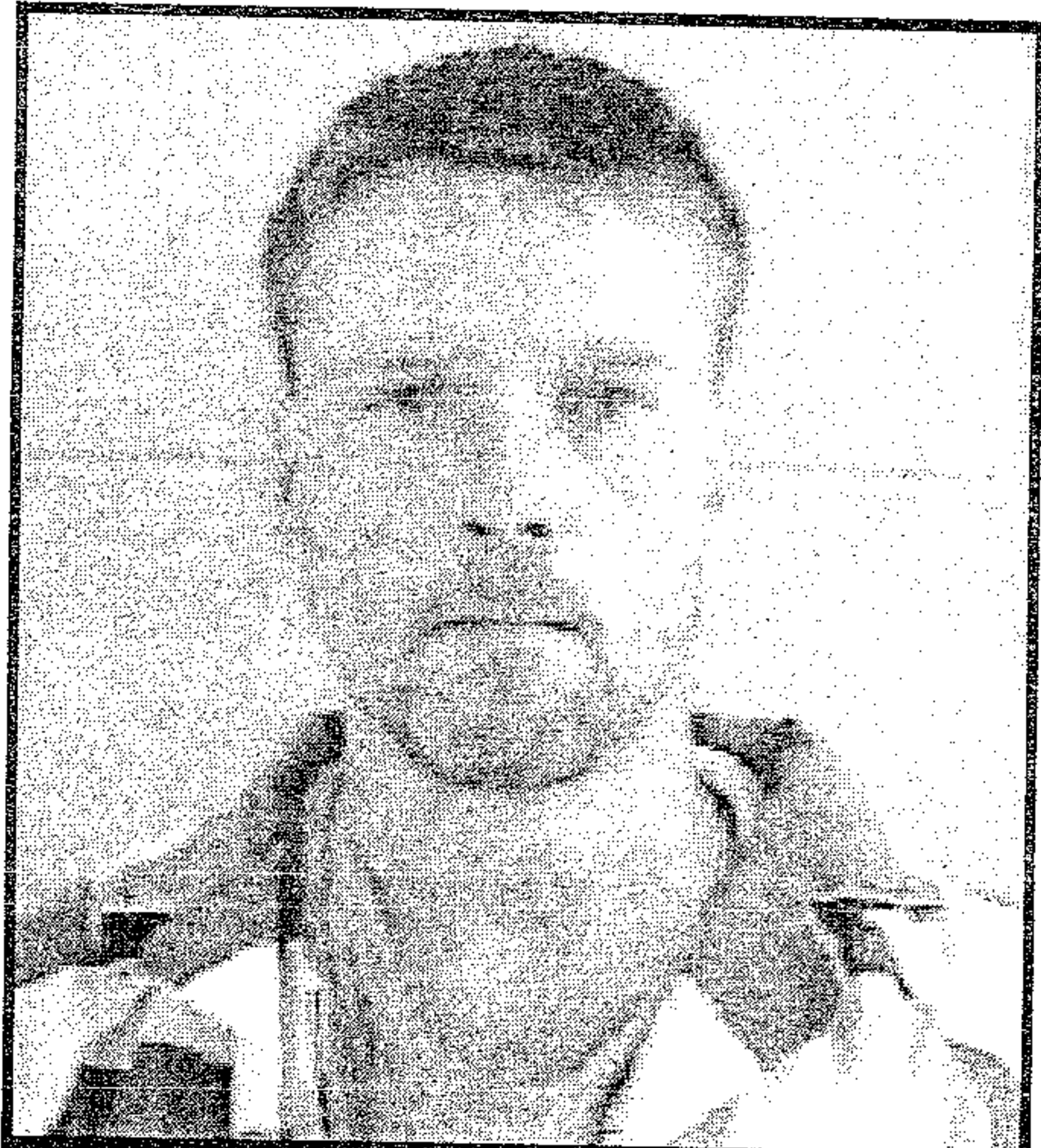
## Burglary charges filed against local man

