Accident results in 2nds DUI, more for Alabama man

An Alabama man received several charges including his second DUI after being involved in accident without injury along Carding Machine Road over the weekend.

Timothy Charles Counts, 49, Lacey Springs, Alabama was charged Saturday with DUI 2nd offense, driving on suspended license,

leaving the scene of a accident and possession of stolen property.

According to reports, Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD was dispatched to the 1100 block of Carding Machine Road in reference to a vehicle accident with no injuries. Dispatch advised the driver of one of the vehicles

on Saturday, June 19 in Knoxville at the John Sevier Hunter Education Facility.

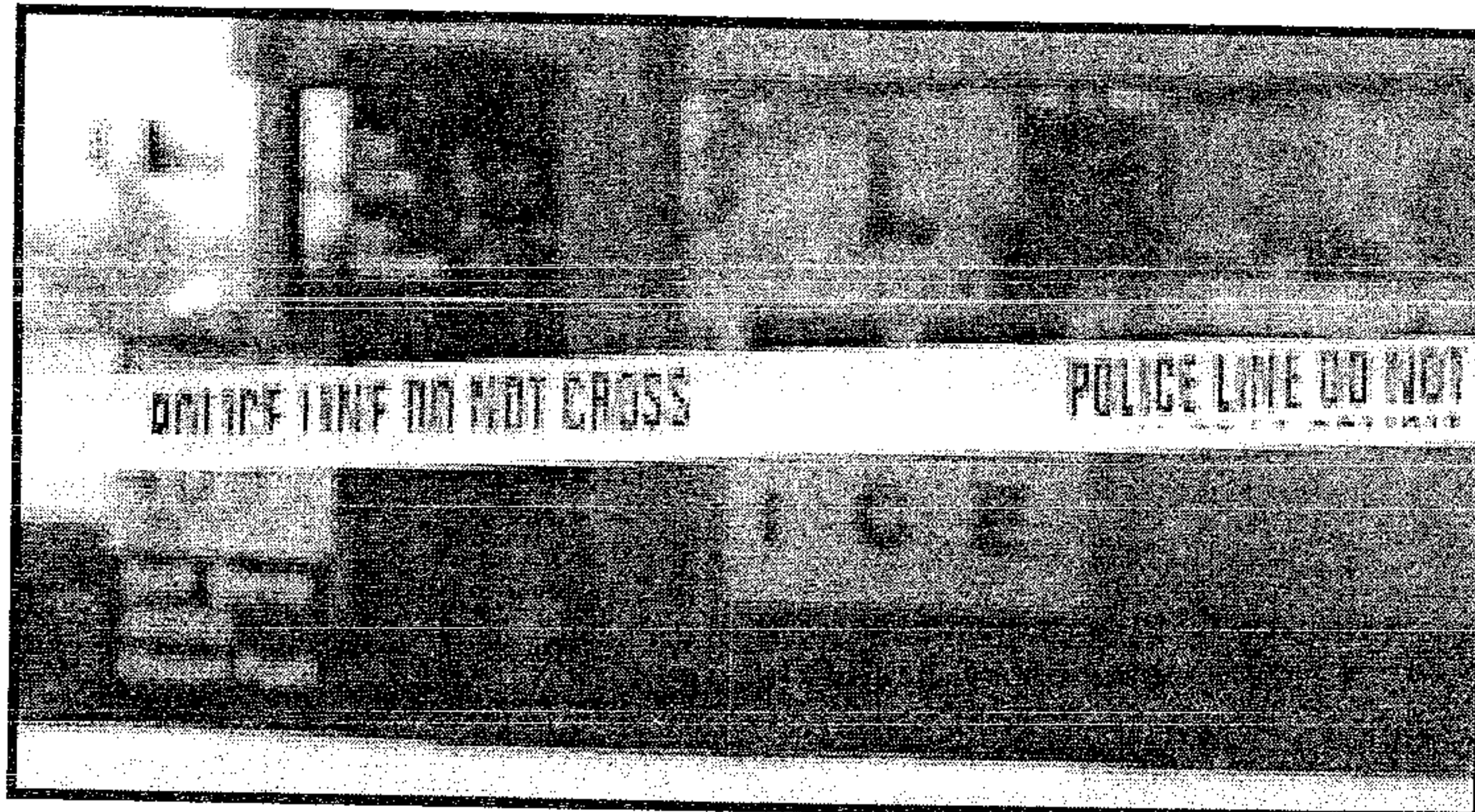

New Violent Robbery Initiative Gets Help from an Older Federal Law

FBI- Last month in Philadelphia, local police and the FBI began looking into a string of convenience store robberies that involved suspects holding store employees—and in some instances, customers—at gunpoint. One of the store clerks was pistol-whipped.

