

9th DTF nabs Kentuckians with pills for resale

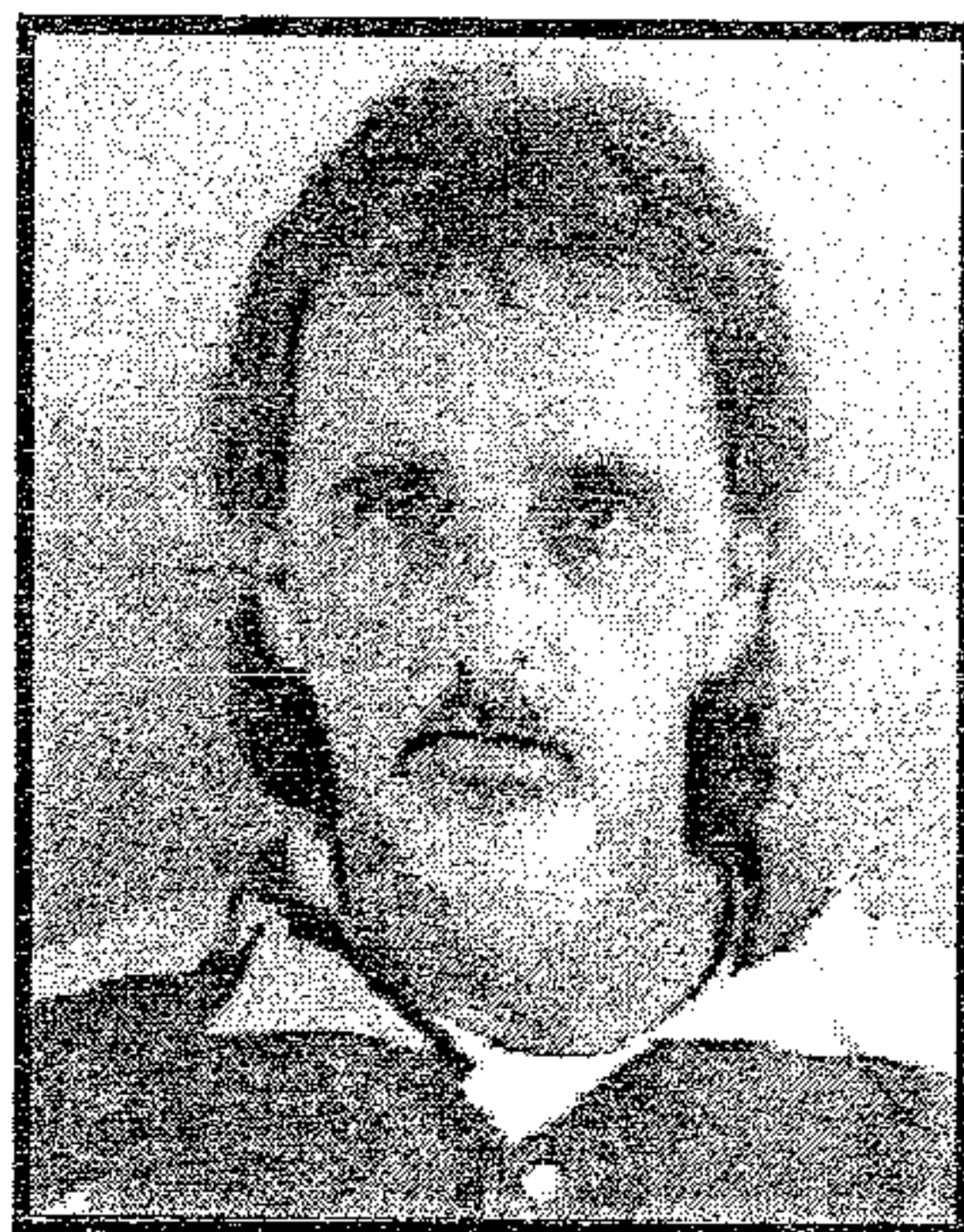
9th DTF Agents stopped a vehicle for erratic driving and during a field investigation found over 100 un-prescribed pills belonging to two Kentucky residents.



around 5:00 am, and when he got back home, he walked in the side door and noticed ashes on the counter. He made his way to the master bedroom and bathroom and when he came out of the bathroom he noticed a cigarette burn in the carpet.

Giles said he then spotted numerous drawers in the house were open and had been gone through. A camper outside of the residence and an out-building had been gone through as well.

The deputy contacted Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO-CID to advise him of the

situation and Investigator Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID responded to process the scene.

