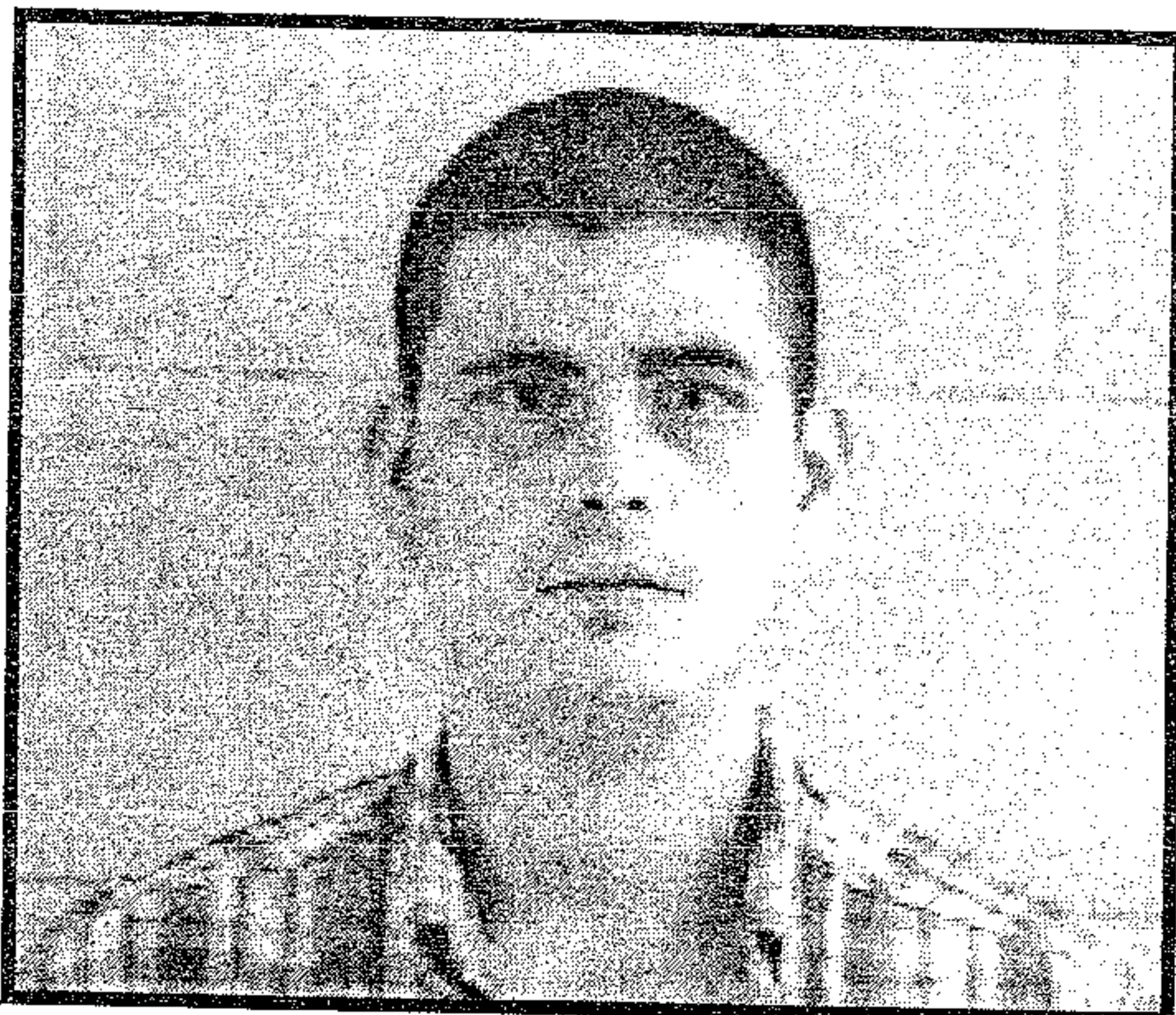
Agent Sanchez busts convicted sex offender

Man turns self in after warrants issued

When 9th DTF Agent John Sanchez tracked down information in Tennessee and Georgia on a convicted sex offender, he swore out a warrant upon learning the man had failed to register in both states. The offender later turned himself in to face the charge and two others associated with his crime and punishment.

fender registry, failure to appear and violation of community supervision.

