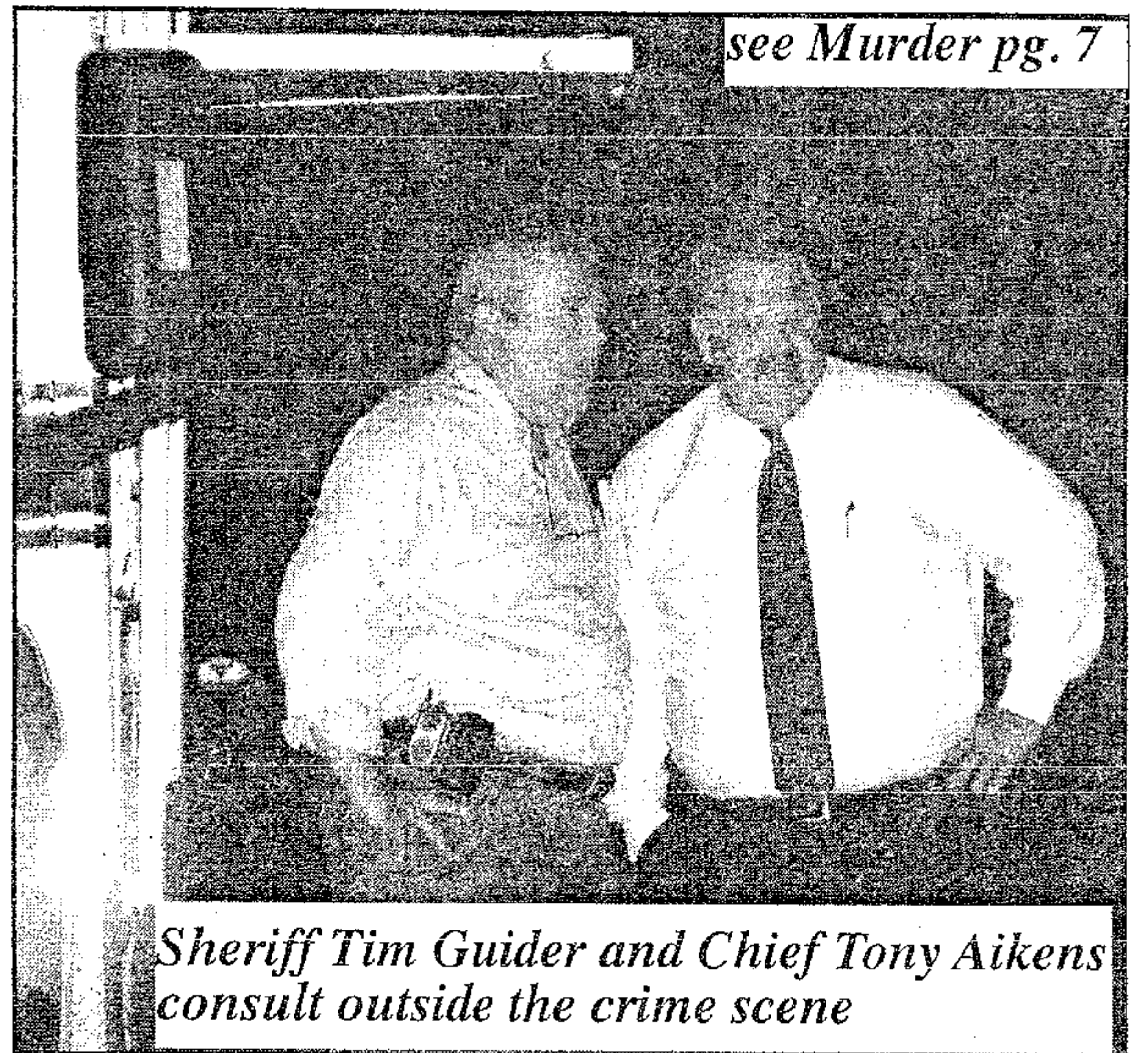
