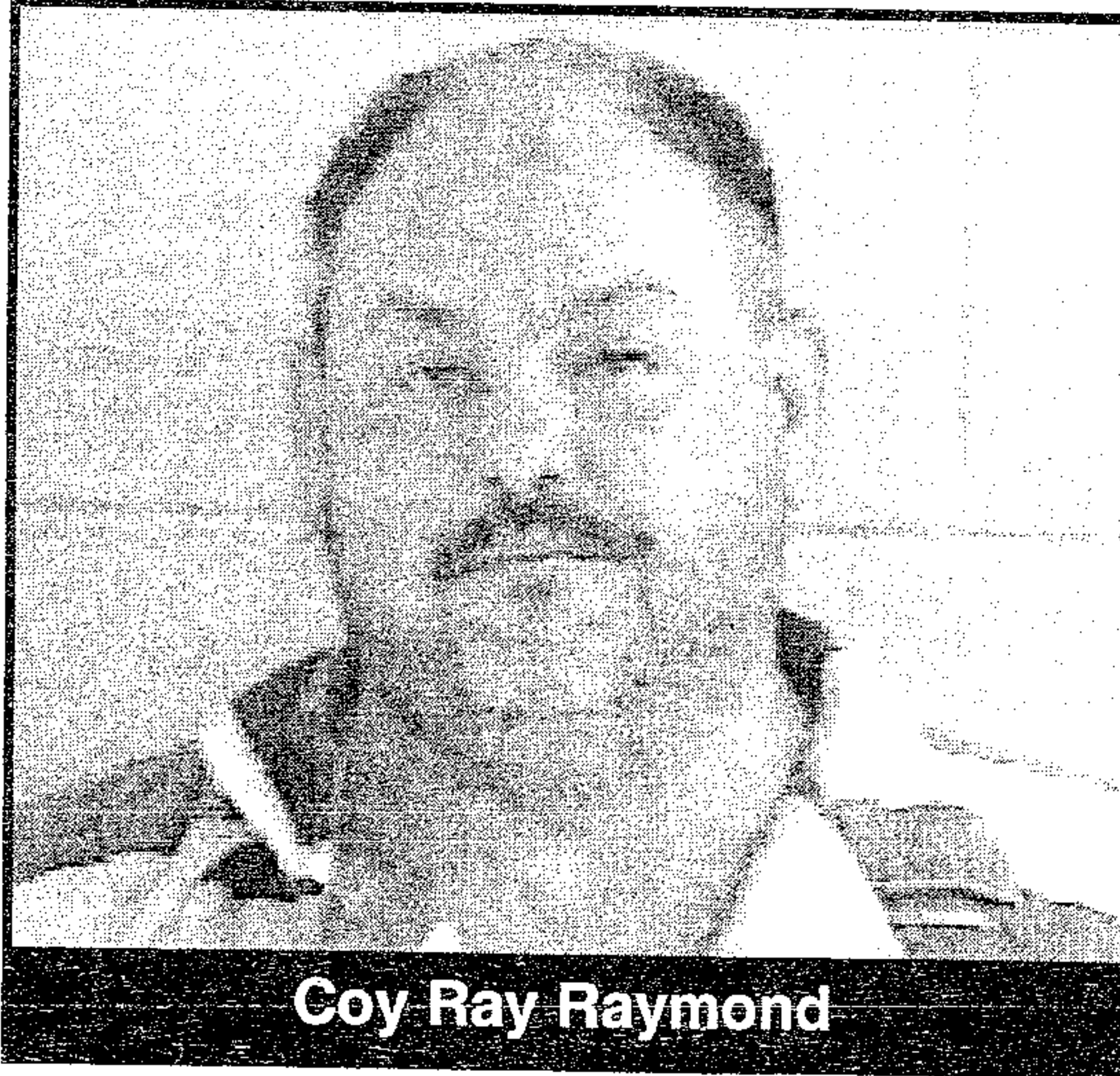
Deputy charges two area men after alleged showdown with guns

Coy Ray Raymond, 40, Elm Avenue, Rockwood, was charged Saturday with theft over \$500 and possession of a firearm while intoxicated.