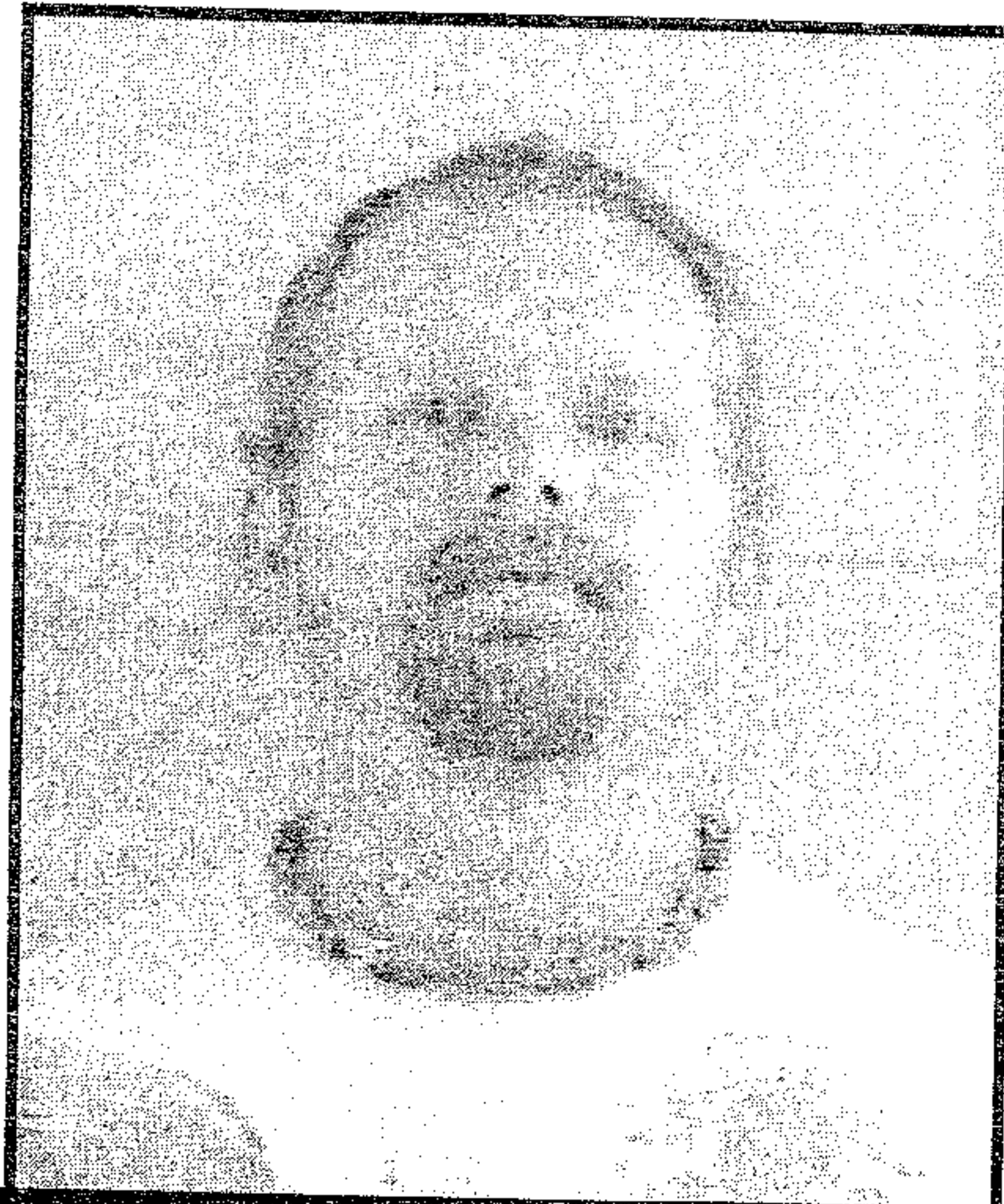
## Inmate charged with contraband

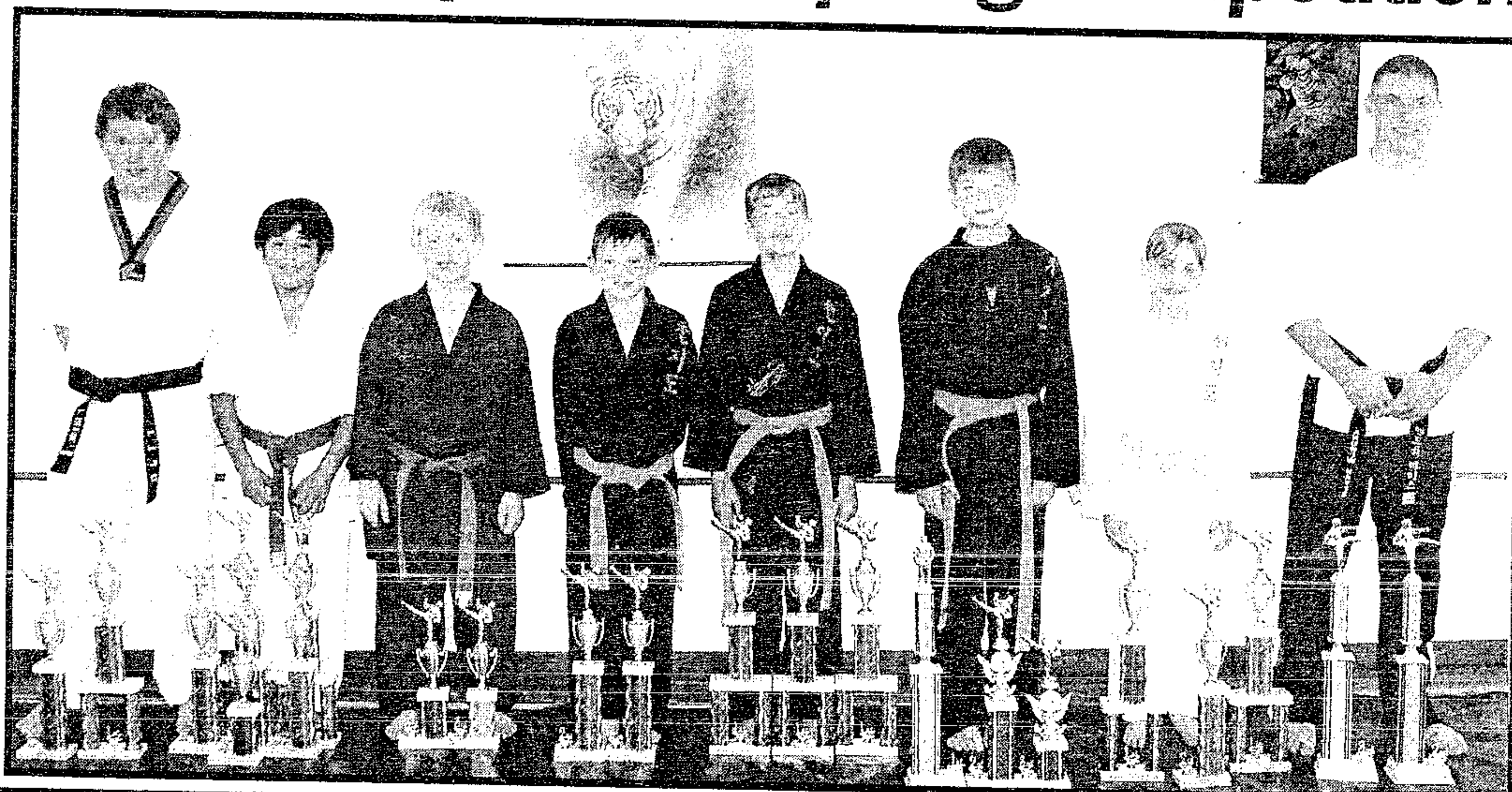

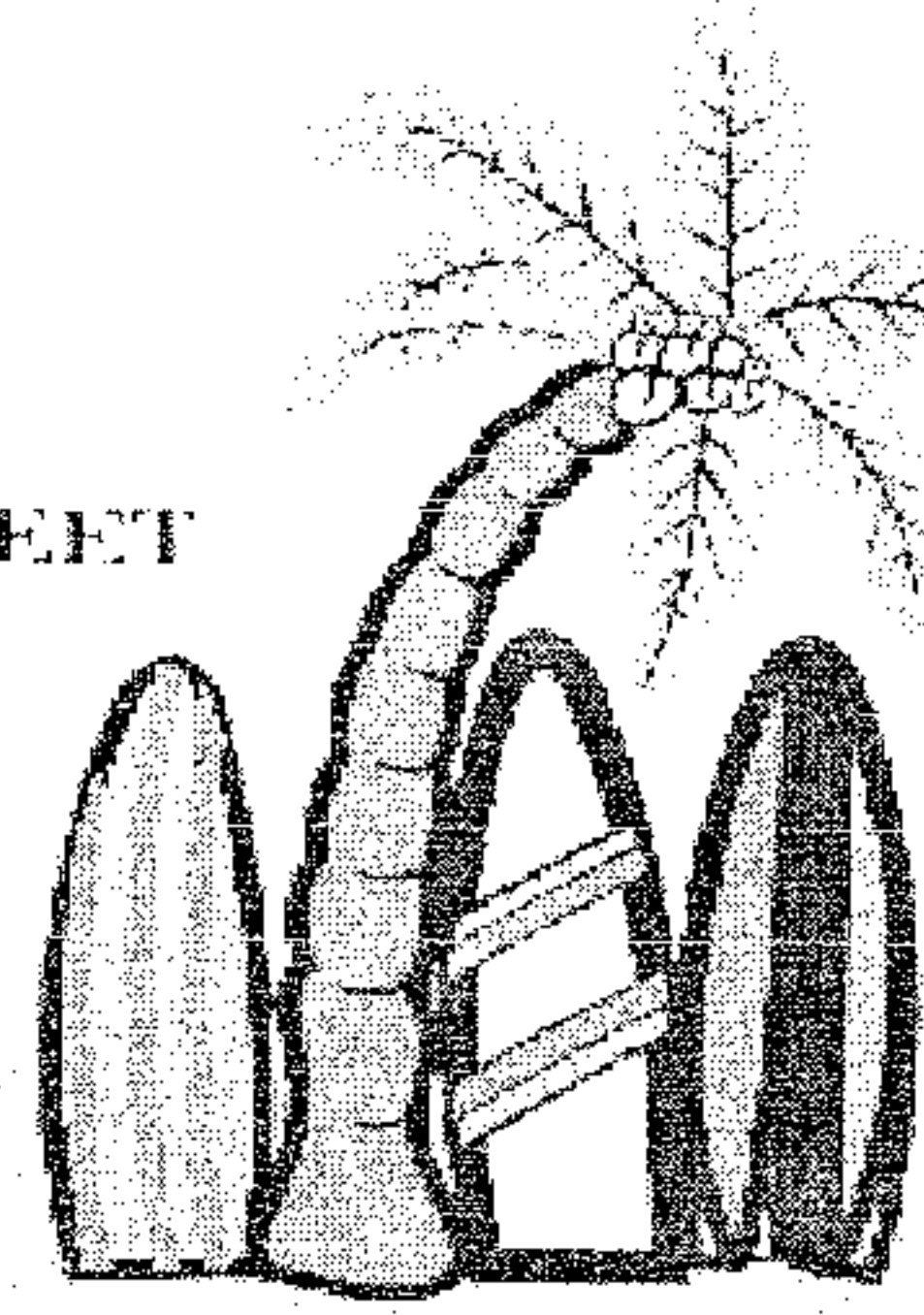

### Bandy

Angi Martin, LCSO was serving lunch to "F" Block at the Loudon County Jail she noticed several male inmates going into the shower.

Corporal Martin reported she entered the block and found inmate Bandy and three others smoking in the shower. Inmate Bandy walked away and went over to his bunk area where the corporal witnessed Mr. Bandy put something under his mat.

Bandy was instructed to hand over what he had placed under the mat and he handed Corporal Martin a clear baggy with what appeared to be loose tobacco and a lighter.

