Johnson

William Brian Johnson, 48, Hardin Cemetery Court, Friendsville, was charged Sunday with DUI 1st offense and violation of implied consent.

The report states, Deputy Rick Wiggins, LCSO observed a maroon Buick traveling at a high rate of speed on Highway 411 and noted it was doing 80 mph in a 50 mph zone. Deputy Wiggins initiated his emergency equipment in an attempt to stop the vehicle. The driver stopped approximately 2 miles later.

The Buick had one occupant, William Brian Johnson. Mr. Johnson was confused and disoriented. He had very slurred speech and advised the deputy he had a medical emergency with a family member. He said his grandmother died. Deputy Wiggins asked Mr. Johnson for further information on the reason for the high rate of speed. Johnson then said his sister was dying. His speech was still slurred and some words were unrecognizable.

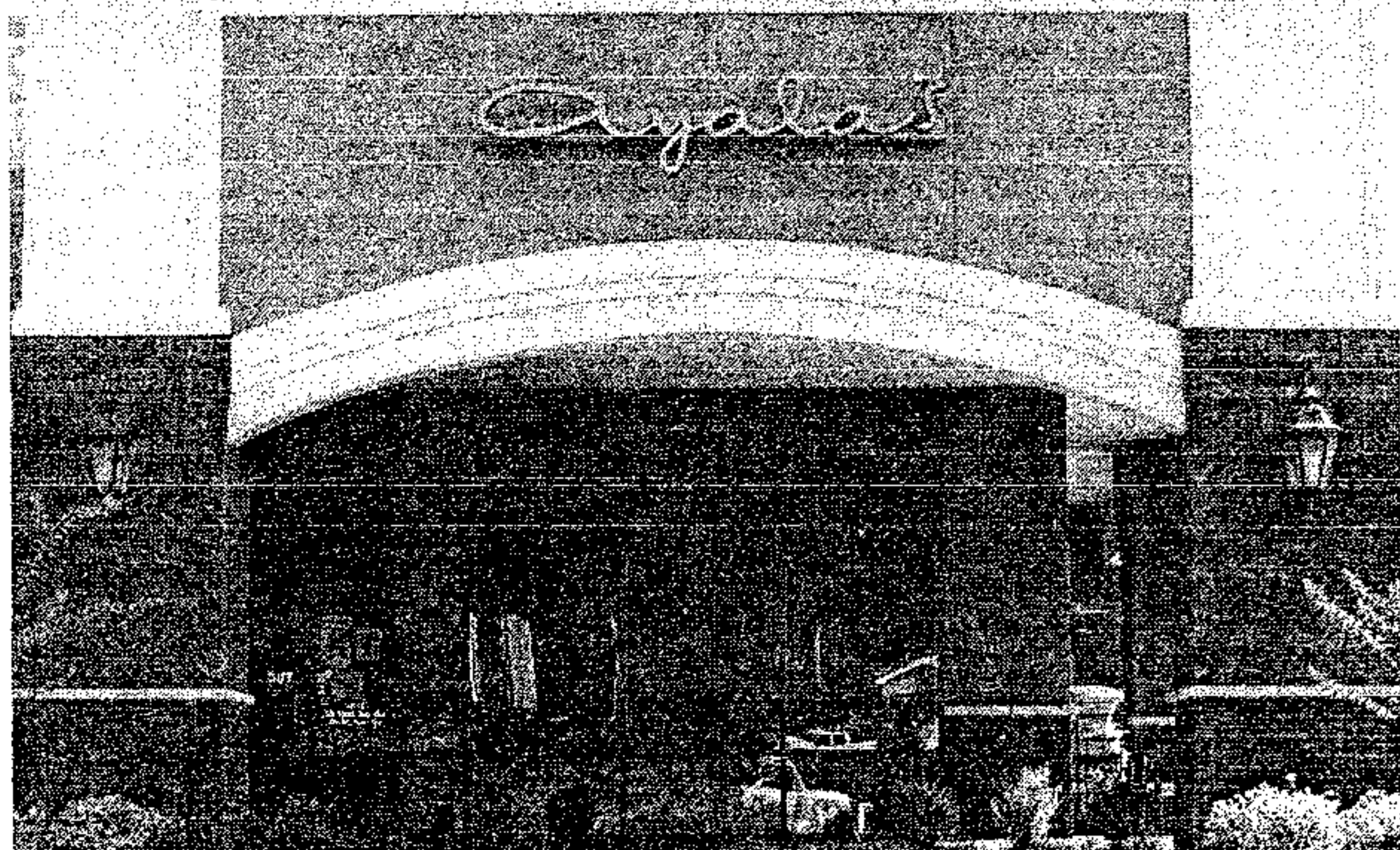
The lawman asked Mr. Johnson to remain in the car and keep his hands in plain site while he checked his license status. At that time Johnson began to lean from his vehicle, placing his hands on the ground and yelling something about Jimmy Hendrix. When Blount County arrived as back up, the deputy asked Mr. Johnson to exit the vehicle.