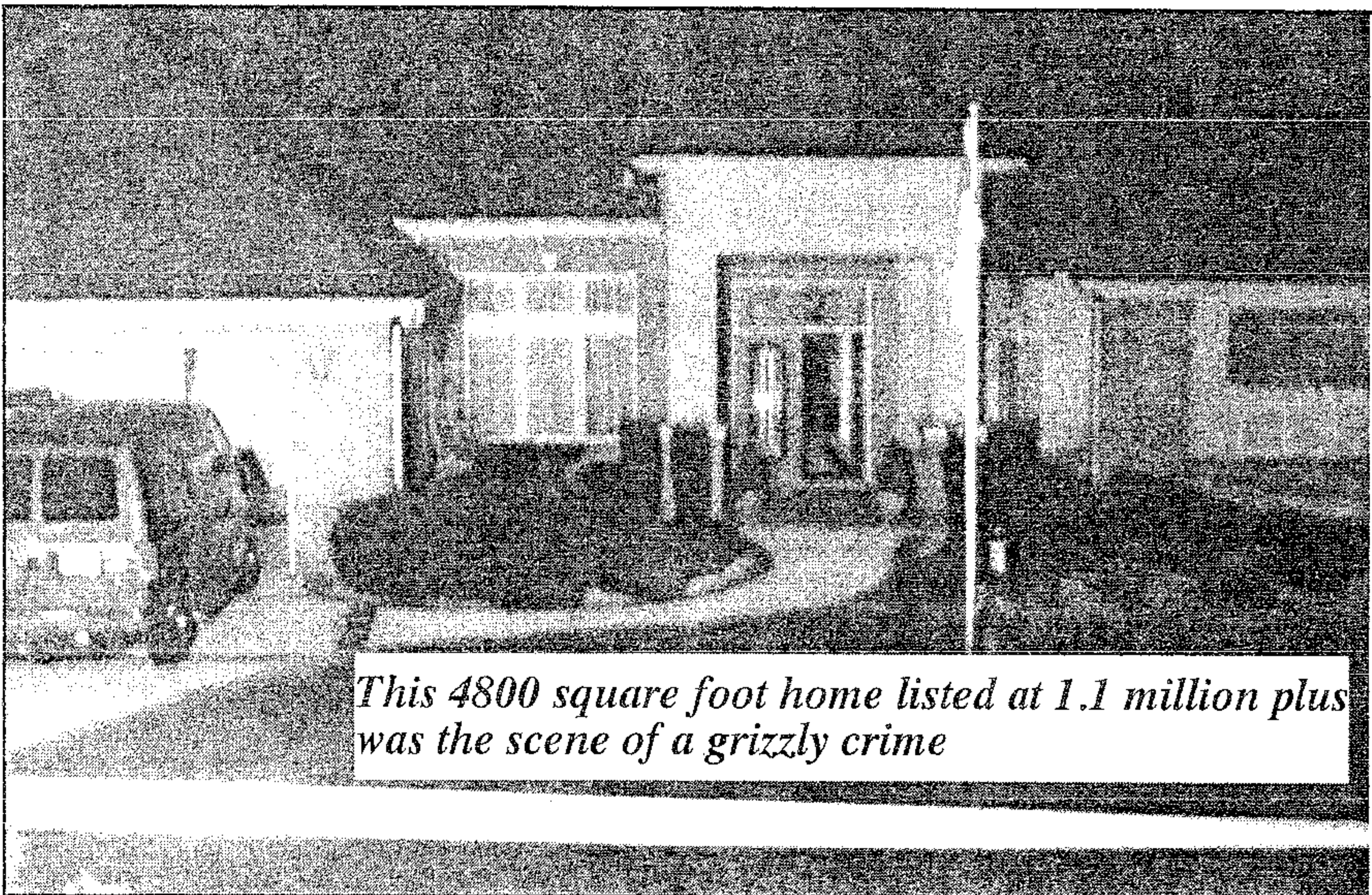