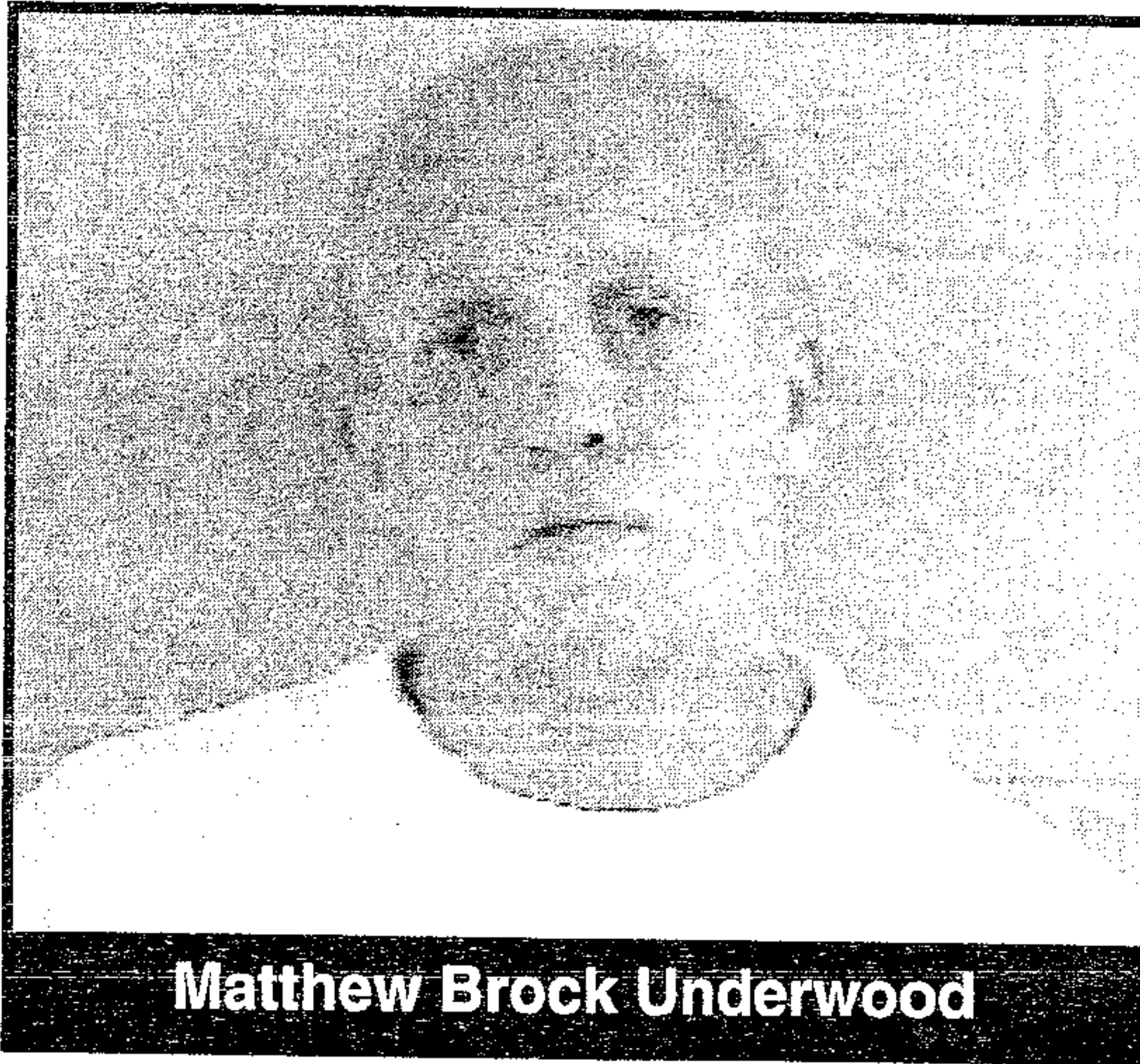
Loudon teen accused of taking friends on auto burglary spree

A Loudon teen is accused of taking two younger friends with him to break into vehicles parked on his street during the wee hours of the morning July 23.

