## DTF nabs convicted felon with stolen gun, friend on variety of charges

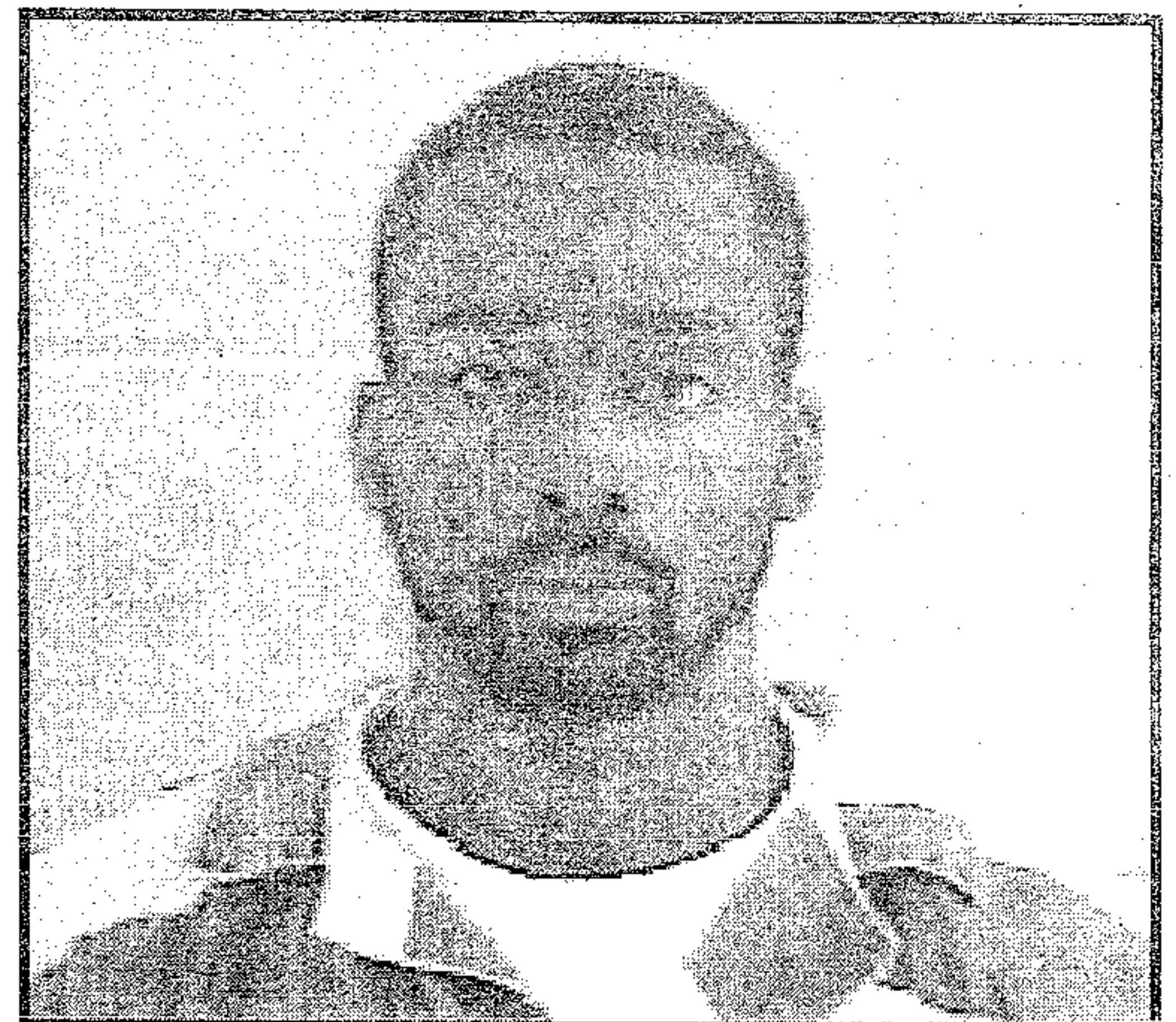

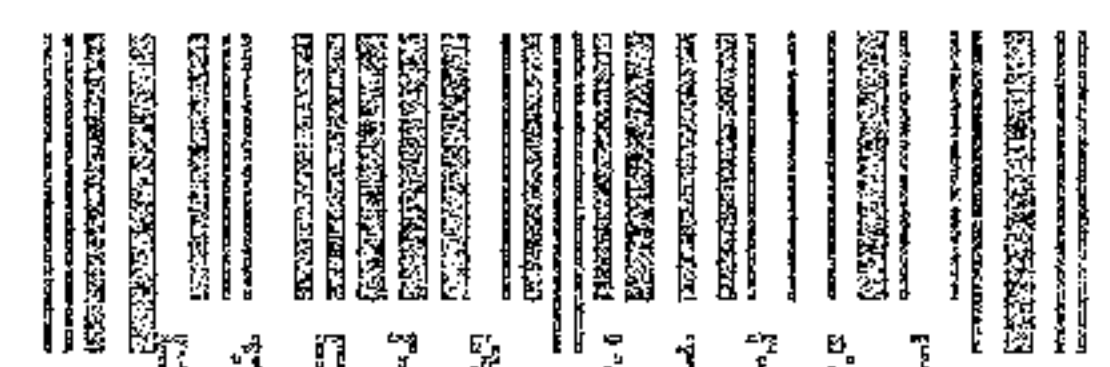

Branson was also cited for no proof of financial responsibility