha Kilby and her passenger was identified as Shane Matlock.

The deputy asked for Mrs. Kilby's license and she stated she still didn't have her license. A check of her Ten- (see Pills pg. 7)

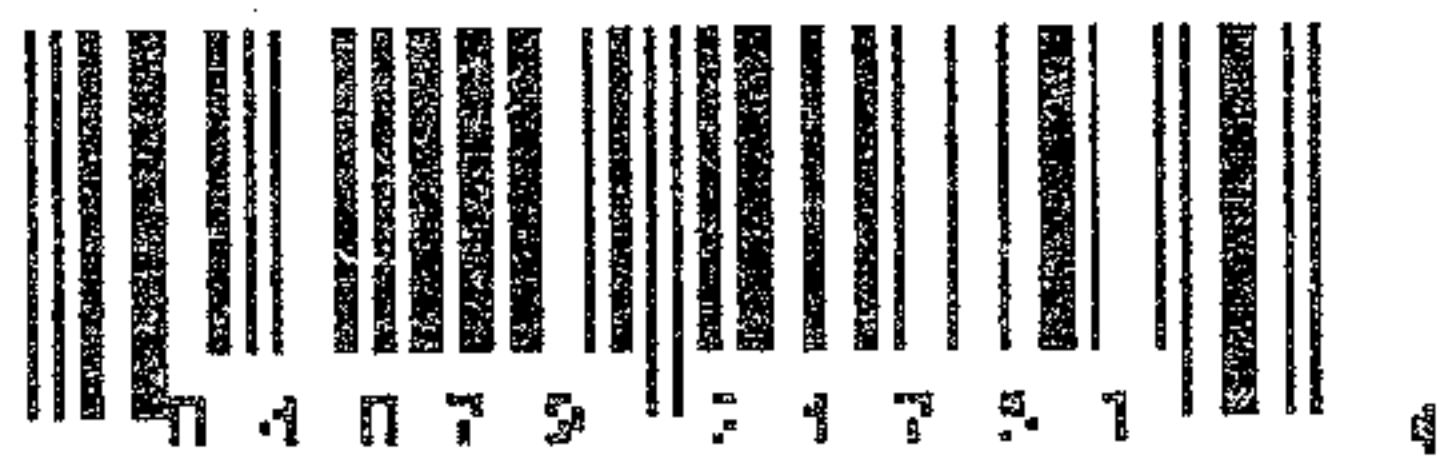

Man tries to run after failing to yield

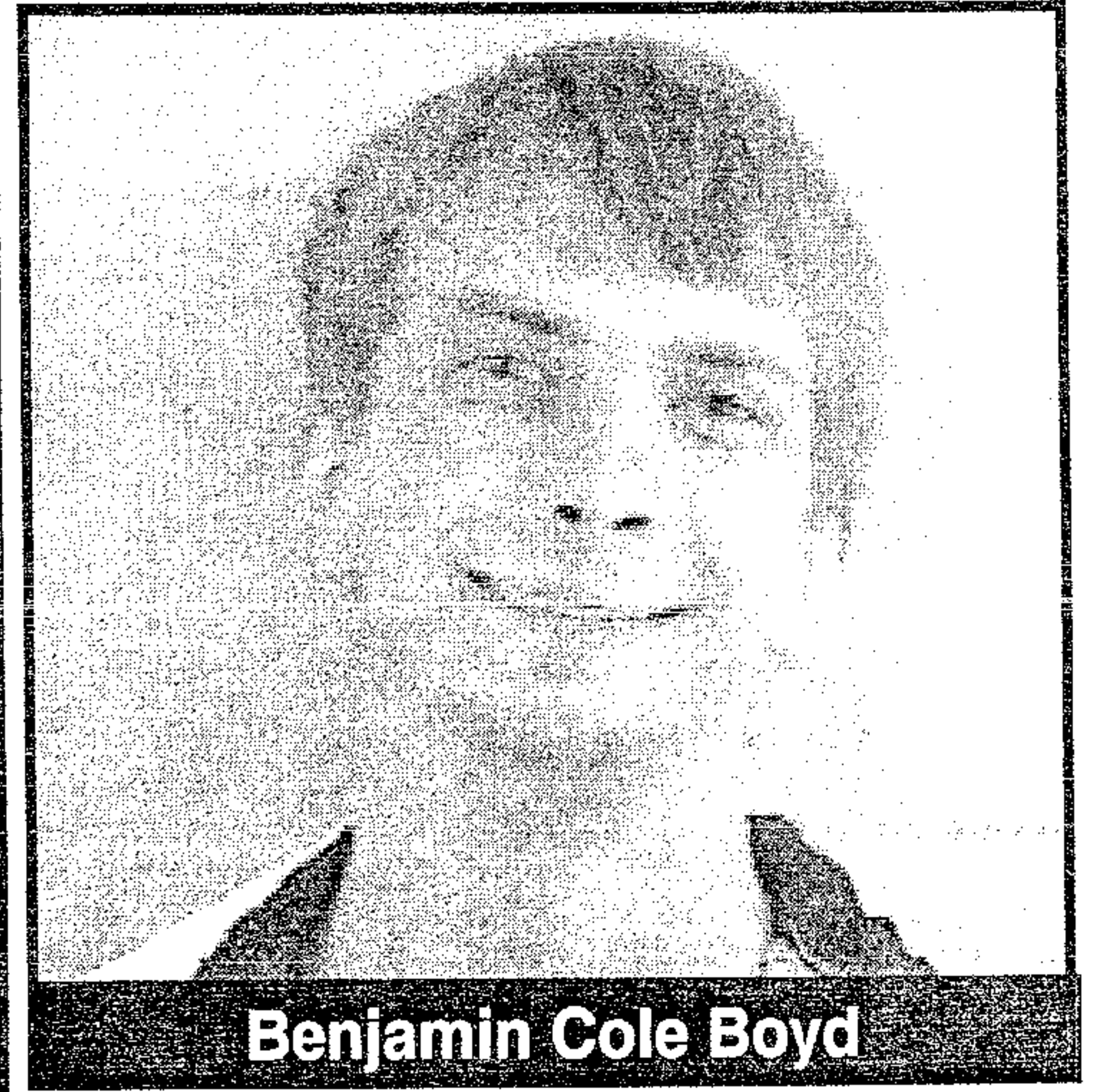

Christopher Bryan Turner, 20, Nichols Road, Crossville was charged Monday with fleeing-attempting to elude, possession of methamphetamine,

failure to yield and no proof of insurance.

The report states, Patrolman Darrell D. Butler, LCPD stopped a black Nissan Altima on Abbie Drive at Highway 321 for failure

to yield the right of way, which almost caused an accident with his patrol unit. Mr. Turner could not provide proof of insurance. A check of his license through NCIC along with a warrant check found

Turner with a warrant out of Cumberland County for violation of probation.