### \$200,000+ stolen in burglary

A local couple told authorities over \$200,000 in sports memorabilia and other items had been taken from a storage area of their residence sometime over the several months.

According to records, around 7:13 p.m., Deputy J. Schultz, LCSO answered a theft call on Martel Road. The complainants, Jack and Freda Faddis stated sometime between December 12th, 2009 and September 19th, 2010, someone entered the upstairs portion of their residence and took a large

## Aggravated

Kenneth J. Collins, 27, Old Spears Road, Lenoir City was charged with aggravated burglary x 2, theft under \$500 and theft over \$1000.

According to affidavits filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID; Shirley Tindle, Markwood Road, Loudon reported someone broke into her residence on August 8th, 2010, and took several items without permission. The stolen items were described as two flat screen TVs, a 42" and a 20", an HP laptop computer, two men's silver rings, Yamaha generator, a flat top Gibson guitar and a 300 piece Craftsman tool set.

Upon further investigation, it was discovered Kenneth Collins entered Ms. Tindle's residence and took the items then pawned the generator to in Maryville.

Collins reportedly soled the two televisions to a local woman and it was unknown

what he did with the other items at the time of arrest.

Further records indicate Jerome Wiggins of Steekee Road, Loudon reported someone broke into his residence on August 21st, 2010, and took some silver change and a UT Fossil watch.

Upon further investigation it was learned Kenneth Collins entered the residence and took the items. He sold the watch to a man who, in turn pawned it at a Lenoir City pawnshop for \$15.

Investigator Russell made the arrest.

### Lawn mower falls from trunk

A lawn mower reportedly fell from a trunk when a authorities tried to stop a suspicious vehicle and the driver eluded them.

According to reports, Saturday, at approximately 12:45 AM, Deputy James Bowman, LCSO was dispatched to the area of Highway 11 at Hall Street in reference to a suspicious vehicle. The complainant, Corporal JJ Wiggins, said he observed a blue Buick parked in a parking lot on Highway 11 around Hall Street with a lawn mower in the trunk. When Corporal Wiggins tried to make contact with the vehicle, it took off on Highway 11 towards Hall Street.

Corporal Wiggins lost contact with the vehicle on Highway 11. Deputy Bowman was in the area of Hall Street and Lee Hi Street trying to locate the blue Buick when he found the lawn mower lying in the ditch.

The mower was lying on it's top with damage from where it fell out of the trunk. It's described as a red Craftsman walk behind with an estimated value of \$300.