In general, violent crime is down in Philadelphia, but armed robberies of businesses—especially those committed by repeat violent offenders—remain an

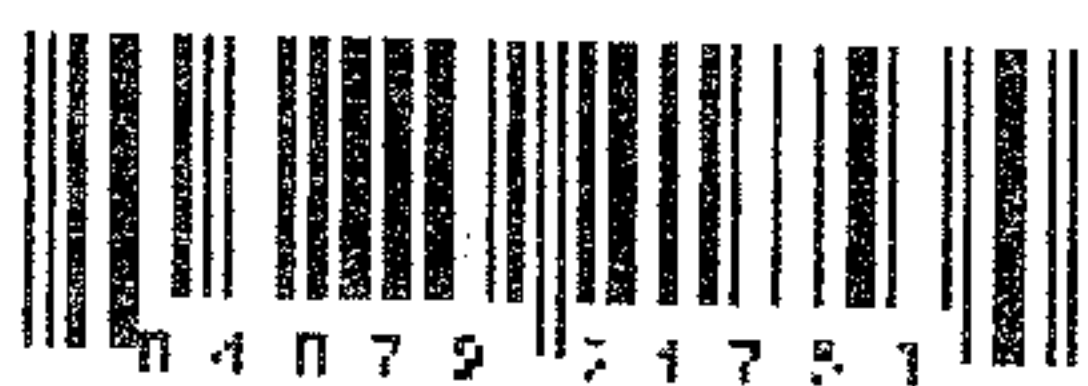


Yellow crime scene tape surrounds a gas station following a robbery

involved had left the scene on foot.

Upon arrival a witness gave the offi-

cer a description of the man who had left the scene. Through the course of investigating the accident, officers learned the man's name was Timothy Counts.

At approximately 1:30 AM Sunday, Mr. Counts was located at the 1100 block of Carding Machine Road. Mr. Counts was wearing the same clothing the witness described and fit the

overall description. He had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person and was unsteady on his feet and after being advised of his rights, stated he was driving the vehicle and had left the scene.

Mr. Counts was transported to the ER for treatment as well as a BAC. Counts stated the vehicle in question, a 1996

Ford F-150 bearing Alabama registration was owned by him. The tag on the vehicle was reported stolen.

Counts also had a suspended license in Tennessee and a prior DUI in the state of Alabama.

Police Beat

Stanley Floyd Mania, 33, Brandywine Circle, Knoxville, was charged with DUI 1st offense, violation of implied consent and speeding.

According to records, Monday, at approximately 12:01 AM, Officer Bennie Houser, LPD observed a black Ford F-150 on Highway 72 at Highway 11 traveling west at 62 mph in a 45 mph zone. It turned right on Mulberry Street and crossed the center line three times and was still traveling at 60 mph in a 45 mph zone on Mulberry.

Officer Houser stopped the pickup in front of the High School and asked the driver, Mr. Mania, to see his drivers license, registration and proof of insurance.

According to the officer's report, Mr. Mania handed him

his license and just sat there and stared at him. Officer Houser asked where Mania was coming from and Mania said Knoxville. Asked again for his registration and proof of insurance, Mr. Mania handed the officer his proof of insurance but never gave him his registration.

Officer Houser then asked Mania where he was going and Mr. Mania advised home to Knoxville. He had a strong odor of an intoxicant about his person and stated he'd drunk two beers.

Mr. Mania was very unsteady exiting the vehicle and performed poorly on field sobriety tasks. He was read the Implied Consent and refused. Mr. Mania also refused to sign the speeding citation.

Mania stated he did not mean to be riding around in Onieda causing problems. Officer Houser advised Mr. Mania he was arrested in the City of Loudon and was at the Loudon County Jail. Mr. Mania did not realize he was in Loudon. Officer Brandon DeBoer, LPD, was also on scene.