and violating the light law.

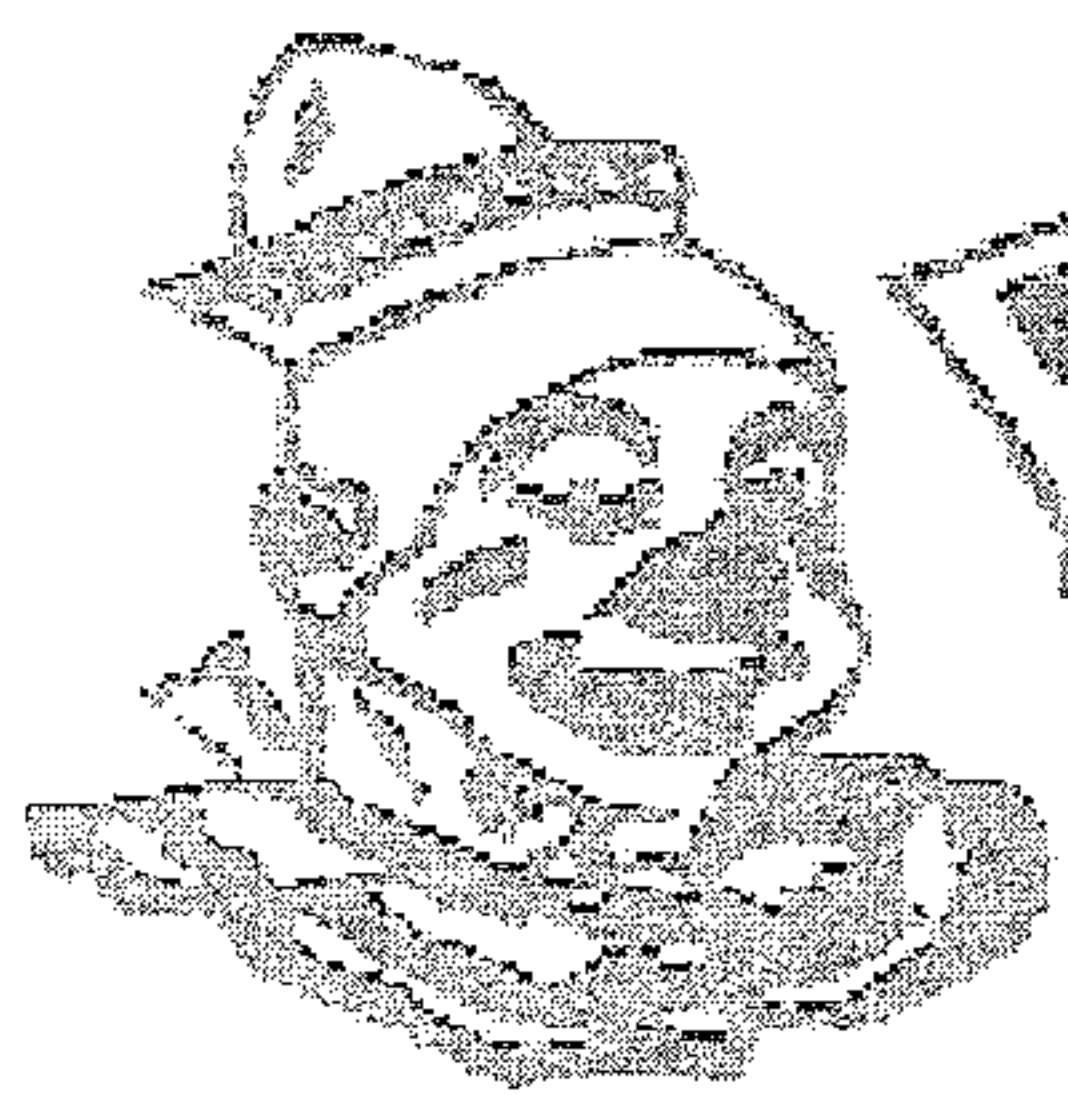
A passenger in the vehicle, Charles D. Cooper, 45, Lawnville Road, Kingston was charged with violation of probation out of Anderson County.

