Two Sweetwater men were charged with promoting methamphetamine production after they were reported for buying a component drug at a Lenoir City pharmacy and several boxes of the pills were found in their vehicle.

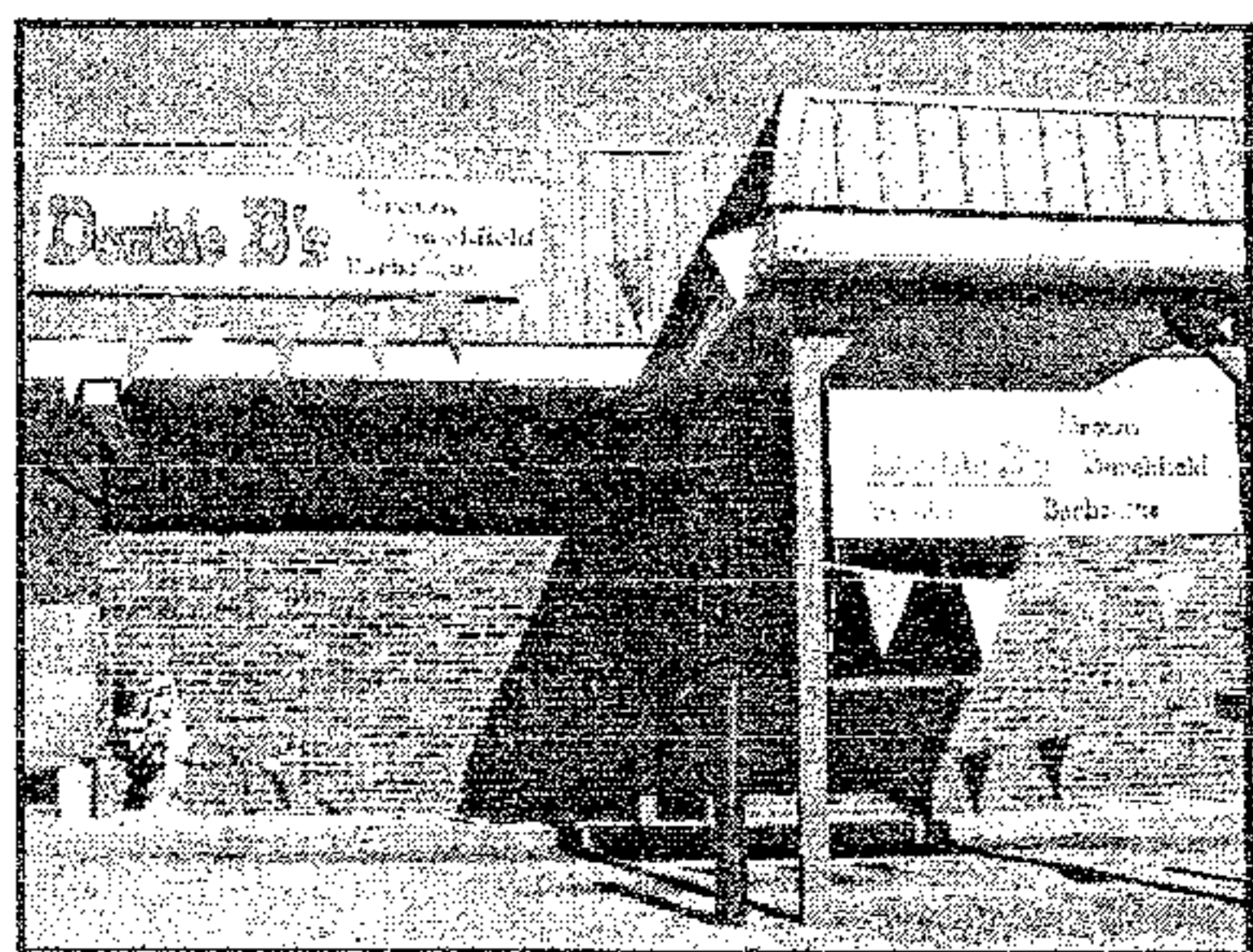

first segment runs from Sept. 25-Oct. 29 while the remaining two will be Nov. 1-5, and Dec. 6-17.

