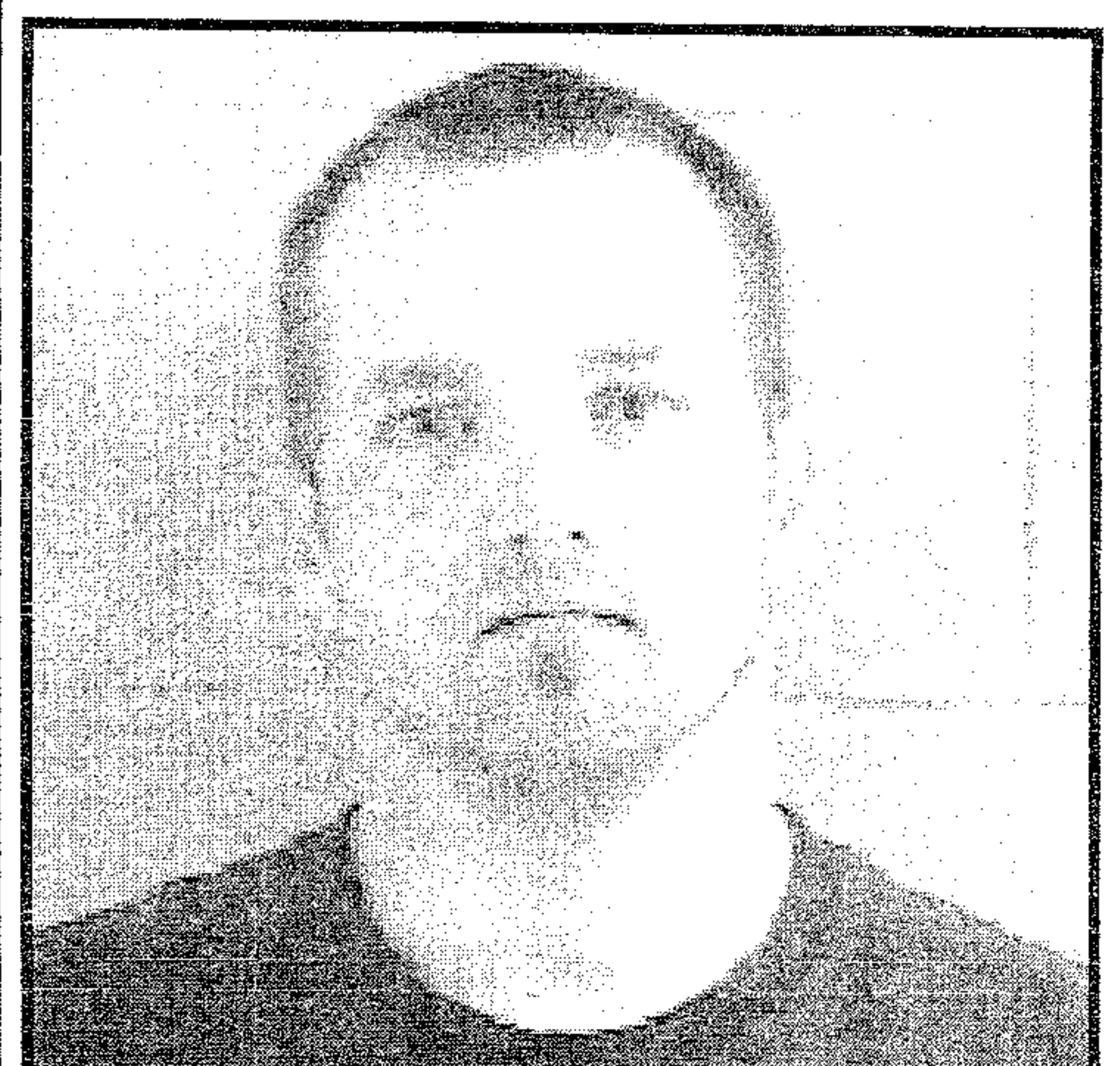

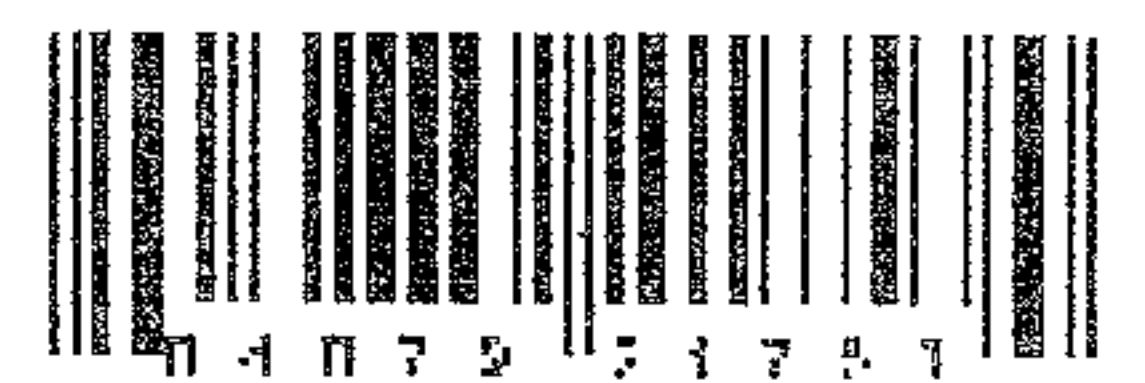

### Johnson

A local woman was jailed after she reportedly sold a man's business equipment that was stored at her residence.