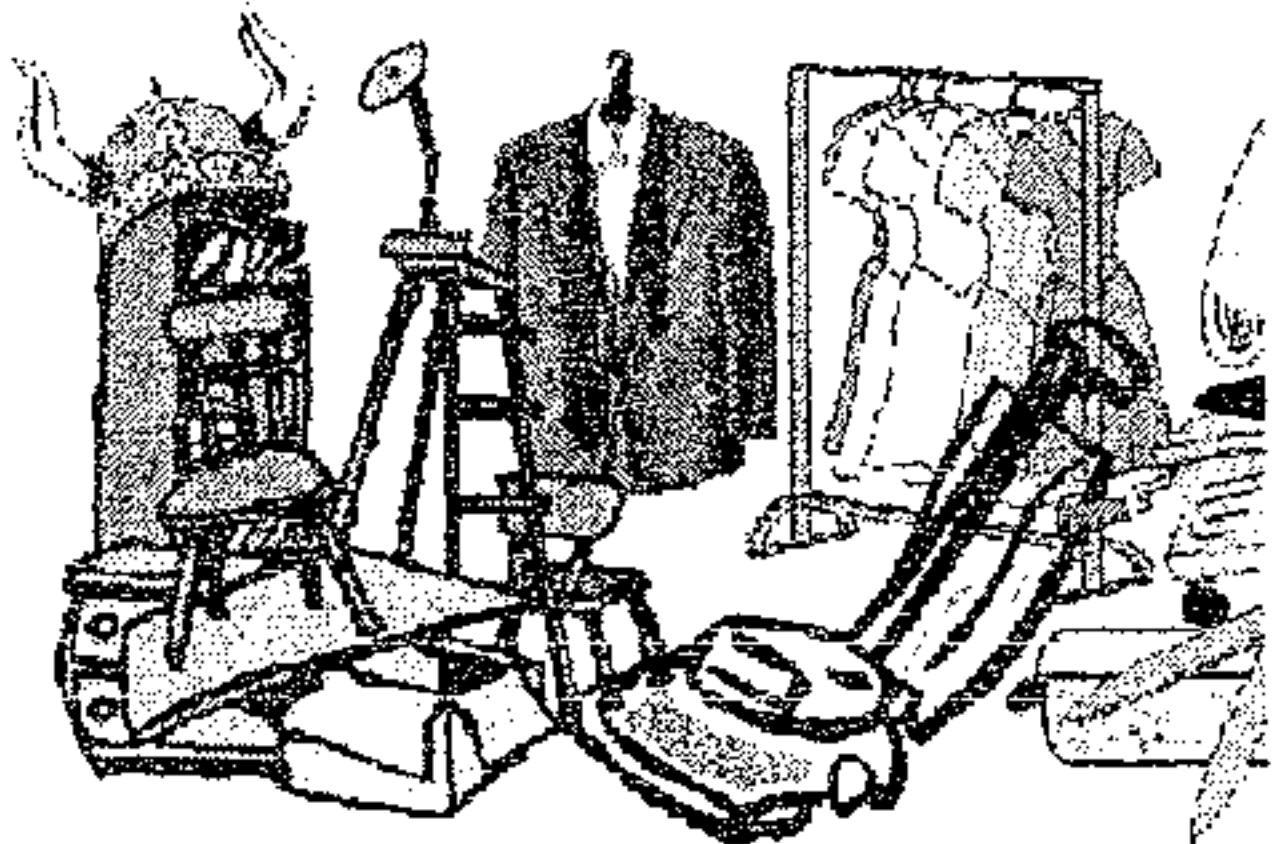

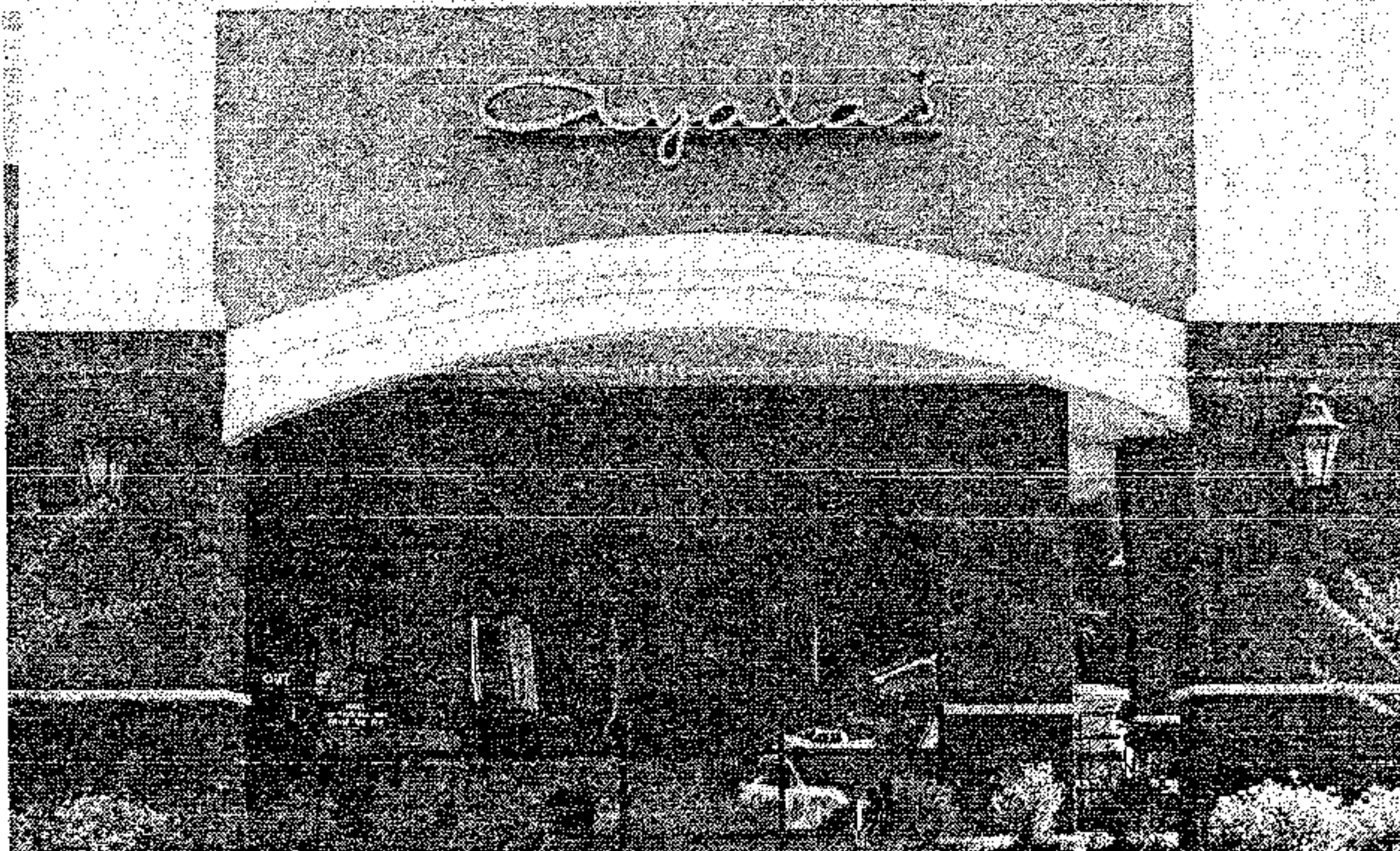

Trooper Eric Miller, THP initiated his blue lights and siren in an attempt to stop Ellison's white Plymouth Acclaim. resale, and possession of schedule II (oxycodone 15 mg) for resale.

According to affidavits, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th Drug Task Force observed a white Chevy exit Interstate 75 onto Highway 72 in Loudon. While the agent was watching the vehicle, he witnessed it fail to maintain it's lane as well as come to a complete stop two separate times in the middle of the roadway, impeding traffic. Agent DeBoer stopped the car at the Shell Station on

Highway 72, for failure to maintain it's lane and erratic driving. He identified the occupants and in speaking with them he received verbal consent to search from all four, including the driver and owner of the vehicle.

The lawman reported he recovered two bottles containing numerous pills, which were separated in different packages. The packages contained 42 pills believed to be clonazapen, three pills believed to be xanax, 11 1/2 pills believed to be 15 mg

oxycodone, and 2 pills believed to be 30 mg oxycodone. The pills were shoved into the back seat occupied by Matthew May. A after being read his Miranda Warning Mr. May advised Agent DeBoer he did not have a prescription for any of the pills.

The driver and owner of the vehicle, Robert D. Samples, 42, Evansdale Drive, Richmond Kentucky was charged with possession of schedule IV (xanax), possession of schedule II (oxycotin 30 mg) Possession of

schedule II (oxycodone 30 mg) and possession of schedule II (oxycodone 15 mg).

During the search of the vehicle, Agent DeBoer recovered a metal container containing several pills identified as 30 mg oxycotin, 15 mg oxycodone, 30 mg oxycodone and xanax.

Mr. Samples advised the agent, after being informed of his Miranda Warning, the container and pills were his.

Agent Jeff Vittatoc, 9th Drug Task Force was also on scene.