For better wildlife management, Tennessee is divided into the three deer units-A, B, and L. The antlerless deer bag limit for each unit is: Unit A -4; Unit B -2; and Unit L -3 per day. (A map identifying the Deer Management Units can be found on page 24 of the 2010 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide and on the TWRA website).

The antlered deer bag limit is a total of three for the year. A hunter may take his or her three antlered deer during any season, but no more than one per day. There is no longer the requirement to change units or seasons in order to take three antlered deer.

Anyone born on or after January 1, 1969 is required to carry proof of satisfactory completion of a hunter education class or be in possession of the Apprentice Hunting License (along with other required licenses) while hunting any species in Tennessee.

In 2009, Tennessee sportsmen

harvested more than 2,200 deer on the two-day opening weekend. Giles County had 77 deer harvested to edge Montgomery County's 74 for the top opening weekend. Lincoln County was third with 67, followed by Carter County 60, Cumberland County and Henry County 51, Hawkins County 50, Hardeman County and Johnson County 49, Stewart County 47 and Hamilton County had 45 to be the top opening weekend harvest counties.

Busted

Junior Harmon, Paris Drive, also of Sweetwater were charged Sunday with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture.

According to reports, LCPD Officers Emily Lawson and Kevin Condee were investigating a report of suspicious persons purchasing pseudoephedrine at Walgreens. The Walgreens Pharmacy has become increasingly concerned about the dramatic influx of people from the

Sweetwater area coming to the business to purchase pseudoephedrine in recent weeks since the pharmacies in that area have stopped selling the product due to rampant methamphetamine production.

After the subjects left Walgreens, Officer Condee stopped their silver Dodge Dakota pickup in the parking lot of Arby's Restaurant.

When officers spoke with the two men, the driver, Mr. Moore and the passenger, Mr. Harmon, admitted purchas-

ing the pseudoephedrine, but wouldn't admit to their intention of using it to manufacture methamphetamine.

Mr. Moore gave consent to search the vehicle. There were 3 boxes of cold pills, all containing pseudoephedrine discovered in the vehicle. One of the boxes was hidden, stuffed behind the dash of the truck. Purchase receipts showed the boxes were purchased at different pharmacies a short time apart on the same day. The total amount of pseudoephedrine totaled

8.16 grams.

There was probable cause to believe Moore and Harmon intended to use the pseudoephedrine for the purpose of manufacturing methamphetamine and they were taken into custody.

Skidmore

Angela Dawn Skidmore, 35, Poplar Street, Loudon was charged Sunday with DUI 1st offense and reckless driving.

According to records, Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD observed a blue Chevy pickup traveling southbound on Highway 11 at a high rate of speed in the City of Loudon. The officer clocked the pickup at 71 mph in a 30 mph zone and noticed it was driving erratically.

After the officer initiated his emergency equipment the vehicle traveled several blocks before stopping. Angela Skidmore was the driver and while speaking to the occupants of the vehicle the officer noted he could smell the odor of burnt marijuana.

Ms. Skidmore advised Officer DeBoer almost immediately she was in a rush to get to the hospital because she was having a miscarriage. Loudon Fire Department responded to the

scene and she was subsequently transported to the Fort Loudoun ER. Prior to her transport to the hospital, Ms. Skidmore had slurred speech and was unsteady on her feet. She advised officers she smoked marijuana and took hydrocodone and other prescription medication prior to be stopped.

Skidmore was released from the ER after learning she was not pregnant and was medically cleared. She was not given field sobriety due to the apparent medical emergency and being uncooperative, but she was read, signed and submitted to a BAC test via the Tennessee Implied Consent form.

Chevy Shane Schlemmer, 18, Poplar street, Loudon was charged with simple possession of marijuana.

Mr. Schlemmer was the front seat passenger and after advising him of his Miranda Warnings he stated to Officer DeBoer there was a bag of marijuana in a container on the front passenger floorboard. A plastic bag containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana was recovered.

Sgt. Scott Newman, LPD was also on scene.
