


1080 Investigators Charge Former Business Partner with 1st Degree Murger of Village Man

During a press conference Wednesday afternoon, investigators with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office revealed they have charged the former business partner of a Tellico Village man with his murder after he was found sitting in his wheelchair inside his home with multiple gunshot wounds.

On September 23, 2010 just after 5pm Loudon County Sheriff's Officer Investigator Patrick Upton was dispatched to

Cheeskagili Way in Tellico Village to investigate a homicide. The victim was identified as Ron Kronholm, age 79 and he was found confined to a wheelchairbetween the kitchen and living room area. Mr. Kronholm suffered multiple gunshot



wounds that were consistent with a shotgun. On Wednesday, September 29 just after llam, a former business partner of the victim, John Lee Ne vans, was charged with

first-degree murder and is currently under no bond in the Loudon County Jail.

According to investigators, Nevans had informed others he as unhappy with Mr. Kronholm because he was losing money on property. The same day of the homicide Mr. Nevans was in Loudon during the same time period of events and had also told at least one person not to give his real time of arrival at his residence in Dayton, TN.

Video evidence at the Hwy 72 Deli in Loudon

on the day of the homicide showed Nevans inside the store with tennis shoes on, blue jeans and button shirt. On further investigation of the clothing, Mr. Nevans advised that brown leather shoes is what he had on during that time and did arrive home in Dayton with leather shoes on. The two tennis shoes have not been located by any search or given to investigators by Nevans. Blood was also found on clothing Nevans was wearing including his pants below his knees which was consistent with blood splatter from the crime scene. Some blood was also found in the trunk

explain. Upon interviewing Mr. Nevans several statements were made that were inconsistent and he also advised the victim had taken him for about \$300,000. Maroon paint was found on Nevans white pickup what was consistent with the color of Kronholms van that also had white paint transfer on it. A shot-

gun that at one time belonged to Nevans and had been taken by his son cannot be located. There has been no police report filed from Nevans or his son about the gun being stolen or taken in a burglary.

Prior to being arrested or accused of the crime Nevans reportedly told his wife he wanted to go to South America and she refused to go. Nevans advised the reason he was in Loudon County on September 23rd was for some unfinished business with the real estate company. However, interview with the company employees advised they had no more business with Nevans and they did not need him to come to Loudon County for any reason.

John Lee Nevans, 67, of 330 Highland Drive, Dayton, TN was charged with first-degree murder. He was arraigned in General Sessions Court by Judge Rex Dale and is scheduled for a preliminary hearing on October 6, 2010 at 9am in General Sessions Court.