Johnson was visibly unsteady on his feet and was reluctant to obey commands. Deputy Wiggins asked him if he had any medical condition that would hinder his ability to perform field sobriety tasks and Johnson said his leg had been removed and reattached. After further questioning he advised he couldn't do any of the tasks because he was an idiot.

Mr. Johnson was very uncooperative and belligerent as he was being questioned. The deputy noted in his report he detected a very strong odor of an alcoholic beverage and based on his observation and Mr. Johnson's demeanor, he placed Johnson under arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol and or drugs.

Once at the jail, Mr. Johnson was read his implied consent and refused to submit to a breath test

officers the driver of a vehicle had pointed a gun at him on the interstate. Not only did the accused driver pass by the motorist and officer, upon being pointed out and stopped, a gun was on the dash, and numerous pills were located in the vehicle.

Robert Christopher Trautwein, 27, Route 1, Wayne, West Virginia, was charged Sunday with unlawful possession of a weapon, possession of legend drug without prescription, possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of schedule II.

According to reports, while traveling south on Interstate 75, Deputy Brian Smith, LCSO was flagged down by a man who stated the driver of a black truck pointed a gun at him while he was passing

the vehicle on the interstate. While speaking to the victim, a black Ford Ranger passed by and the victim pointed at it and said that was the truck.

Deputy Smith stopped the vehicle in question at the 68 mile marker and while approaching it, he observed in plain view, a small black Glock 9 mm handgun on the dash board. He secured the weapon for the safety of officers and the public.

The driver, Mr. Trautwein, stated he raised the weapon after a red pickup truck almost hit him.

Deputy Smith asked for and received verbal consent to search the truck and while searching found within arms reach of the driver, one loaded magazine on the floor of the vehicle near the driver's seat,

one 9mm round in the driver's seat and one loaded magazine in the center console. He also found a silver cylinder container containing six oddly shaped pills believed to be trazodone in the glove box.

One small white ceramic bowl with a small white ceramic rod, commonly used for crushing pills, a clear blue plastic device used for cutting pills, a piece of a red straw, two empty ink pen bodies commonly used for ingesting narcotics, a razor blade and two pieces of a compression clamp commonly used for crushing pills were found in Mr. Trautwein's black bag. Also discovered in Deputy Branam's patrol vehicle where Trautwein was sitting were 3 1/2 small light blue round pills believed to be oxyco-

done hydrochloride.

Zachariah Lee Stephens, 29, Route 2, Wayne, West Virginia was charged with possession of legend drug x 2.

After receiving verbal consent to search Mr. Trautwein's truck, Deputy Smith searched the bags in the bed of the pickup and discovered two pill bottles in Mr. Stephens's bag. They contained two medications that were

not the medication named on the bottle. There was 17 pills believed to be tramadol in a bottle marked tizanidine and 29 capsules believed to be gabapentin in a bottle marked cyclobenzaprine.

Both men were transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Tour

(Loudon, TN) – What does it take to host a day of charity bicycle rides and a walking event? A lot of work up front, according to the Tour de Tellico host organization.

As Saturday, September 25 approaches, members of the Tellico Lake Rotary Club are busy making final preparations for the fifth annual Tour de Tellico events. Bicycling and walking routes have been selected, personal-

ly travelled and mapped out on the Internet. The event Web site has been updated and readied to accept online registrations. Sponsors have been solicited, promotional literature distributed, and route staffing and safety support are finalized. "Now, we cross our fingers for great weather," said Jim Getchonis, event chair with the Rotary Club. "This is our fifth year working with the Tour de Tellico charity bike rides and walking events and, due to foul weather in

past years, we have yet to see the true potential of the Tour. Given good weather, participation could be fantastic."

Last year, despite torrential rain, more than 90 cyclists participated in Tour de Tellico. According to Getchonis, based on a significant increase in sponsor participation, this year's Tour de Tellico should be a record-setting event. Adding an extra dimension to the 2010 Tour de Tellico is participation by Get With It, a not-for-profit organization

addressing women's health issues in the Monroe and Loudon county area. Get With It organized and will lead the Tour de Tellico Fun Walk. The group will offer "stations" along an approximate 3-mile walk to entertain and inform participants on healthy lifestyle services, nutritional education, free exercise groups and self-esteem and self-awareness programs made available by Get With It. The Fun Walk will be followed by a nutritional lunch that is included free with Fun Walk registration.

Tour de Tellico bicyclists are offered a choice of 50 kilometer and 100 kilometer rides that will begin at Tellico Village Square and cover scenic routes through portions of Loudon and Monroe County. For seasoned cyclists, a 100 mile "Century" ride is

available. Most participants in this event have spent much of the summer training for a route that will cover more challenging roads bordering Monroe County foothills.

"To keep track of riders, Blount Emergency Communications Services (BECS) staffs checkpoints along the routes. Should a rider experience difficulty, BECS volunteers and Tellico Lake Rotary members will be there to assist," Getchonis added.

What are fruits of this Rotary Club's labor? Getchonis expects this year's Tour de Tellico will generate more than \$10,000 for Loudon County Habitat for Humanity, Monroe County Boys & Girls Club, Get With It and other selected Rotary charities.