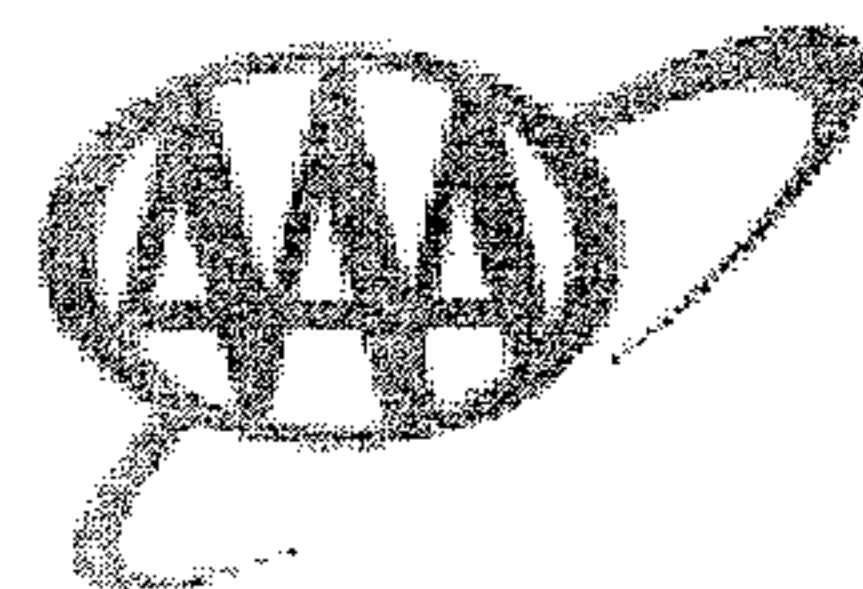

Siedler

According to reports, Thursday at

approximately 11:31 PM, Deputy Jason Goddard, LCSO was dispatched to a Steekee Road residence on a domestic violence call and upon arrival spoke to David Siedler who stated he and a female had been arguing. 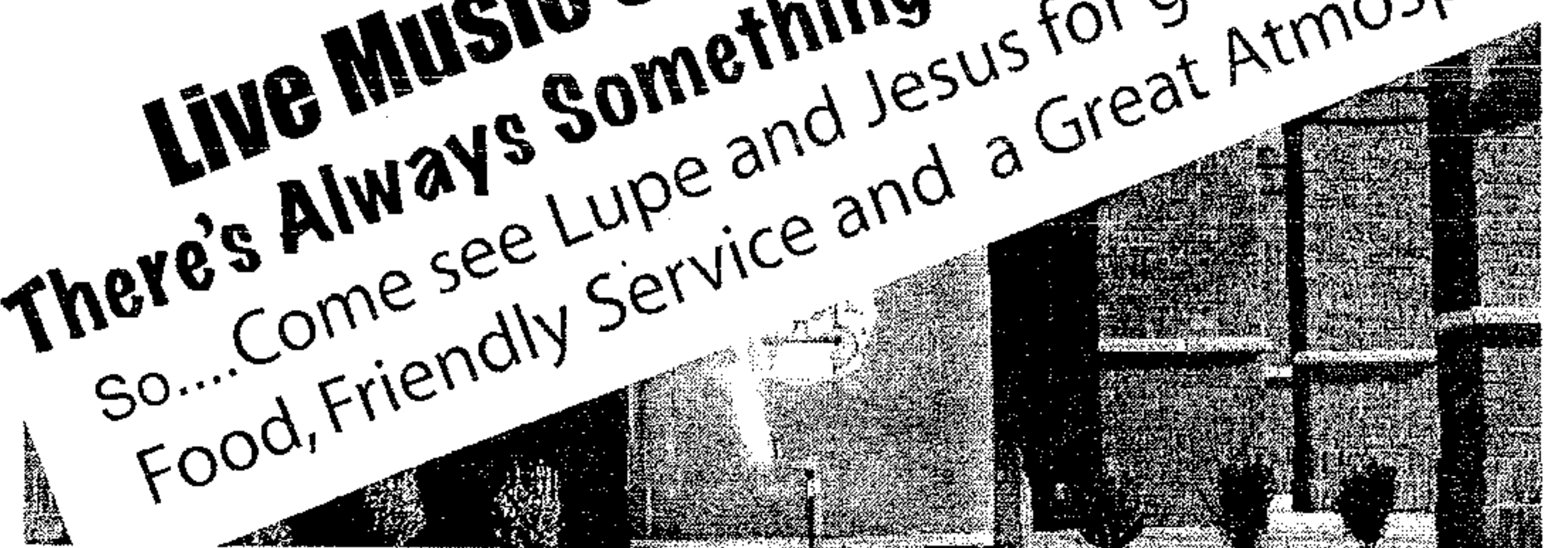

Robert Jamison 'Jamie' Brewster, 24, Crestview Drive, Sweetwater, was charged with driving under the influence, driving on suspended license, and leaving the scene of an accident.

According to re-

ports, Saturday around 4:50 AM, Sgt. Jimmey J. Wiggins, LCSO was dispatched to a hit and run accident on Interstate 75 near the 81 mile marker. Dispatch advised a third party was behind the suspect vehicle, a red Chevy Cavalier going south on the Interstate.

Sgt. Wiggins caught up to the Cavalier at the 72 exit and stopped it. The driver was identified as Robert J. Brewster. A check of his drivers license status revealed they were suspended for failure to satisfy a citation.

Mr. Brewster reportedly admitted to running off the roadway but did not recall hitting another vehicle. He also admitted to drinking three beers and a mixed drink at the Carousel Club in Knoxville.

Upon arrival at the jail, Sgt. Wiggins read the Implied Consent Form to Brewster and he agreed to take the

intoximeter. Mr. Brewster registered .08%.

Two passengers in the vehicle were also charged. Ricardo Chauntez Alston, 21, County Road 796, Etowah, was charged with public intoxication.

Nathaniel Ray Barker, 20, Highway 11 South, Riceville, was charged with

underage consumption.

Mr. Alston reportedly admitted to drinking some beers earlier in the night. He had no one close to pick him up and Sgt. Wiggins felt he would be a danger to himself if allowed to walk.

Mr. Barker reportedly also admitted to drinking some beers earlier in the night. He is 20 years of age.

Records indicate Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO had also responded to the accident scene involving Brewster and found a 2004 Dodge off in the median. The driver was not injured but damage was done to his back bumper and a tire was flat.