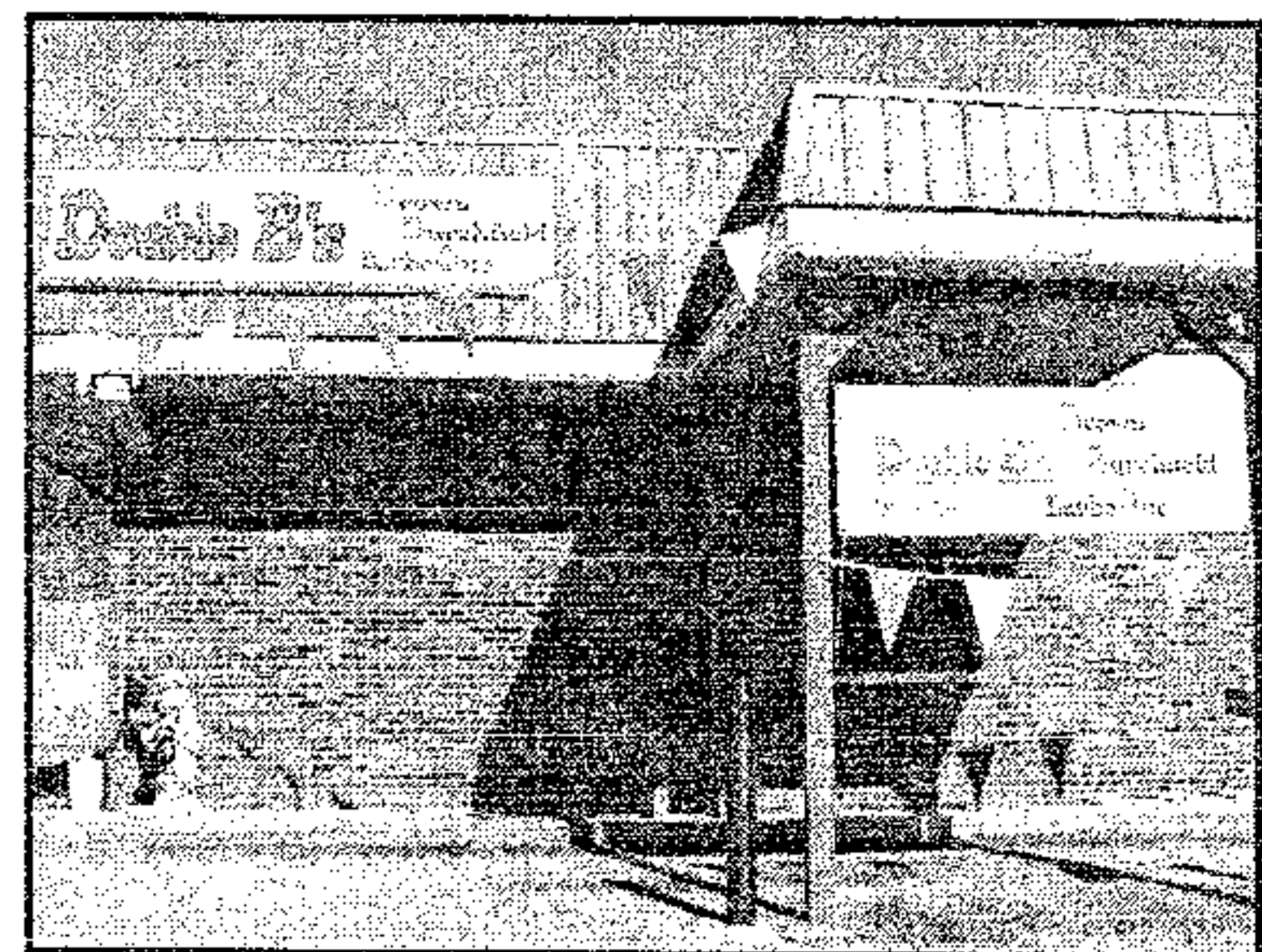

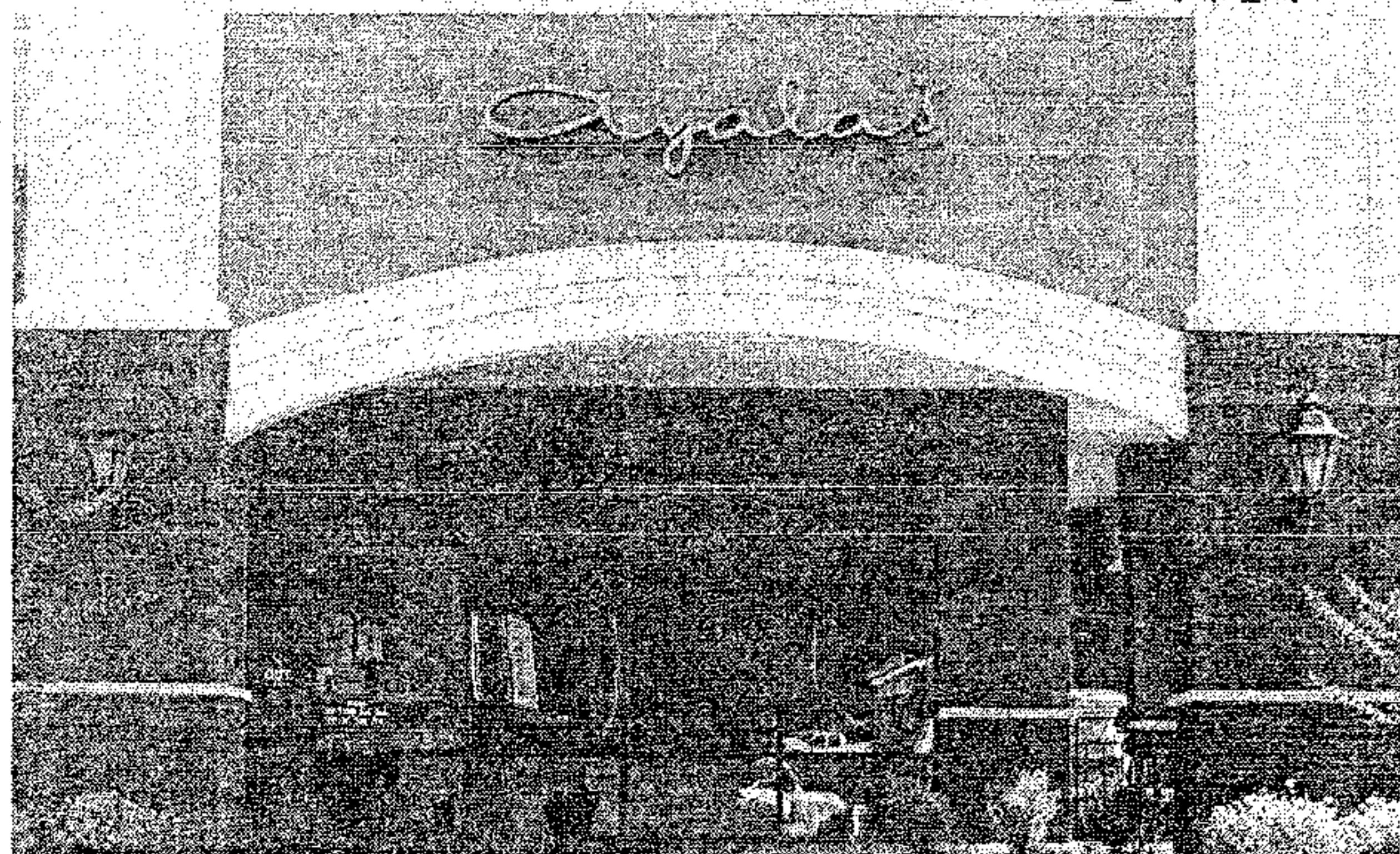

## Murder

Chief Deputy A. Tony Aikens reported "Just after 5pm Thursday evening Loudon County Sheriff's Department was called to 139 Cheeskogili Way in Tellico Village to a deceased elderly man. Upon their arrival they discovered an elderly white male deceased under suspicious circumstances and it appeared to be a homicide. Investigators with LCSD then arrived on the scene and District Attorney General Russell Johnson was contacted to have the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation Crime Investigation Unit come in to assist with the investigation.

During a press conference held Thursday night Chief Aikens reported a neighbor checked on the man at the request of a family

member and that neighbor discovered the body and called LCSD. Chief Aikens reported it did not appear the man was deceased long and an autopsy is going to be performed at UT Medical Center, which will tell more.

At press time Chief Aikens reported, "At this time we have no reason to believe this man had any enemies and we are following up on several leads."

Sheriff Tim Guider stated "we will be here throughout the night to ensure the perimeter of the crime scene and continue our investigation and are working closely with the TBI to find out what occurred."

General Johnson stated "The TBI CIU has the ability to immediately investigate evidence collected at a crime scene as they

have direct access to the Crime lab and have technicians available around the clock for these types of cases. The LCSO would have to collect the evidence and send it to the TBI lab to be investigated and then be processed which would take much longer."

Friday afternoon, a press conference was held in which Sheriff Guider stated "we are following several leads and hope to have more information in the following days."

The victim is Ronald Kronholm, 79. He was a local builder having built several homes in Tellico Village.

Just two streets away in April of this year, another shooting left Larry Butcher dead and Norman Whitton facing charges after a confrontation between drivers of a golf cart and a car.

Norman Whitton was charged in the case, which went to a grand jury in June.