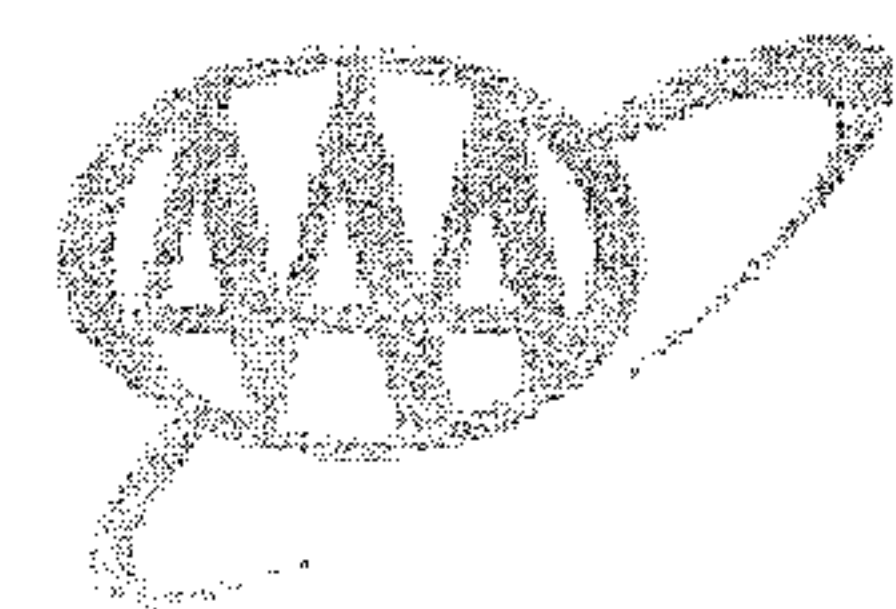

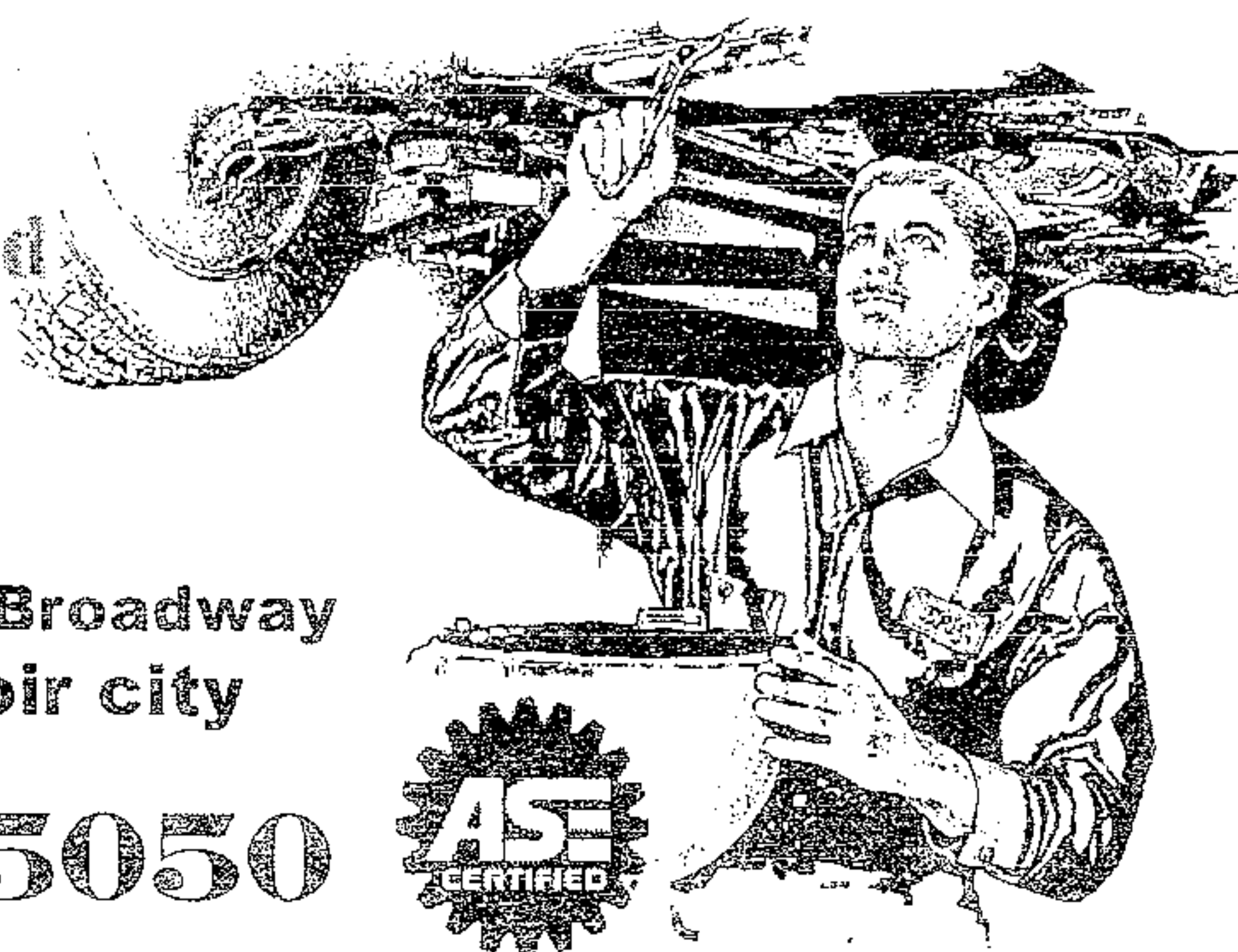

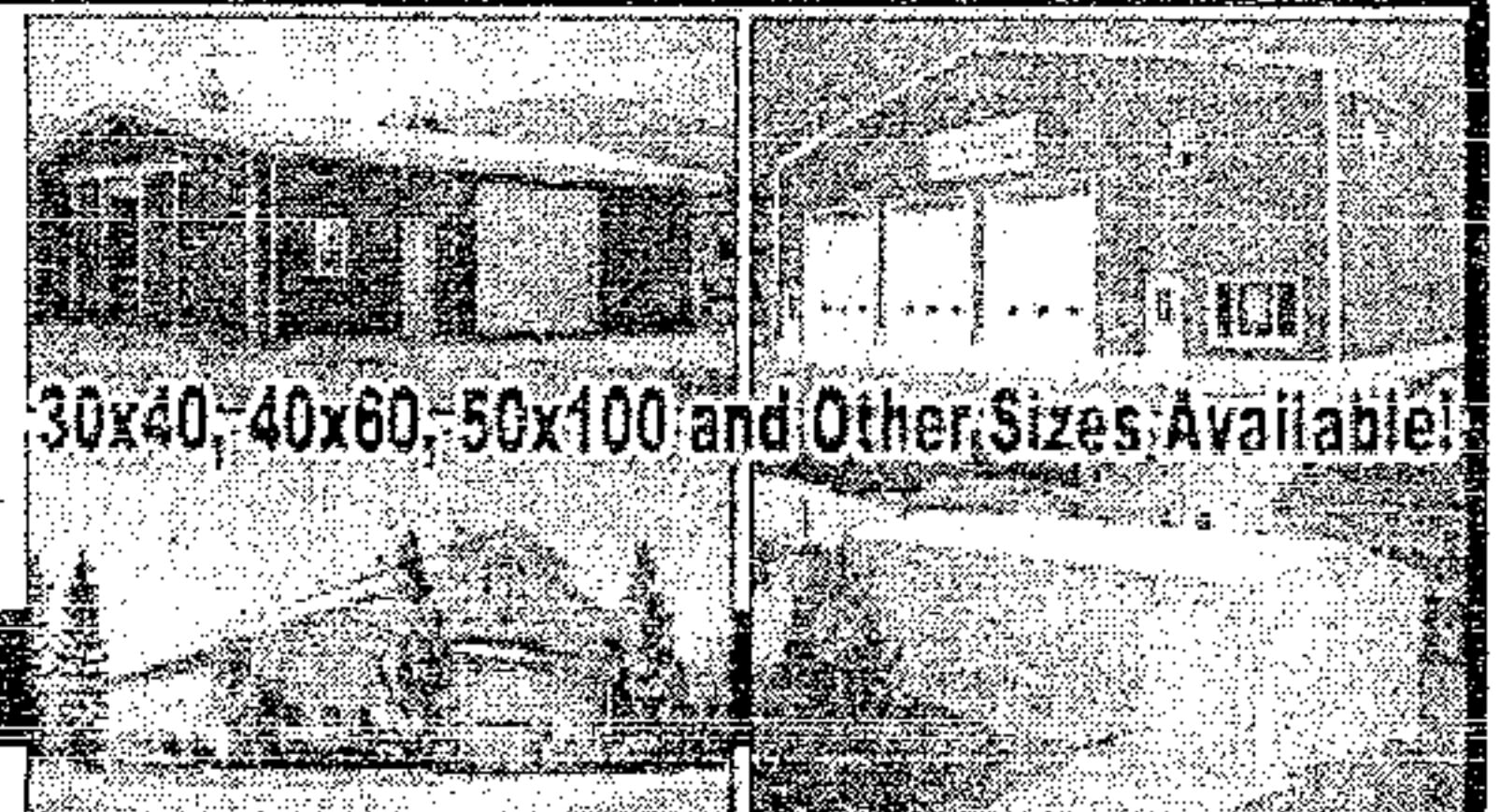

do, Ohio was charged with simple possession of schedule VI (marijuana), possession of drug paraphernalia, and theft of property \$500-\$1000.

According to records, Monday, around 7:00 PM, Agent Jonathan Yates, 9th DTF observed a black Chevy Impala traveling at a high rate of speed on Interstate 75 north near mile marker 68. Agent Yates clocked the vehicle at 78 mph in a 65 mph zone with hand held radar.

The lawman re-

ported he followed the vehicle for approximately two miles with speeds ranging from 70-80 mph. The Impala crossed the left hand lane and made a lane change directly behind a tractor trailer.

Agent Yates stopped the car and identified the driver as Andre A. Yancey. According to the agent's report, he immediately detected the odor of marijuana in the car and told both the driver and his passenger, identified as Anthony Yancey, he smelled the weed. The passenger threw

out a small bag of marijuana. The agent removed the man and handcuffed him for his safety, then deployed his K9, which gave a positive indication to the passenger side door.