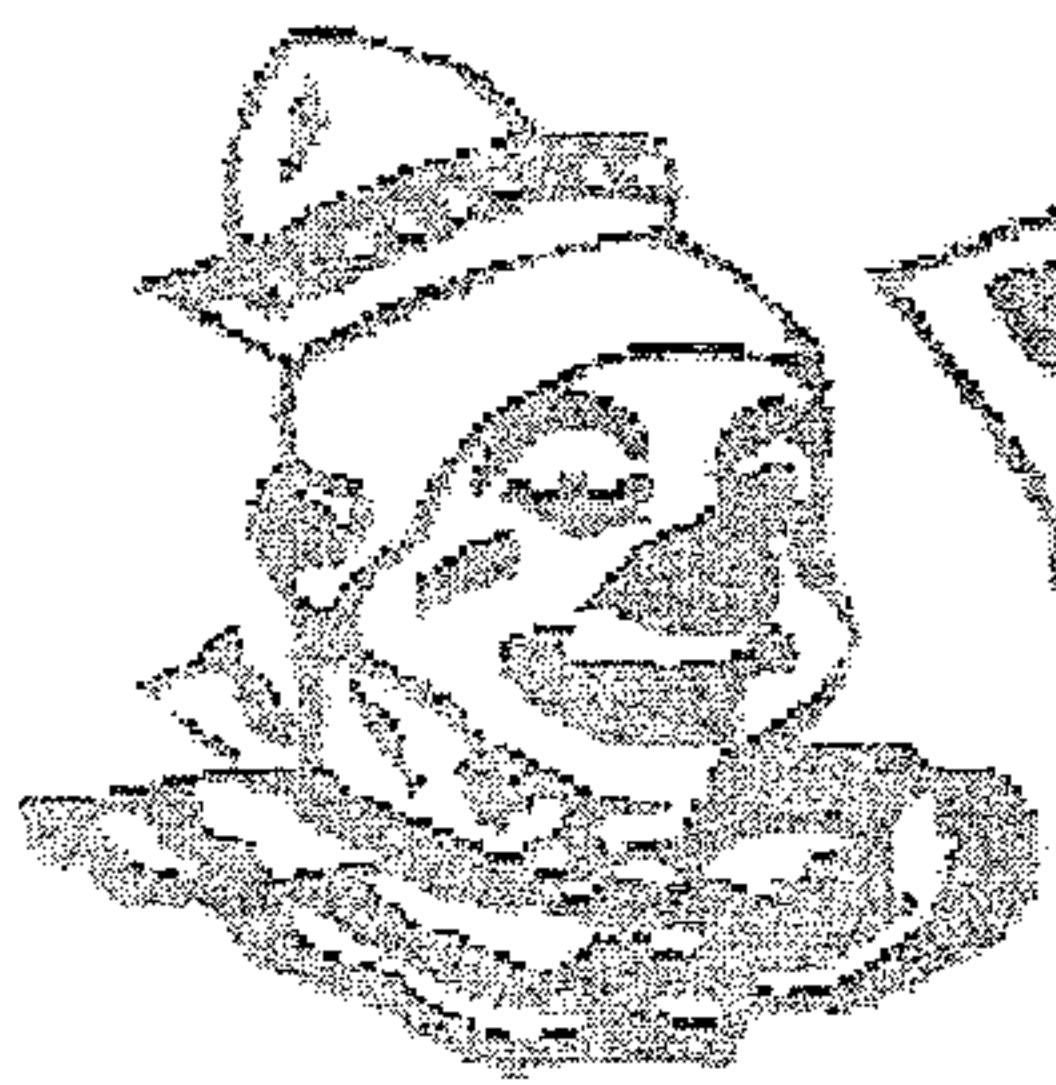

influence of alcohol. Benjamin Cole Boyd, 24, Duncan Road, Lenoir City was charged with DUI 2nd offense, leaving the scene of an accident and violation of implied consent law.

According to records, Deputy Brian Smith, LCSO responded to Ford Road in reference to a one vehicle accident. Upon arrival, the deputy saw a gold Honda Accord off the roadway and in a ditch, unattended.

Witnesses on the scene stated they saw a white male wearing blue jeans and a gray shirt leave the scene and run through the front yard of a residence down the street.

Deputy Travis Es-

tes, LCSO went to a residence on Duncan Road to make contact with the suspect. While entering the driveway, Deputy Estes spotted a man matching the description. Deputy Estes detained the man, identified as Benjamin Cole Boyd and transported him to the scene of the accident.

Witnesses identified Mr. Boyd as the driver that fled the scene. He was placed under

arrest for leaving the scene of an accident and transported to jail by Deputy Estes.

Shane Yarhan Matlock, 28, also of Beals Chapel Road, Lenoir City was charged with possession schedule II (oxycodone) for resale, possession of schedule IV (xanax) for resale, illegal possession of schedule IV (valium) and introduction of drugs into a penal institution.

According to Mat-

lock's records, Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO-ND, was contacted by Corporal Pete McGinley in reference to a man Deputy Deland and himself had stopped at Forest Heights Circle who was in possession of a large amount of prescription pain medication. When Investigator Ezell arrived on scene, Deputy Deland advised Shane Matlock had tried to conceal several bottles of medication.

