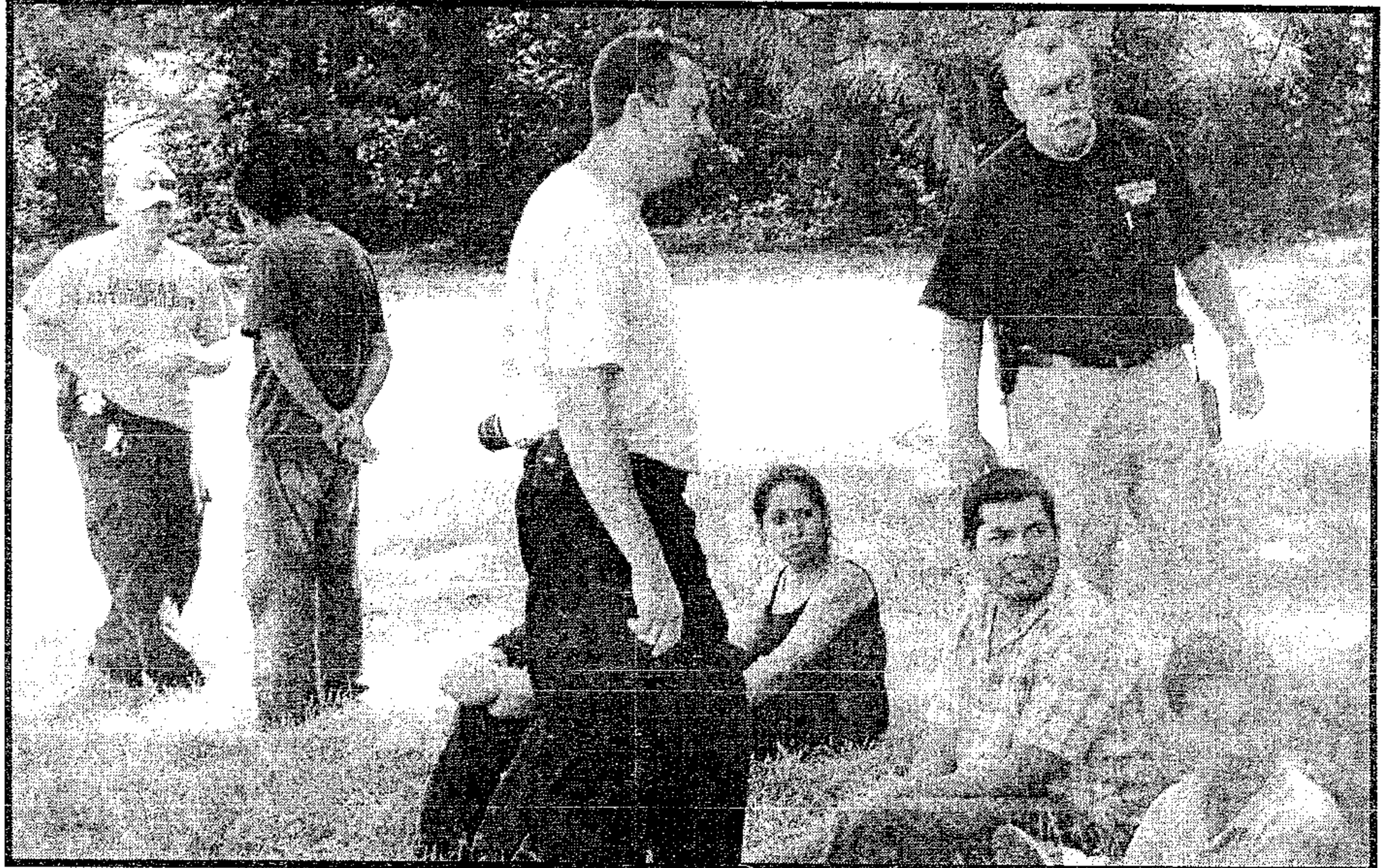

## Illegals Freed After Manhunt

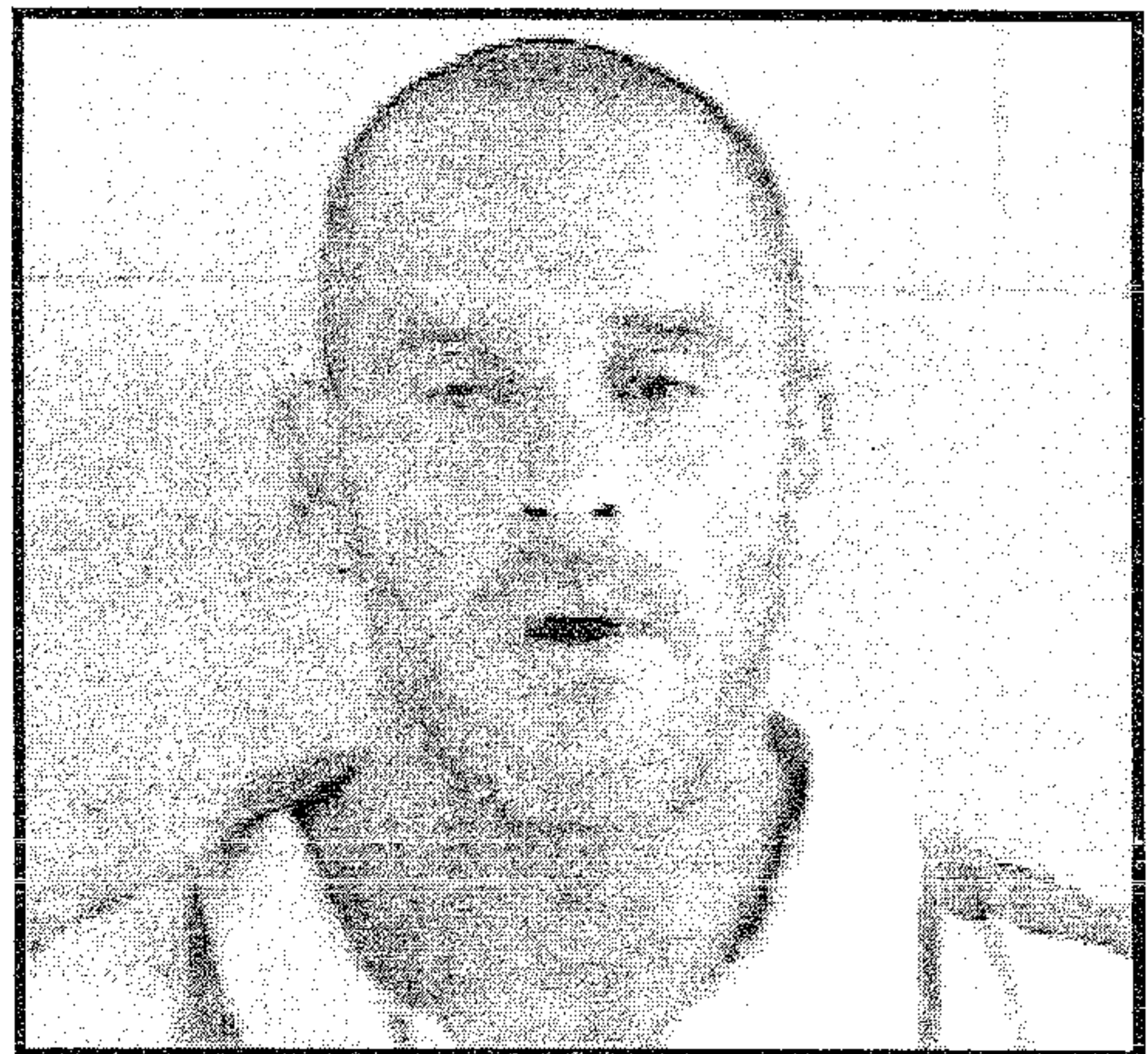

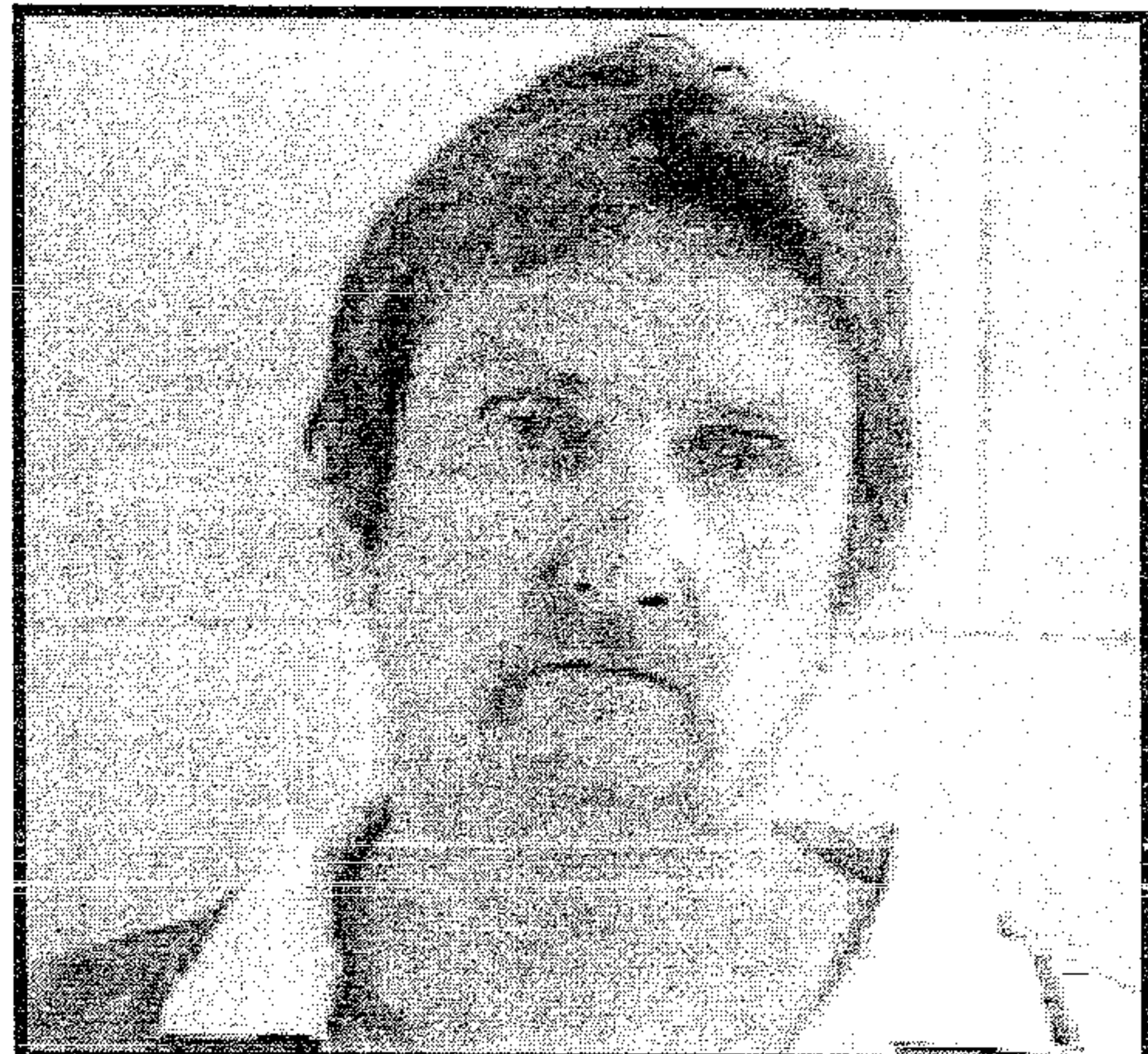

Officials arrested a Loudon man after he allegedly fled the scene of an accident he was involved in while reportedly driving under the influence of alcohol.

Graves, 38, Kingston Highway, Loudon was charged Monday with DUI and leaving the scene of an accident.

The report states, Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSO responded to Williams Ferry Road, Lenoir City in reference to a collision with no injuries. While en route to the scene it was reported one of the vehicles had left the scene of the acci-

dent. It was described as a white pickup pulling a trailer with one wheel messed up on it.

Deputy Brewer arrived on the scene at 9:28 PM, and discovered the truck had left the area. A witness called in and reported seeing the truck at Ruby Tuesdays.

Officer Jeremy Dishner, LCPD and Deputy Chad Petty, LCSO located the

truck at Ruby Tuesdays on Highway 321 at 9:37 PM. Mr. Darrell Graves was the driver and only occupant of the truck.