According to an affidavit, filed by Agent John Sanchez, 9th Drug Task Force; a check of the sexual offender registry showed that David E. Coronado is a violent sexual offender who is required to report on a quarterly basis with the Tennessee Board of Probation and Parole in order to comply with TCA 40-39-208 because of a conviction of aggravated sexual battery on a child younger

than 13 years of age, on or about August 9th, 2003, in Loudon County Tennessee.

Coronado's last listed address is 110 Christian Street, Philadelphia, Tennessee. On August 11th, 2010, Coronado failed to show up at the Loudon County General Sessions Court on a prior charge of violation of the sex offender registry and his whereabouts were.

A check with Carolyn Brewer, BOPP supervising Coronado, showed he had not checked in with her as

of August 16th, 2010. A check with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, SOR POC, showed Coronado had not registered as a sex offender with the state of Georgia.

Coronado knowingly failed to satisfy the reporting requirements of TCA 40-39-208.

Deputy Brian Smith, LCSO responded to a Spring Street residence where Coronado waited to turn himself in on the three warrants. He

was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

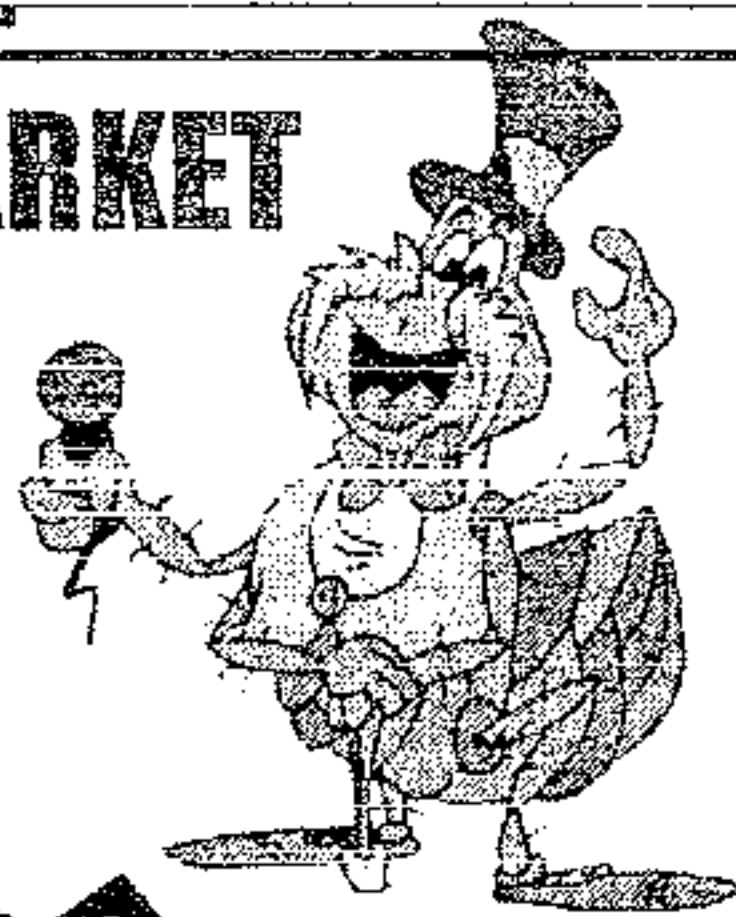

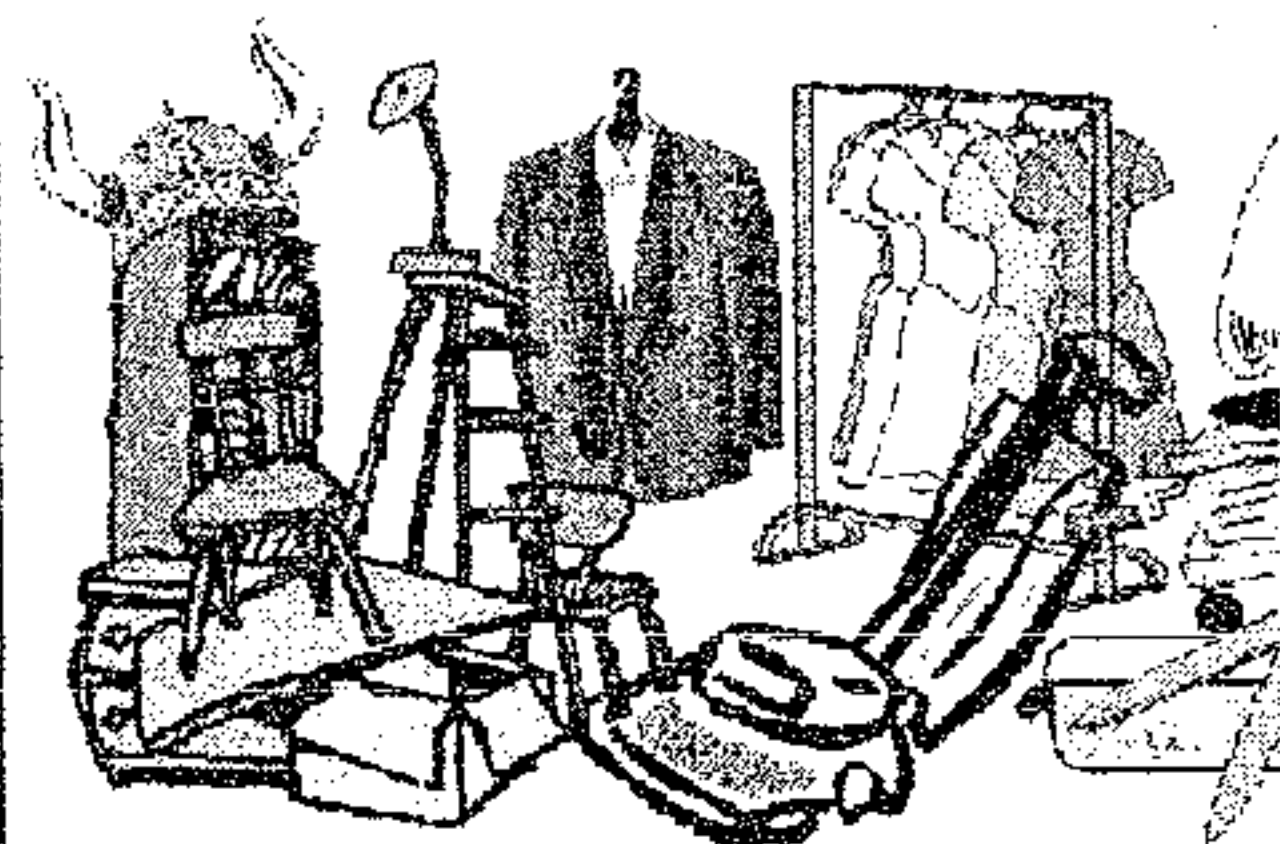

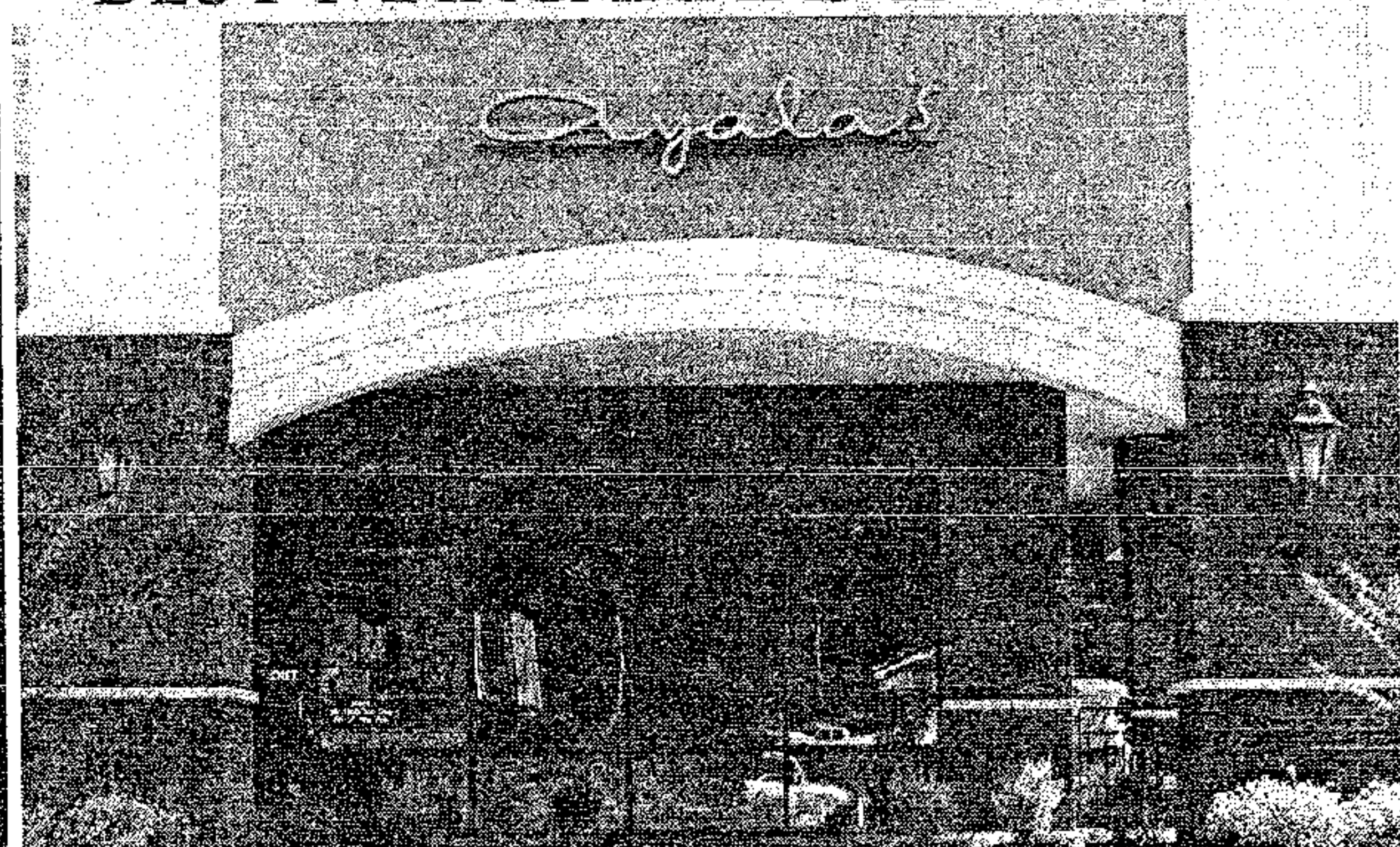

According to reports, Monday, around 8:05 PM, Loudon City Police Department received a call in reference to a possible intoxicated driver in a red Ford F-150 at the Marathon on Highway 11. Upon

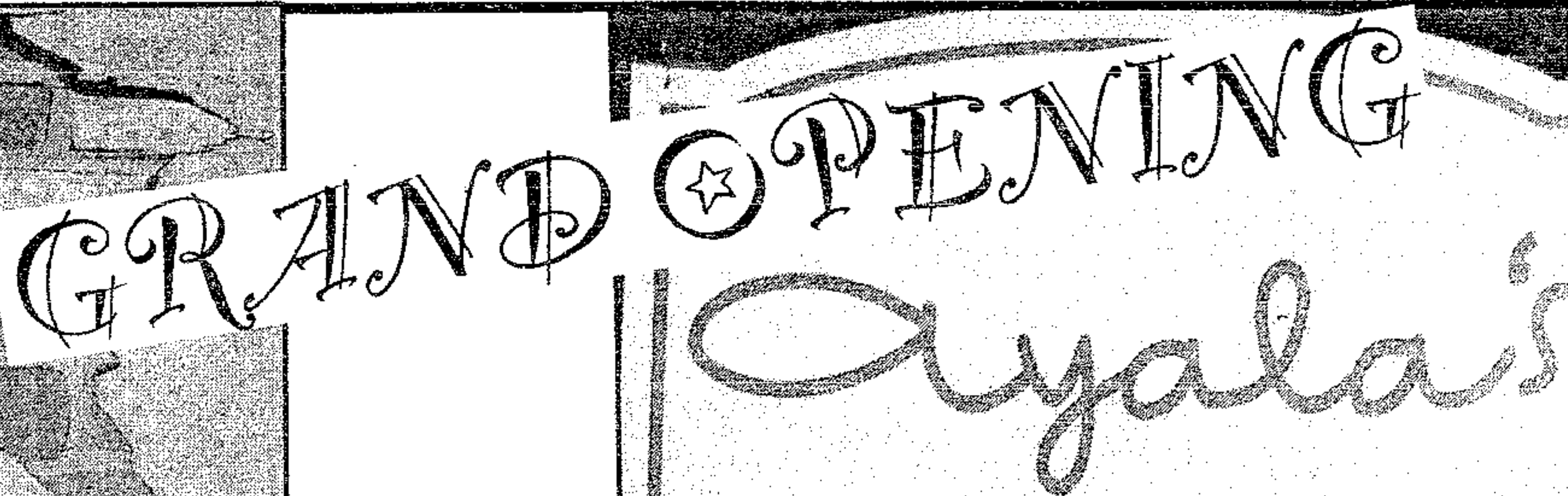
