
From shed to shed, Loudon GrandJury man charged with theft Indictment man charged with theft

A Loudon man is accused of stealing things from a Loudon man's storage shed and storing them in another man's storage building in Lenoir City.

Richard Timothy Veysey, 44, Markwood Road, Loudon was charged with burglary and theft over \$1000.

According to an affidavit filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID; on March 27th, 2010, Mr. Ronald Mettler reported someone had broken into his storage shed and had taken several tools includ-

NASHVILLE --- A canoe accident on the Buffalo River in Wayne County resulted in the lone boating-related fatality over the Memorial Day holiday weekend, the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency is reporting. A 19-year old Mississippi man was a drowning victim when

he became trapped between his canoe and a tree and could not be rescued.

Over the Memorial Day holiday period from Friday, May 28 through Monday, May 31 there were six total reported accidents with three injuries across the state. TWRA officers made 17 boating under the influence (BUI) arrests over the weekend.
