The three-day festival kicks off Friday, Sept. 10 at 7 p.m. with an old-fashioned square dance and jam session, with music provided by the Blue Creek Ramblers and the Roan Mountain Hilltoppers. The old-time train music of Roy Harper will add to the opening night's fun.

Beginning at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 11, will be pioneer demonstrations, music and

storytelling, in addition to crafts and food booths.