There were three bottles, which were prescribed to Mr. Mat-

lock and filled the day before on Wednesday. One bottle was labeled 2 mg alprazolam (xanax) quantity #30, however in the bottle there were only 12 1/2 loose tablets. Packaged in a small baggie were 11 tablets and 1 loose small round blue pill identified as valium, a schedule IV drug. One bottle labeled 15 mg oxycodone quantity #120 containing (18) 15 mg oxycodone and (7) 30 mg oxycodone, a schedule II drug also were found.

Another bottle labeled 30 mg oxycodone quantity #240 contained 100 loose small blue pills identified as 30 mg oxycodone and in a small baggie there was (25) 30 mg oxycodone. Matlock was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Upon arrival, Deputy Ferguson, LCSO conducted a search and discovered a small plastic baggie containing (17) small blue pills in the top part of Mr. Matlock's

buttocks. They were identified as 30 mg oxycodone. Investigator Shane Ezell made the arrest. Deputy Ron Deland and Corporal Pete McGinley were also on scene.

Brent Huel Veal, 26, Martel Road, Lenoir City, was charged with disturbing the peace.

According to reports, Patrolman Mark Maxwell, LCPD was dispatched to the Waffle House in reference to a suspicious person harassing people in the immediate area. Upon the officer's arrival, Mr. Veal had already left the Waffle House and went to the Days Inn, where he was found knocking on doors asking for money from complete strangers. He had been at Wal-Mart prior to the Waffle House and Days Inn. Veal had several dollar bills and loose change on him and could not confirm where the money came from. He was annoying people in the area and causing a disturbance. Officer Maxwell deemed Mr. Veal a nuisance to other persons if left in the area and took him to jail.