According to Deputy Brewer's report, while he was talking with Mr. Graves about the accident, he could smell an odor of an intoxicating beverage coming from Graves's breath and person. Graves had bloodshot eyes, slurred speech and had difficulty keeping his balance.

Graves advised he drank 4 to 5 beers that afternoon. He did poorly on field sobriety tasks and could not complete them.

Mr. Graves was read and explained the Im-

plied Consent Law and refused to have blood drawn. He was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.



LPD officials arrested a Loudon man after he allegedly injured a female during a physical altercation and when police left the hospital where the victim was being treated to go to the man's home, officers found a small amount of marijuana and a pipe lying in plain view.

Richard Wayne McCollum, 33, Summer Street, Loudon was charged with aggravated domestic assault, simple possession schedule VI and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to reports, Sunday, at approximately 3:13 AM, Officer Bennie Houser, LPD responded to the Fort Loudoun ER for a possible domestic assault that occurred on Summer Street.

Upon arrival, the officer met with a woman who stated Richard

A Loudon man was jailed on his 4th DUI and more after he reportedly damaged several properties while driving under the influence of alcohol Friday.

was stopped at the Sugarlimb Road exit with eight men and two women in it.

Officers with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement arrived and prepared to have the van towed, but all 10 people started to run.

Officials said they are all undocumented.

Four of the people were caught and taken into federal custody.

Authorities with U.S.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement were contacted but declined to retrieve the suspects, District Attorney General Russell Johnson said.

"There were no state charges on which to hold the four, who were merely passengers in the operation," Johnson stated in a news release. "State and local agencies have no authority or ability to deport illegal aliens, so they were released."

Still missing: the driv-

er and co-driver of what was Johnson called an "illegal human-trafficking operation."