Matthew Brock Underwood, 18, Vale street, Loudon, was charged with two counts of burglary of an auto, two counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, and two counts of theft under \$500.

According to affidavits filed by Sgt. Brian Jenkins, LPD; on Friday, July 23rd, 2010, around 4:00 AM, Matthew Brock Underwood entered a red Ford Ranger without the owner's consent or knowledge while

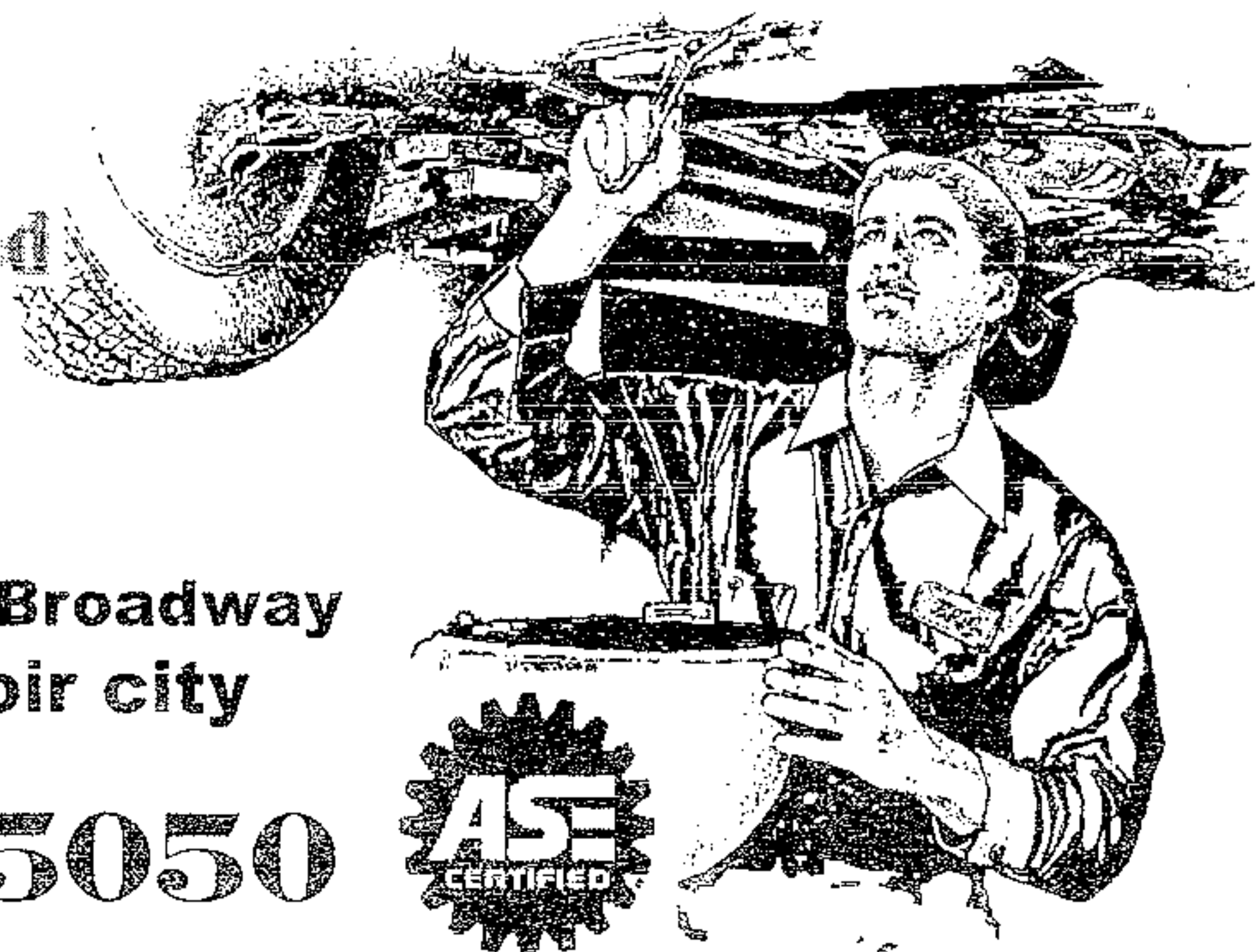

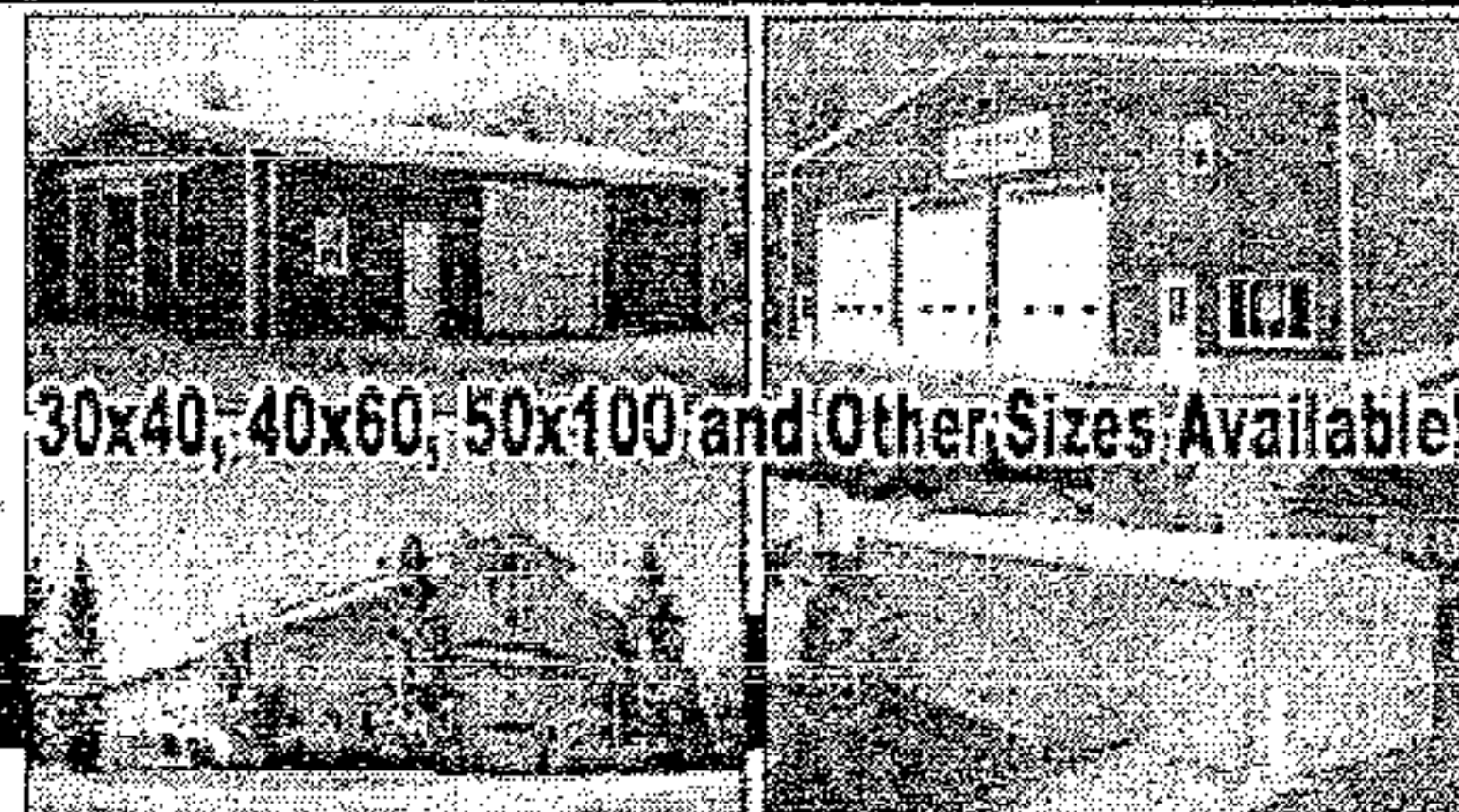

Arwood

Dennis Randall Arwood, 49, Sunrise Apartments, Philadelphia was charged with public intoxication and a warrant out of Roane County for public intoxication.

The report states around 10:21 PM, Friday, Deputy J.C. Schultz, LCSO answered a call in reference to a person walking in the middle of Highway 11 at Sweetwater Valley Farms and upon arriving in the area found Dennis Randall Arwood.

The officer reported Mr. Arwood was walking down the center line of Highway 11 and traffic was backed up due to him being in the road. Arwood had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person and advised he'd drank 12 beers and 2 shots of tequila and wanted to walk to Loudon.

Mr. Arwood fell several times and Deputy Schultz placed him under arrest for PI. A check through NCIC revealed Mr. Arwood had a warrant out of Roane County for the same charge.

Kalinin

1st offense.