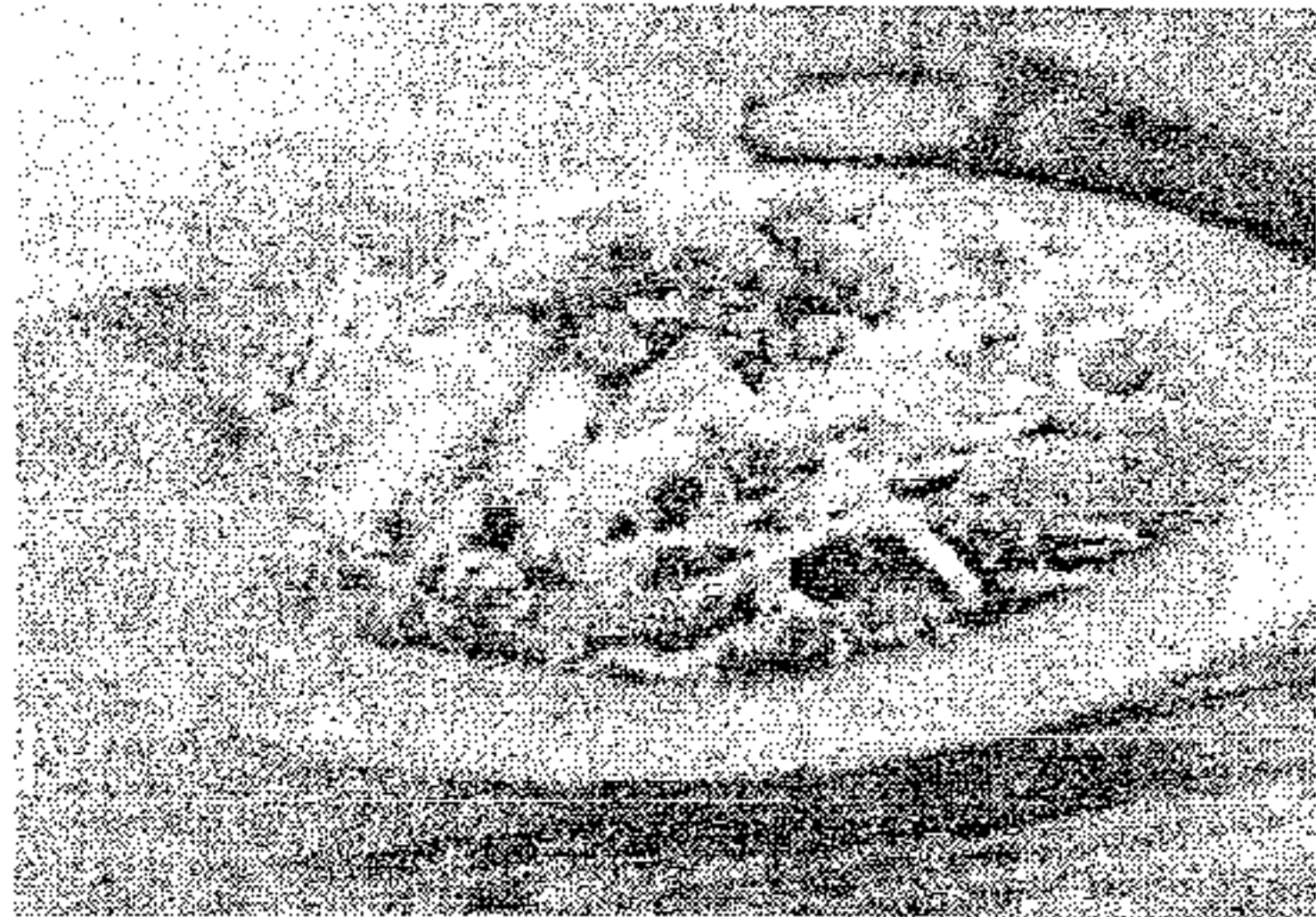

Michael Thomas Waters, 18, Highway 21 North, Lenoir City was charged with criminal trespassing and contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

According to the report, Deputy Michael Watkins, LCSO received a call in reference to a Forestry Service employee who

caught some people in the State Fire Tower Building Garage on Highway 70 West in Lenoir City without the owner's permission.

Upon arrival, the deputy met with Mr. Don White, a employee of the Forestry Division who advised he came to the location and witnessed the garage door open, with several people inside and out. He detained everyone until law enforcement arrived.

Mr. Waters stated one of his friends crawled through a window on the side of the garage and opened the door for the rest to enter. Mr. Waters was the only


