
The driver reportedly couldn't find her driver's license and stated her name was Madison Helton.





Telephone calls and test messaging reportedly helped Loudon County Sheriff's officials locate and apprehend a Loudon man who is accused of trying to hide at his residence when the long arm of the showed up to serve warrants on him.

Jeremy Thomas Palmer, 32, Crock Road, Lenoir City was charged with evading arrest.

According to an affidavit; on July 22nd, 2010, Corporal Pete McGinley, LCSO received information that Jeremy Palmer was at his residence on Crock Road. The officer was able to confirm there were outstanding warrants for Mr. Palmer's

arrest. Upon arrival at Palmer's residence, Corporal McGinley saw Palmer's white pick up in the drive way with his wallet and Tennessee ID inside.

A neighbor stated Mr. Palmer was home and the corporal knocked on all the doors and windows, but Mr. Palmer would not answer the door.

Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO-CID came to the scene, then went to the Justice Center to obtain a search warrant for Palmer's residence. While Lt. Upton was gone, Corporal McGinley received several calls stating Mr. Palmer was texting from inside the residence and he was scared and going to hide in the attic.

In the meantime, the

Lt. arrived back at the scene with the search warrant and they entered the residence to find Mr. Palmer in a back bedroom. He was taken into custody.





Oscar Hernandez-Telavera, 28, and Jaime Rendon-Hernandez, 18, West 4th Avenue, Lenoir City were charged with possession of schedule VI (marijuana) for resale, possession of schedule II (cocaine) for resale and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to records, the Loudon

County Sheriff's Office narcotics Division conducted a search warrant Friday at the residence of Oscar T. and Jaime R. Hernandez, which is located on West 4th Avenue.

During the search of the residence, approximately 4.5 grams of cocaine and 171 grams of marijuana were found inside the home. Also found in the residence was a box of plastic bags

used to package the illegal drugs.

Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO-ND made the arrests. Deputy Marty Stanley was also on scene.

A second search across town resulted in the arrest of Epigmenio Rendon-Hernandez, 23, of Hickory Creek road, Lenoir City, who was charged with possession of schedule VI (marijuana) for resale, possession of schedule II (cocaine) for resale, possession of drug paraphernalia, and two counts of theft over \$500.

Records indicate LCSO-ND officers conducted a search warrant at the residence of Epigmenio R. Hernandez, which is located on Hickory Creek Road and during the search, approximately 37 grams of cocaine and 124.5 grams of marijuana

Also found during the search were digital scales with cocaine and marijuana residue on them, and boxes of plastic bags, both of which are used to weigh, package and distribute illegal drugs.