According to records, Deputy Bobby Hamilton, LCSO responded to Interstate 75 South in reference to a reported drunk driver in a green Chrysler PT Cruiser. The deputy fell in behind the vehicle and witnessed it cross the fog line and rumble strip four times. The driver, later identified as Angela M. Kalinin almost wrecked.

The deputy reported after he stopped the vehicle, Ms. Kalinin was reaching between the seats and into the back seat area as he approached. Ms. Kalinin appeared to be very lethargic and had slurred speech and glassy eyes.

Kalinin advised she was taking medicine for seizures and sometimes, ascomp with codeine for headaches. She could not follow instruction or complete sobriety tasks.

Ms. Kalinin was very unsteady on her feet and the deputy had to grab her by the arms to keep her from falling while she tried to do sobriety tasks. She was placed under arrest and while inventorying the ve-

hicle, Deputy Hamilton found a pill bottle containing ascomp

with codeine in it. The bottle and a loose pill were found laying

in the rear floor area where Ms. Kalinin had been reaching.

advised the armed man already left the store, traveling on Highway 321 towards Lenoir City, in a black Dodge Avenger with the complainant following right behind him.

Deputy Rusty Bowman stopped the vehicle at Highway 11 and advised Deputy Branam he saw a black semi automatic pistol laying in the passenger side floorboard.

The passenger was Coy Ray Raymond, who stated he and his brother-in-law had been in a verbal altercation at JB's store and they left. Mr. Raymond also stated he had the pistol in his back pocket.

Records indicate there was also a Smith & Wesson .357 Magnum revolver in plain view inside the vehicle. Mr. Raymond claimed ownership of both weapons.

Both weapons were ran through NCIC and one of them, a Sig Sauer .45 automatic P220, came back stolen out of Knox County on November 4th, 2008. Both weapons were confiscated for evidence.

Further investigation revealed Mr. Raymond and the complainant both met at JB's with the intent to fight each other. The complainant advised while in the verbal confrontation, Mr. Raymond reached for his back pocket and cocked a

weapon, but did not pull it out.

Mr. Raymond had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person, red watery eyes and reportedly admitted to consuming alcoholic beverages earlier.

The driver of the vehicle, Craig Alen Brown, 33, of 4th Street, Kingston was charged with DUI.

Mr. Brown had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath and person, red bloodshot eyes and slurred speech. He was very unsteady on his feet and performed very

poorly on field sobriety tasks.

Mr. Brown submit-

ted to a chemical test at Fort Loudoun ER, prior to going to jail.
