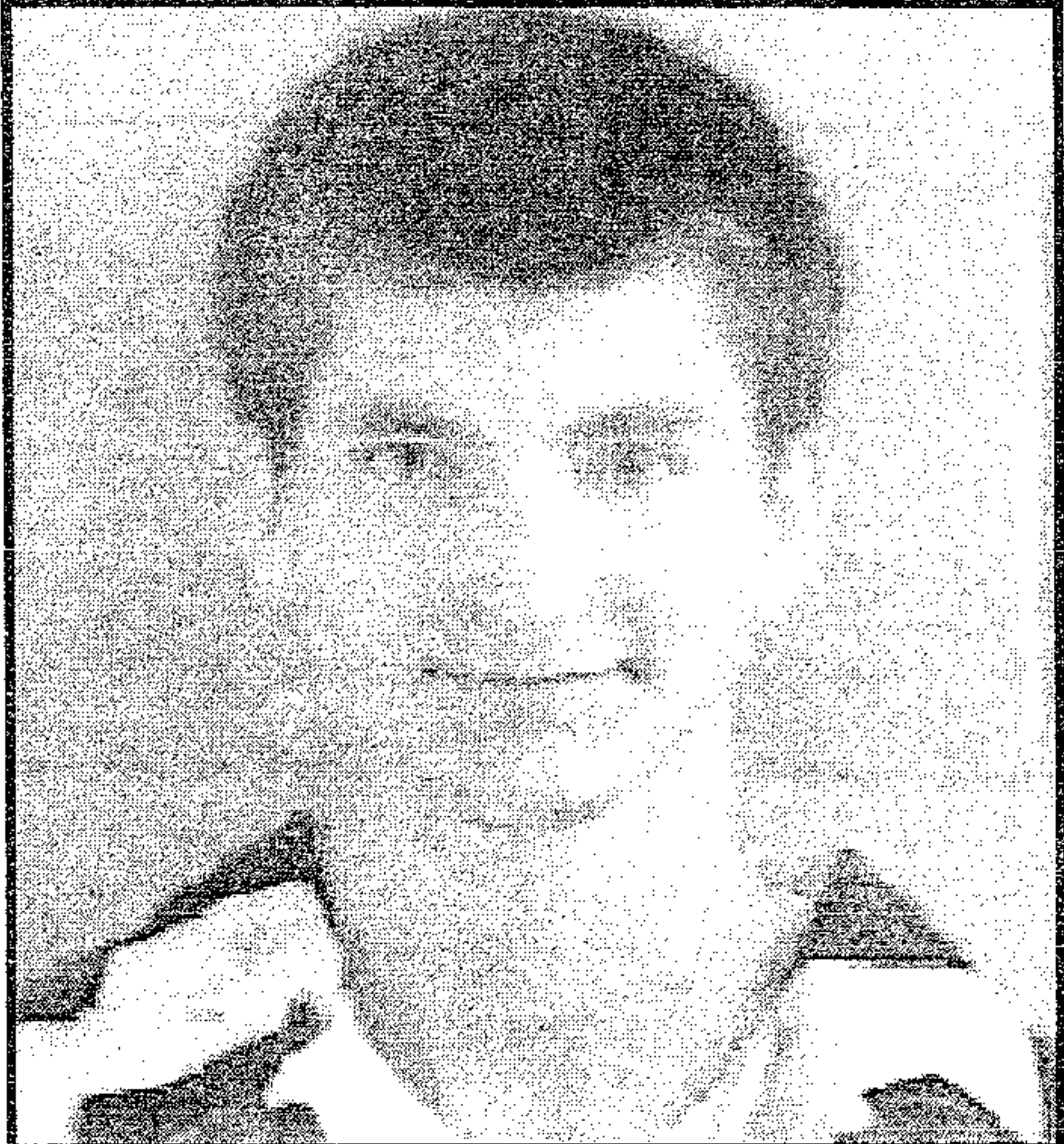

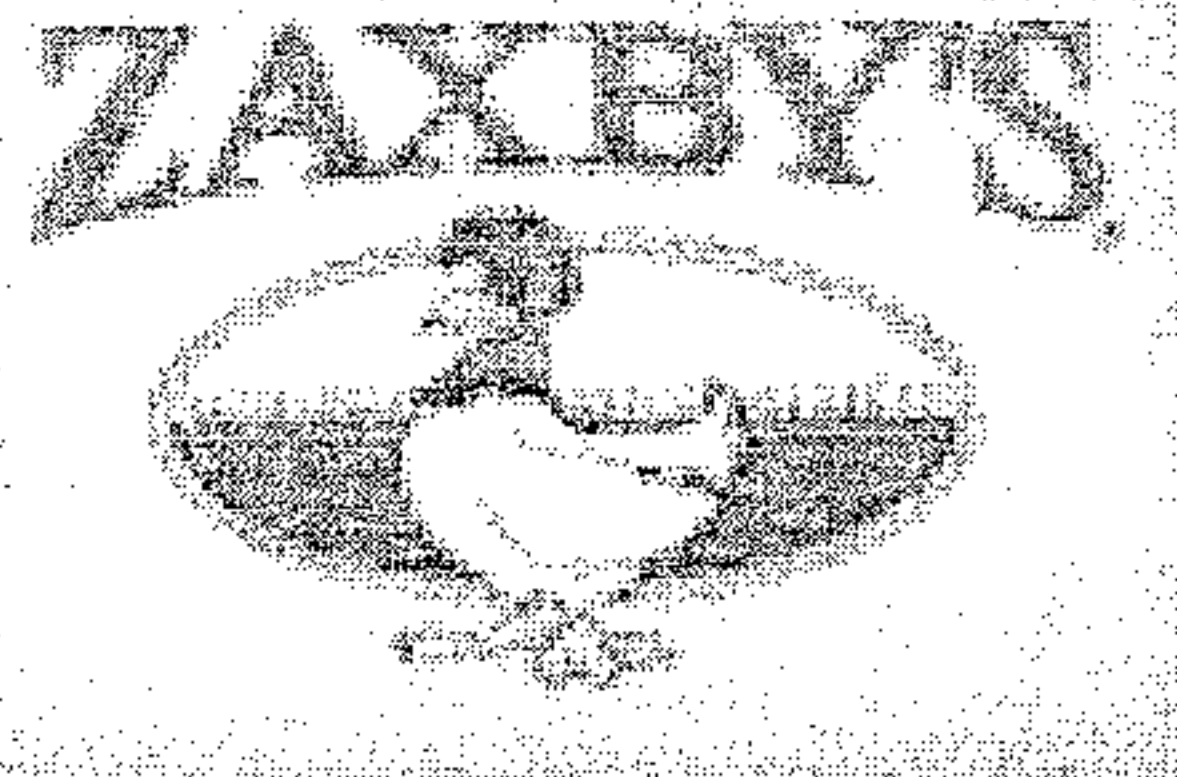
Ronald David Lee, 63, Beals Chapel Road, Lenoir City was charged with driving under the influence, open container and possession of a weapon while under the influence.
