A Loudon County Sheriff's Office investigator and K-9 unit teamed up during the wee hours of the morning Thursday when twin brothers from Loudon allegedly broke into a Highway 321 bait shop, then confronted the owner and his grandson when they arrived to open up shop while they were loading up merchandise.





The purchase was for \$2452.54 and appeared to have been made online.

Ms. Baxter advised she contacted the fraud department at Best Buy and they have opened an investigation into the transaction.

Lonnie Eugene Moore, 44, Rest Camp Road, Lenoir City was charged with public intoxication.

According to records, around 1:44 AM, Friday, Deputy Jake Keener, LCSO was dispatched to a call in reference to an unwanted intoxicated male at a residence on Rest Camp Road. The com-

plainant identified the man as Lonnie Moore, a neighbor who had been involved in a domestic disturbance with his girlfriend next door.

The complainant advised Moore was trying to start a fight with him, had broken beer bottles in his yard and was armed with broken beer bottles. At 1:48 AM, Moore returned to the residence where his girlfriend was, according to the complainant.

Deputy Keener

arrived on scene at about 2:06 AM, and spoke with the complainant who stated Moore's girlfriend came to his residence with her teenage daughter because Moore was being violent with them. Moore chased them to the complainant's residence and threatened them, then tried to get the complainant to fight him. The man advised Moore broke beer bottles in his yard and poured beer on his house.

The deputy stat-


ed in his report he witnessed broken bottles in the yard and wet spots on the home.

The complainant and another man warned the deputy Moore was dangerous.

While the deputy talked with Mr. Moore he noticed fresh blood on his right hand. Moore stated he had been at a party next door. He was under the influence of an intoxicant.

It was determined Moore went to a residence on Rest Camp Road that he doesn't live at and endangered people and property there and engaged in threatening behavior with his girlfriend and her teenage daughter.

County non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for June 2010, released today, show that the rate decreased in 17 counties, increased in 72 counties and remained the same in

six counties.

Lincoln County registered the state's lowest county unemployment rate at 6.8 percent, up from 6.6 percent in May. Scott County had the state's highest unemployment rate at 20.9 percent, up from 19.6 percent in May,

followed by Marshall County at 16.7 percent, up from 16.6 percent in May.

Knox County had the state's lowest major metropolitan rate of 7.8 percent, up from 7.7 percent in May. Davidson County was 9.1 percent, up from 8.9 percent in May. Hamilton County was 9.1 percent, up from 8.6 in May, and Shelby County was 10.6 percent, up from 10.0 in May.