Those two men, paid to transport the passengers, also are allegedly illegal immigrants from Mexico, officials said.

Six of them fled on foot "in unison" when authorities with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement arrived, said Agent John Sanchez.

The incident sparked a massive manhunt that included Loudon County Sheriff's Office, Lenoir City Police Department, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Loudon Police Department, police dogs and a helicopter from the Knox County Sheriff's Office.

Agent Sanchez said Loudon County sher-

iff's deputies nabbed the four suspects Tuesday morning after a resident reported seeing them walking along New Providence Road.

The suspected illegal immigrants told authorities they were traveling from Texas to Knoxville, where they had been promised work in a restaurant.

Davis was unsteady on his feet and had slurred speech and reportedly admitted to taking klonopin.

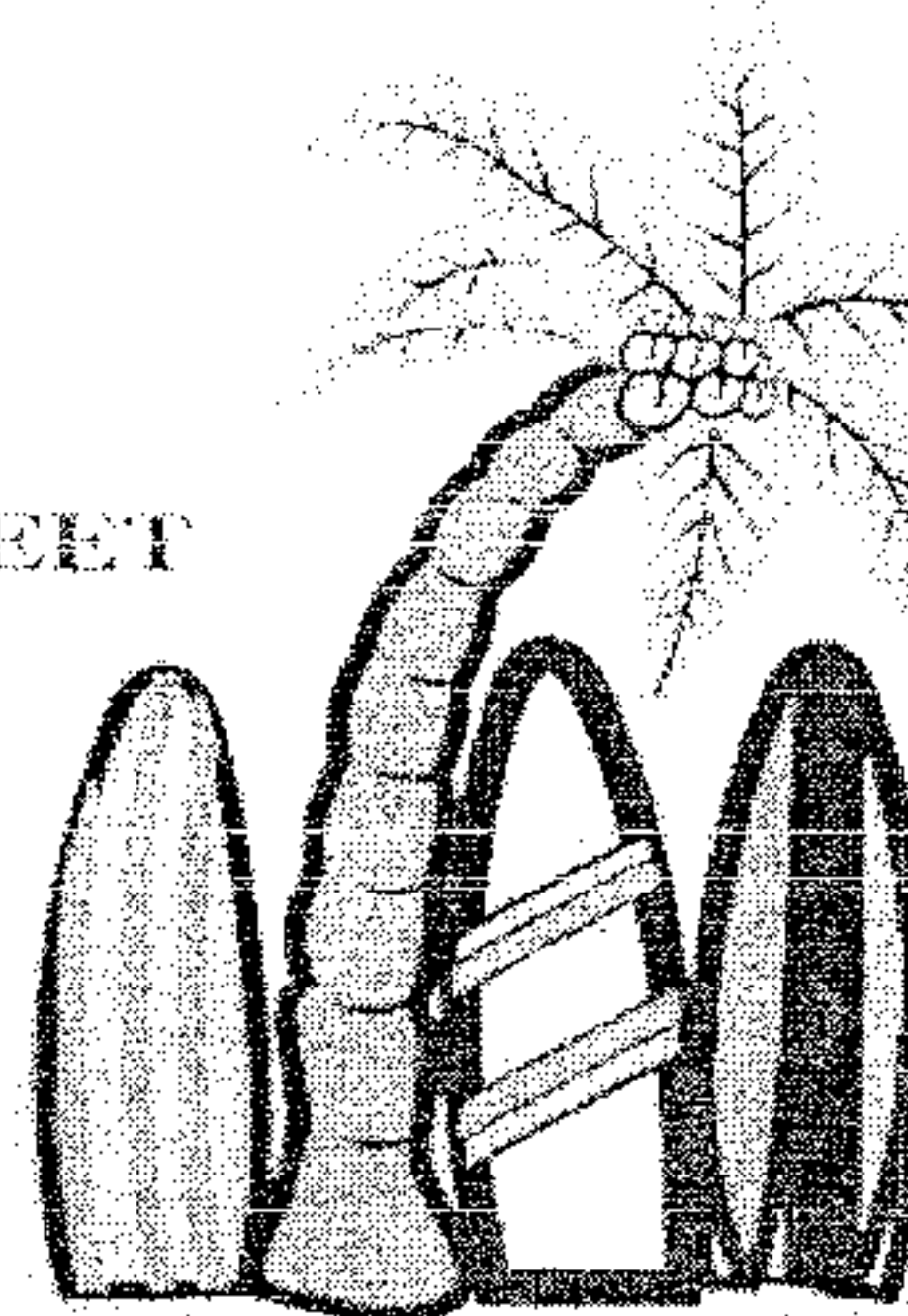
Officer Dishner determined Mr. Davis to be a danger to himself and others and placed him under arrest.