Nancy Mae Johnson, 52, Markwood Road, Loudon was charged with theft over \$1000.

According to an affidavit filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID; on May 17th, 2010, Mr. Gary Cansler reported his business equipment that was stored at Nancy Johnson's Markwood Road residence was missing. Some of the items were computer software, an air compressor, a drill press, a bench grinder and numerous other things.

After further investigation it was discovered Nancy Johnson took the items and sold them to a man on Caldwell Road in Loudon for \$100. Those items included an air compressor, a red air tank, and a drill press.

Mr. Cansler did not give Nancy Johnson permission to take or sell the items. Deputy Michael Wilson, LCSO made the arrest Thursday.

Allmon said he called the man and he said he hadn't seen the trailer in a few weeks and thought someone had already picked it up and taken it back to Mr. Allmon's residence.

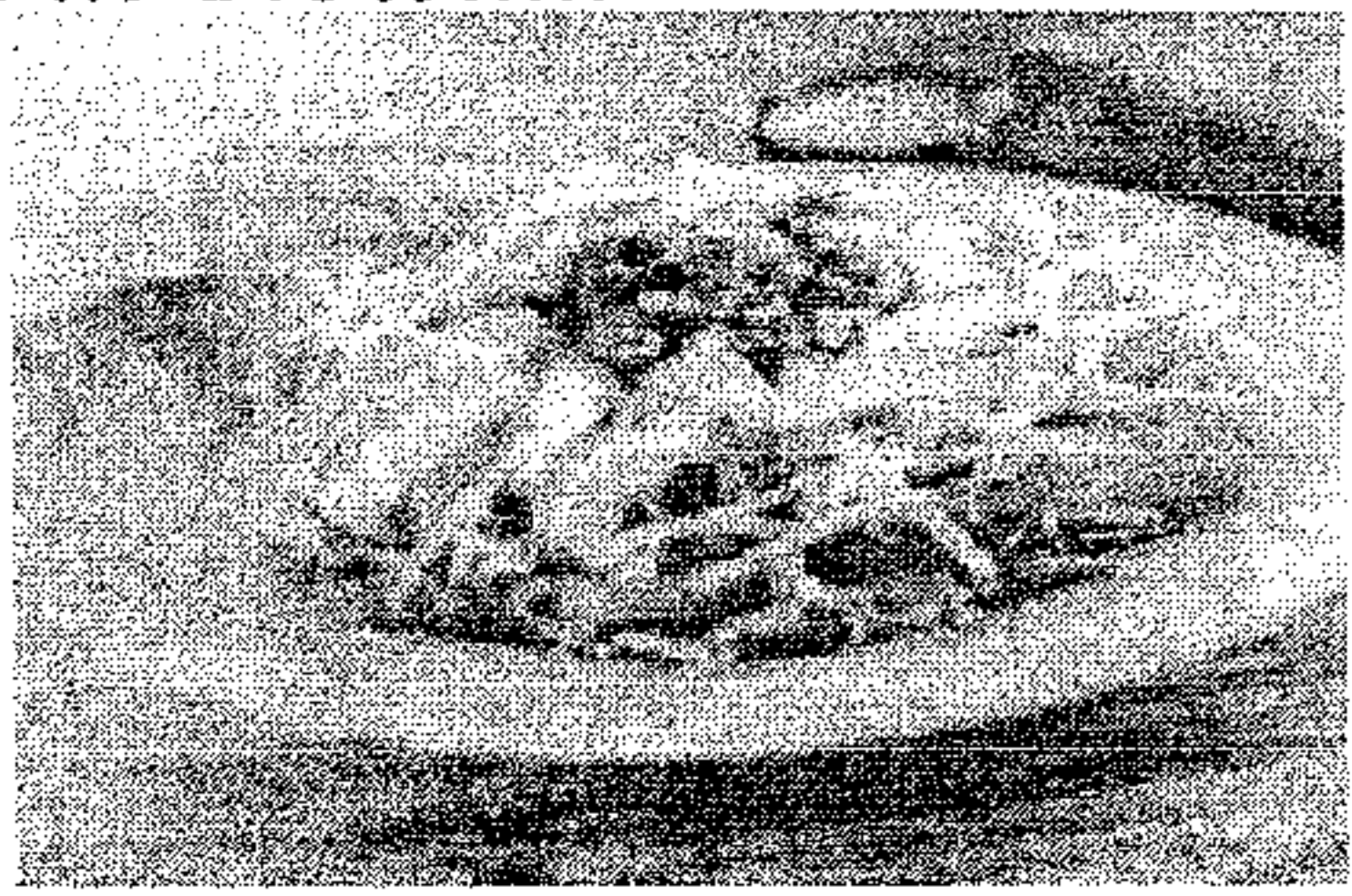
The trailer was described as a 14' black utility trailer valued at \$2000. The investigation is ongoing.
