
Syeisha Teresa Kilby, 28, Beals Chapel Road, Lenoir City was charged Thursday with driving on revoked license.






Christopher Bryan Turner, 20, Nichols Road, Crossville was charged Monday with fleeing-attempting to elude, possession of methamphetamine,



Packaged in a small baggie were 11 tablets and 1 loose small round blue pill identified as valium, a schedule IV drug.
