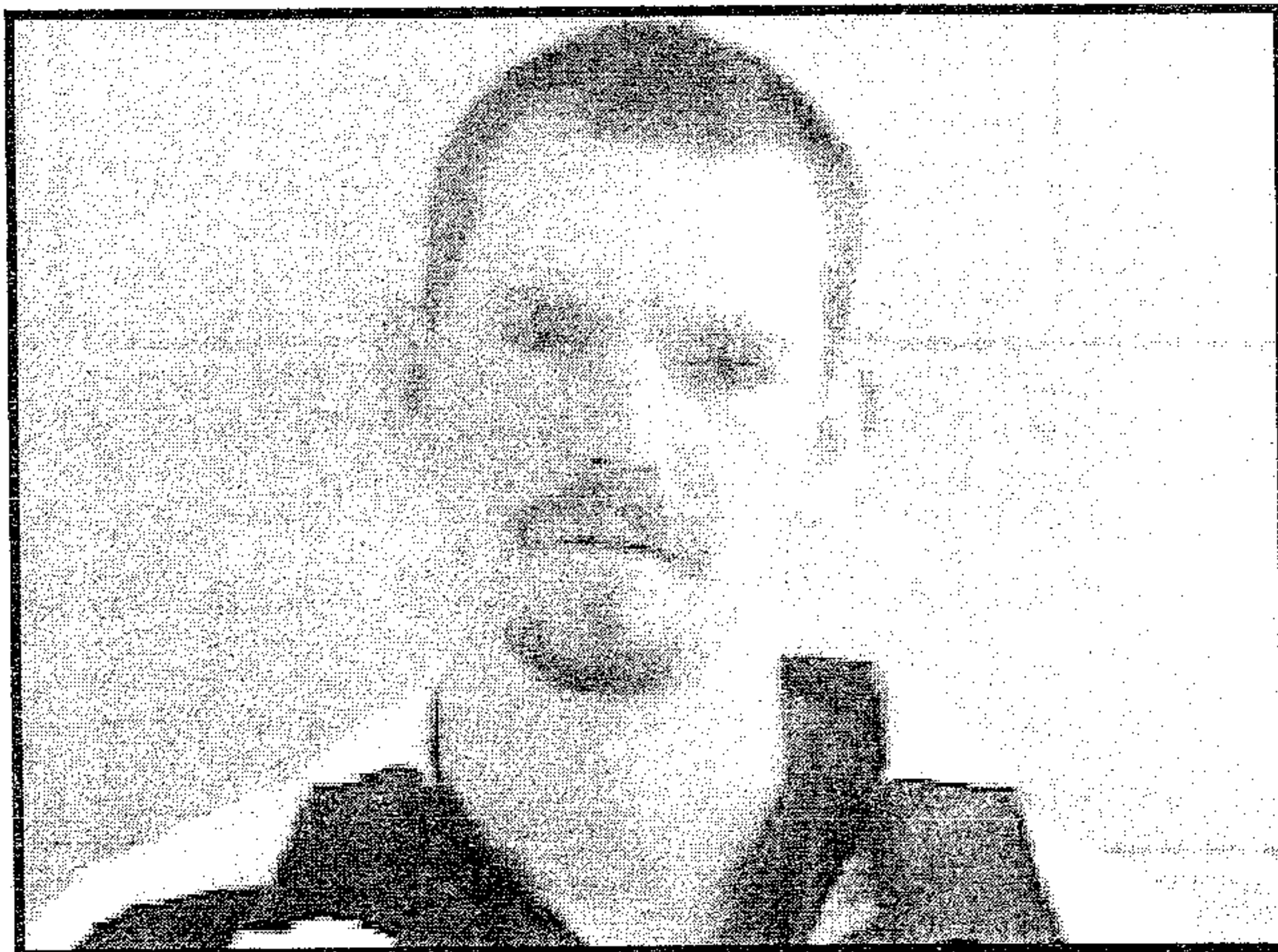

A Lenoir City man injured a passenger in his vehicle when he allegedly drove drunk and sideswiped another vehicle before crashing into a house. He is also accused of being belligerent with those who were dispatched to help him and his friend.