An additional search uncovered a loaded .357 Mag Taurus handgun under the passenger seat, a set of scales used to weigh illegal narcotics and approximately 10 grams of a green plant material believed to be marijuana.

The handgun's information was run through NCIC and came back stolen

out of Brazelton PD, Georgia. Both men were arrested. The driver also was cited for speeding.

9th DTF Agents Richard Wood and Jeff Vittatoe were also on scene.



The report states Monday, around 11:20 PM, Sgt. Billy Hall, LCSO received a call in reference to a vehicle that had run off the roadway and was stuck in the median on Interstate 75 around the 81 mm. A search of the vehicle produced a small amount of marijuana

and an unlabeled pill bottle containing seven round white pills later identified as 30 mg codeine pills.

A passenger in the car claimed the marijuana and was issued a citation.

Maurice Piper claimed the seven pills and said they were antibiotics for his teeth. After advising Piper they were pain pills he stated he had been taking them every time his tooth started hurting. Piper could not produce a prescription for the pills.

today Tennessee's unemployment rate for June was 10.1 percent, down three-tenths of a percentage point from the May rate of 10.4 percent. The June 2009 rate was 10.9 percent. The national unemployment rate for June 2010 was 9.5 percent, down 0.2 percentage point from the May rate of 9.7 percent.

"The unemploy-

ment rate in Tennessee fell to 10.1 percent in June as a result of moderate growth in employment," reported Labor Commissioner James Neeley. "Modest gains in areas like construction and leisure/hospitality were offset by job losses in education and census workers."

### Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural Employment May 2010 to June 2010

According to the Business Survey, leisure/hospitality increased by 5,000; mining/construction added 2,500 jobs, and healthcare/social assistance increased by 2,300. Major employment decreases occurred in government (primarily educational services), down by 34,700; administrative/support/waste services declined by 6,100; and private educational services declined by 3,000 jobs.