Mr. Bandy again attempted to walk away from the officer towards the bunks next to the phones and Corporal Martin again witnessed inmate Bandy place something under the top bunks mat. Bandy's actions were witnessed on

camera by the control room officer, Deputy Maples.

Inmate Bandy was instructed to place his hands on the wall. Corporal Martin retrieved two blue pills, later identified as diazepam, wrapped in cellophane.

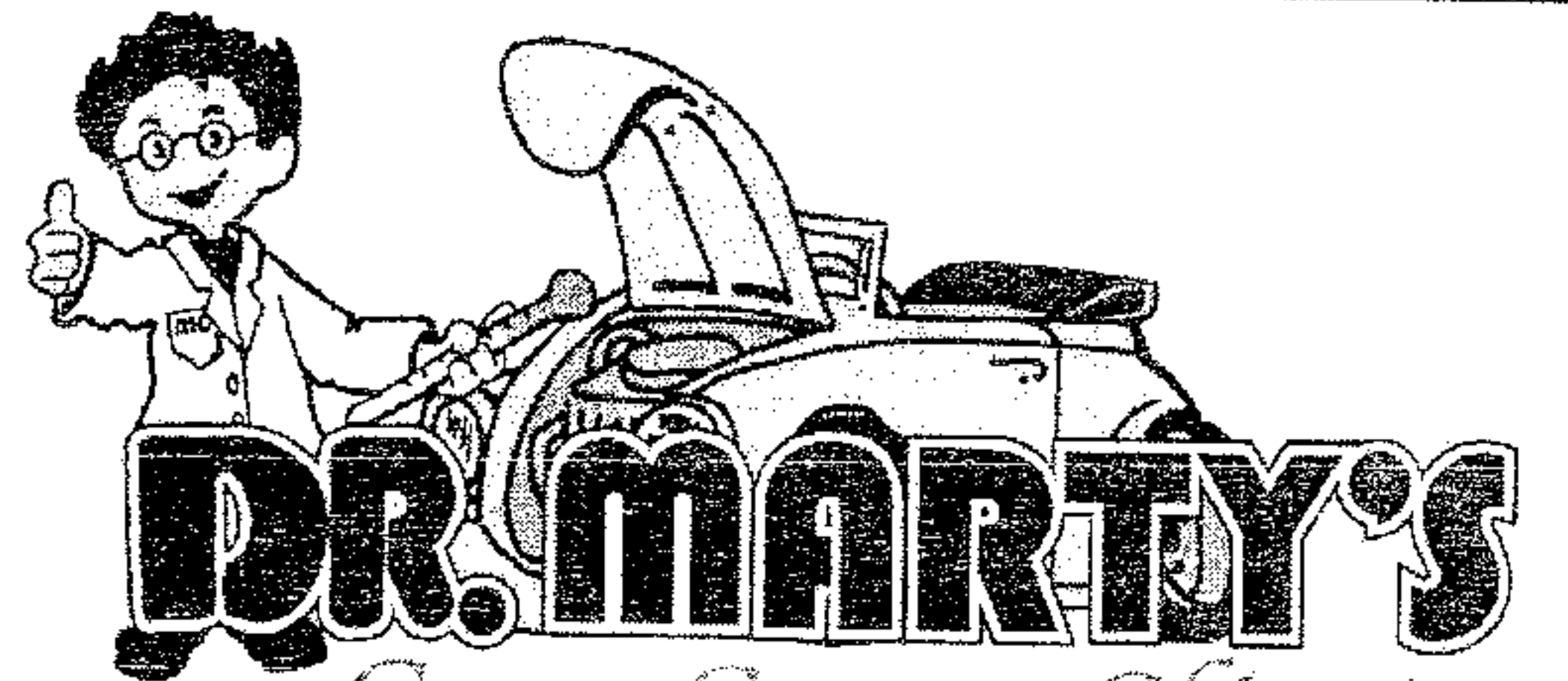

