



Quarantine

August. These counties are now under an emergency quarantine. Adjacent counties to the quarantined areas are also restricted for movement of walnut products and hardwood firewood. These counties include Campbell, Claiborne, Jefferson, Grainger, Loudon, Montoc, Motgan, Roane, Scott and Sevier counties.

"We will continue to survey our forests and work to help slow the spread of the disease." said TDA Plant Certification Administrator Gray Haun. "We are working with stakeholders to help educate citizens on the

TCD is a progressive disease that kills a tree within two to three years after initial symptoms are detected. The disease-causing fungus, Geosmithia, is transmitted by a small twig beetle. Branches and trunk tissue are killed by multiple infections of the fungus, as the beetles carry the fungus from one area to the next.

TDA plant inspectors and foresters will continue to conduct a thorough survey of trees in these areas to assess the extent of the infestation and to see if more areas need to be quarantined.

The Tennessee Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry estimates that 1.38 million black walnut trees in Tennessee's urban areas are potentially at risk from TCD.

The risk represents an estimated value loss

of \$1.37 billion. There are an estimated 26 million black walnut trees on Tennessee public and private timberland potentially valued as high as \$1.47 billion.

TDA officials urge area residents and visitors to help prevent the spread of TCD:

Don't transport fire-wood, even within Ten-nessee. Don't bring fire-wood along for camping trips. Buy the wood you need from a local source. Don't bring wood home

with you.

· Don't buy or move firewood from outside the state. If someone comes to your door selling firewood, ask them about the source, and don't buy wood from outside the state.

Watch for signs of infestation in your black walnut trees. If you suspect your black walnut tree could be infested with TCD, visit www. TN.gov/agriculture/tcd-

for an online symptoms checklist and report form or call TDA's Regulatory Services Division at 1-800-628-2631.



same hunt code more than once. An applicant can only apply once per year for these areas.

Priority Drawing System: TWRA's Priority Drawing System gives priority points to hunters based on the number of years they have participated without being drawn for a hunt. All applications will be drawn with zero priority points this year. Drawn applicants will remain at zero and unsuccessful applicants will receive

one priority point for next year's drawing.

Drawing Procedures: An applicant is randomly selected by the computer. The hunt choices are reviewed in the order they are listed on the application until a choice with a vacancy remaining is found or the application runs out of choices.

 Successful applicants must possess all appropriate licenses, permits and a confirmation number issued by TWRA to hunt. Hunting guests must also possess all appropriate licenses and permits.

e Reservations are nontransferable. Any person violating this rule and regulation is subject to having his/herreservation and/or hunting privileges revoked and may be subject to prosecution.

The successful applicant can bring three additional hunters (guests) of his choice each day of the hunt. The number of hunters in a blind may not exceed four, one of which must be the successful applicant.

o TWRA will send a packet of information to the successful applicant,

which will include detail maps and GPS coordinates, rules and regulations for the hunt, and a notice of intention post card.

 The notice of intention may be completed by return mail, phone or email request. Reply must be received two weeks prior to the first day of the permitees' hunt.

Hunts which are not reserved with the notice of intention card will be considered vacant. The WMA staff will notify the general public of the vacant sites using the TWRA website, WMA answer machine, or email request.

 A local hand-held drawing will occur for vacant sites to be filled at the management areas.

 For Bogota and the Thorny Cypress WMA, the hand held drawing will be each Monday at 6 p.m. before the hunt on Friday at the new TWRA Dyersburg Workbase. The location is 355 Men-