### Estimated Nonagricultural Employment June 2009 to June 2010

Year-over-year increases occurred in administrative/support/waste services, up by 10,000; federal government gained 6,700; and retail trade was up by 5,100. Year-over-year decreases occurred in transportation/warehousing, down by 6,200; mining/construction lost 5,100; and accommodation/food services decreased by 5,000.

Wilkerson had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person, red watery eyes, slurred speech, and was very unsteady on his feet.

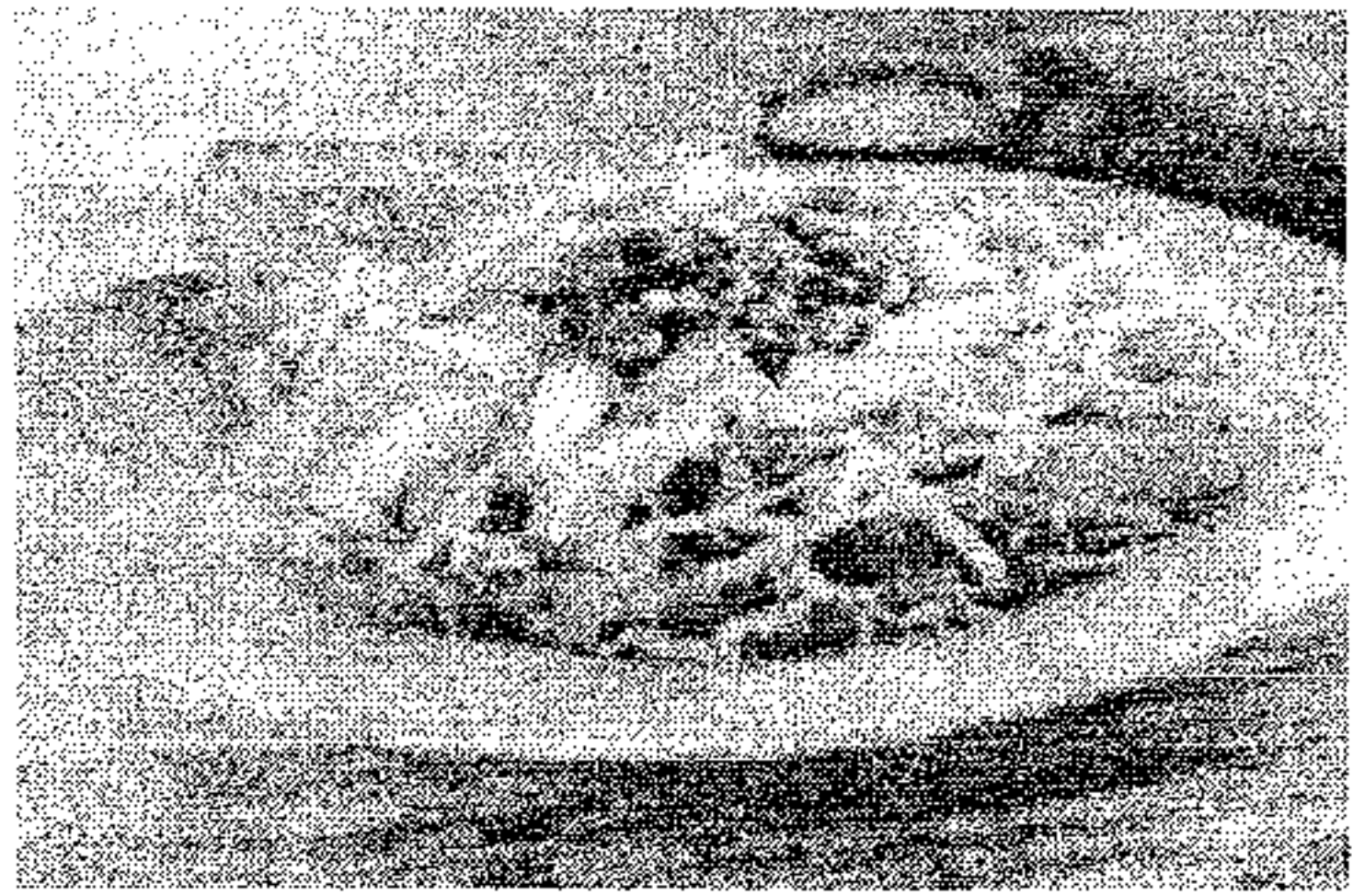