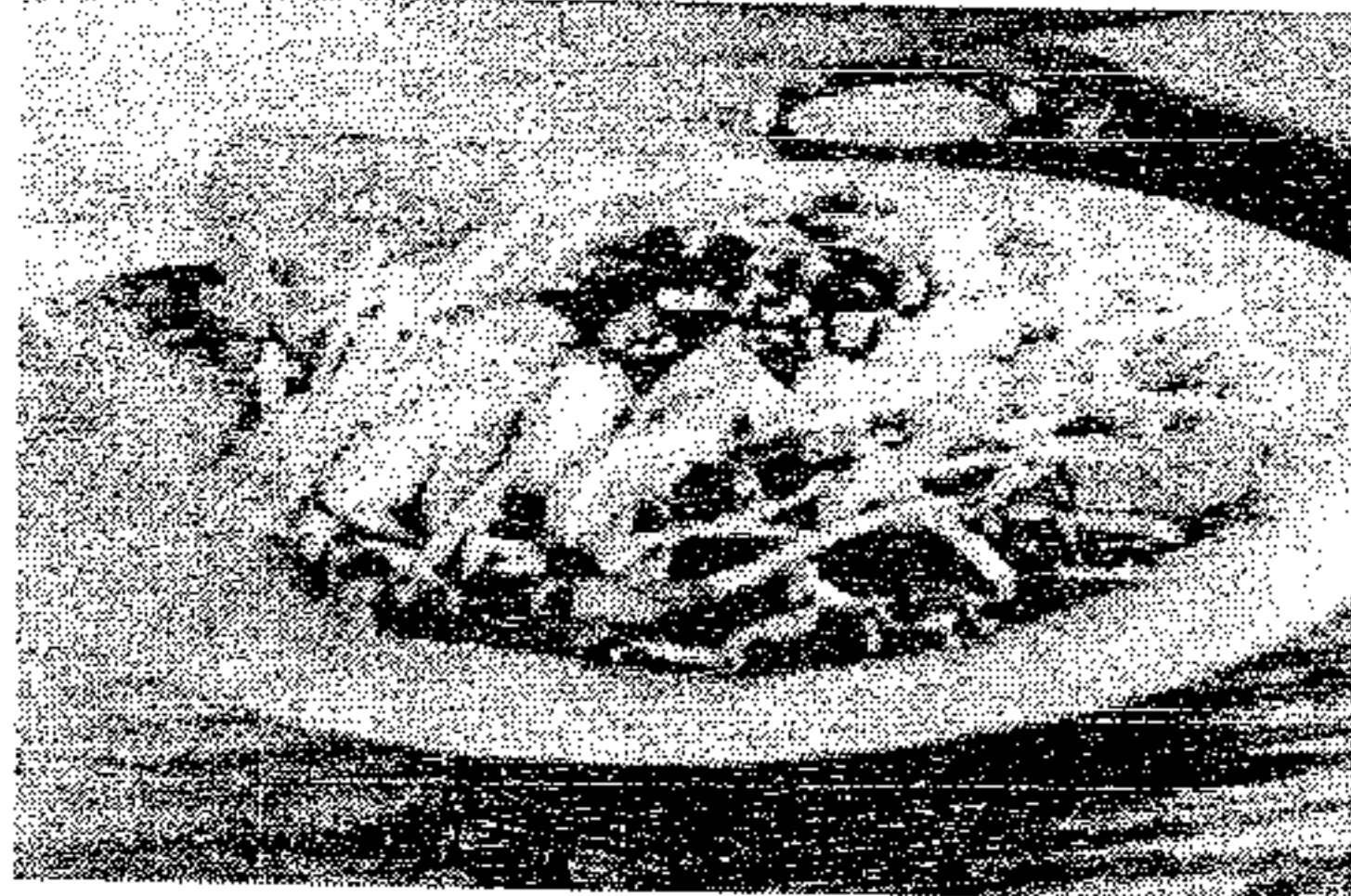

**Man charged after beating woman fresh out of rehab**

A Philadelphia man is accused of beating up a woman who had just gotten out of rehab during a discussion that turned physical Sunday.

Michael Wayne Coker, 38, Sunny Side Road, Philadelphia was charged with domestic violence assault.

According to reports, Deputy Brandon Dixon, LCSO, responded to the One-Stop Market in Philadelphia Sunday to a past domestic. The victim advised