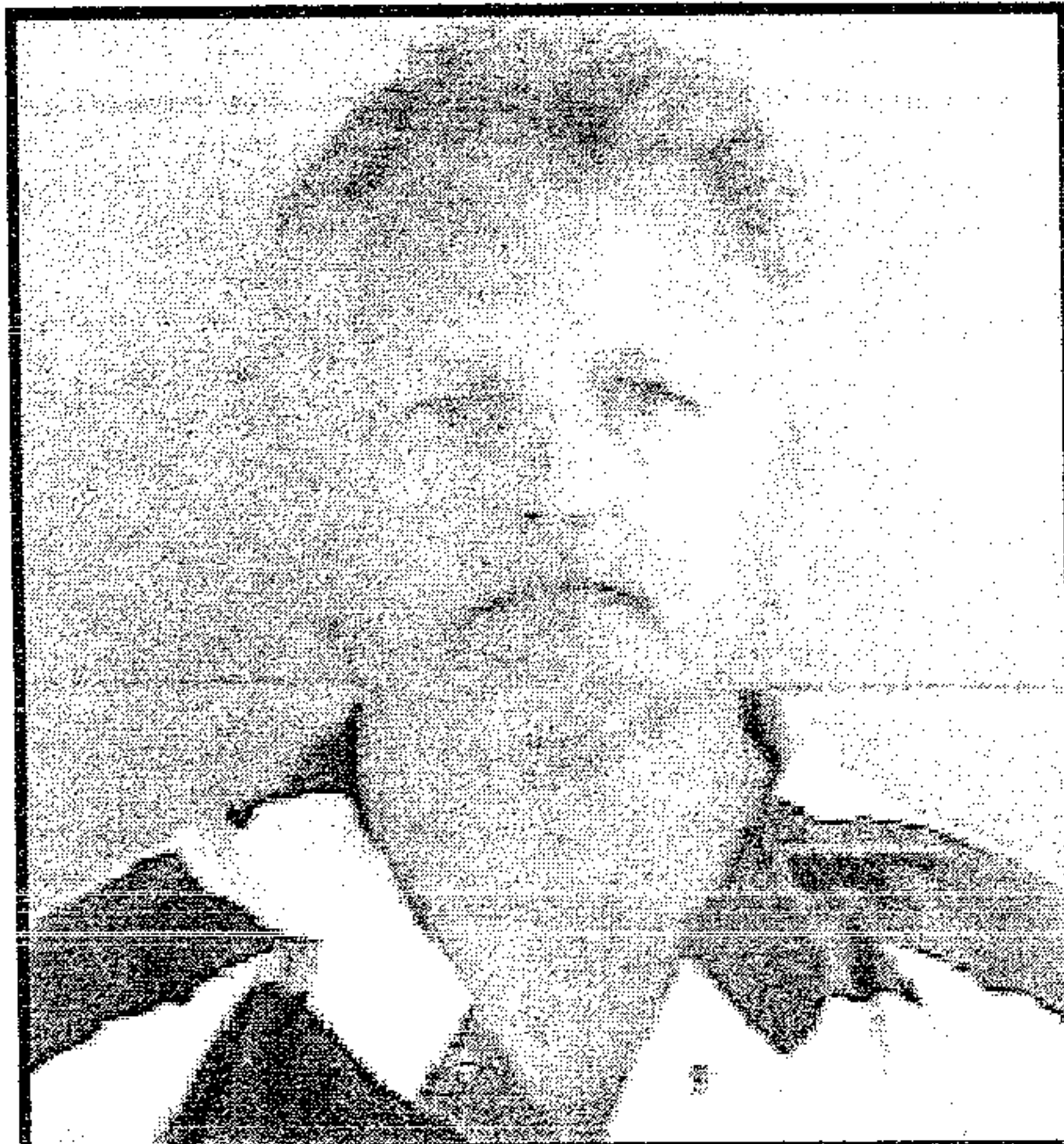

Road, Sweetwater was charged Tuesday with DUI.

According to records, Deputy Brandon Dixon, LCSO responded to the Sunny Side Road area in reference to a vehicle in a ditch with a possibly drunk driver behind the wheel. When the deputy arrived on scene he spoke to Mr. Timothy Crawford.

Mr. Crawford had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person. He was unsteady on his feet and had bloodshot eyes and slurred speech.

Mr. Crawford advised he was the driver of the gold Buick Park Avenue in the ditch. He performed poorly on field sobriety tasks.

Deputy Dixon read the implied consent

to Mr. Crawford and he agreed to the test. Once at the jail, Mr. Crawford took the intoximeter and blew into it three times, however, every time the results were insufficient.

Mr. Crawford was also charged with violation of implied consent.

According to reports, Officer Bren-

dan DeBoer, LPD observed a green Ford Ranger traveling north on Mulberry Street in the City of Loudon. While behind the vehicle, the officer saw it cross over the center line as well as the white lane line numerous times. He also noticed the brake lights on the Ranger were not operating correctly.

After stopping the

vehicle at Highland Avenue, Officer DeBoer reported he smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage on Mr. Black. Mr. Black's speech was slurred and he was slow to respond to questions. He performed poorly on field sobriety tasks.

Mr. Black was read, signed and submitted to a BAC test via the Tennessee implied consent form. The result of the test conducted at the Loudon County Jail was .13%.
