just occurred on Summer Street in Loudon. Dispatch advised a buigundy Ford Explorer left the scene of the assault and the driver was Christopher Johnson.

Shortly thereafter, a vehicle matching that description passed Officer DeBoer at a high rate of speed. Chris Johnson was behind the wheel and a female was in the passenger seat. The officer initiated his emergency equipment and attempted to stop the Explorer. The vehicle continued on Highway 11 north towards Sugarlimb Road.

The Explorer increased it's speed to 80+ mph and passed numerous vehicles by crossing over the double yellow line in an attempt to evade law enforcement.

The vehicle continued on Highway 11 and Mr. Johnson increased his speed to 100+ mph, so Officer DeBoer determined the risk to the general public and the occupants of the Explorer were too great to continue the pursuit and terminated it.

A short time later, Mr. Johnson was seen traveling on Kingston Street in Lenoir City where he was stopped and placed into custody by Officer

Brian Smith, LCPD.

At the time of his arrest, Mr. Johnson had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person. He also had watery glassy eyes, slurred speech and was very unsteady on his feet. Johnson became belligerent following arrest, so for officer safety reasons and Mr. Johnson's inability to cooperate, field Sobriety tasks were not performed.

The passenger in the vehicle, by her own account and by statements made by Mr. Johnson, was not involved in the evasion and on multiple occasions told him to stop and she even attempted to jump out of the Explorer in fear for her life.
