

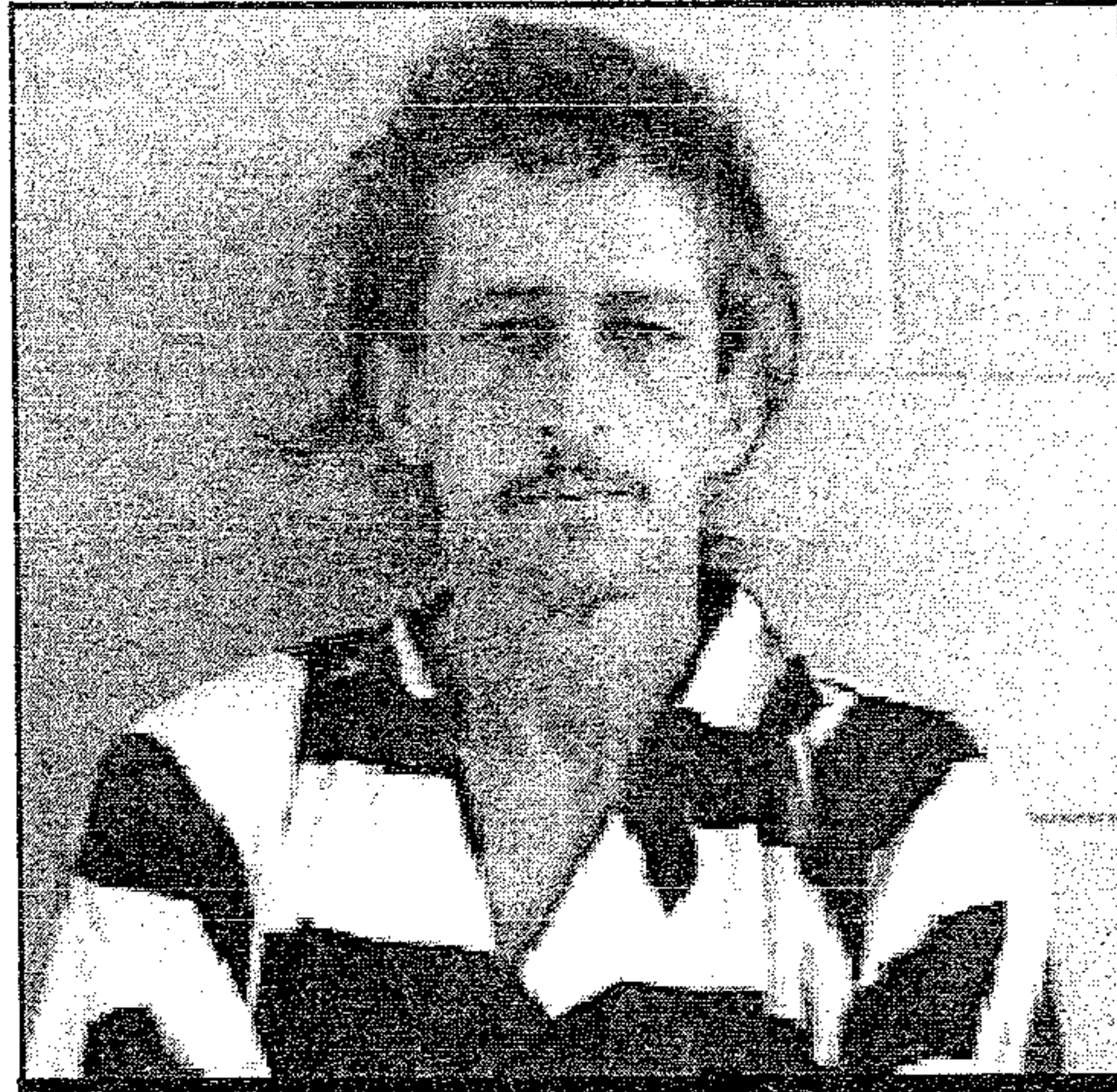
Revoked driver flees accident scene

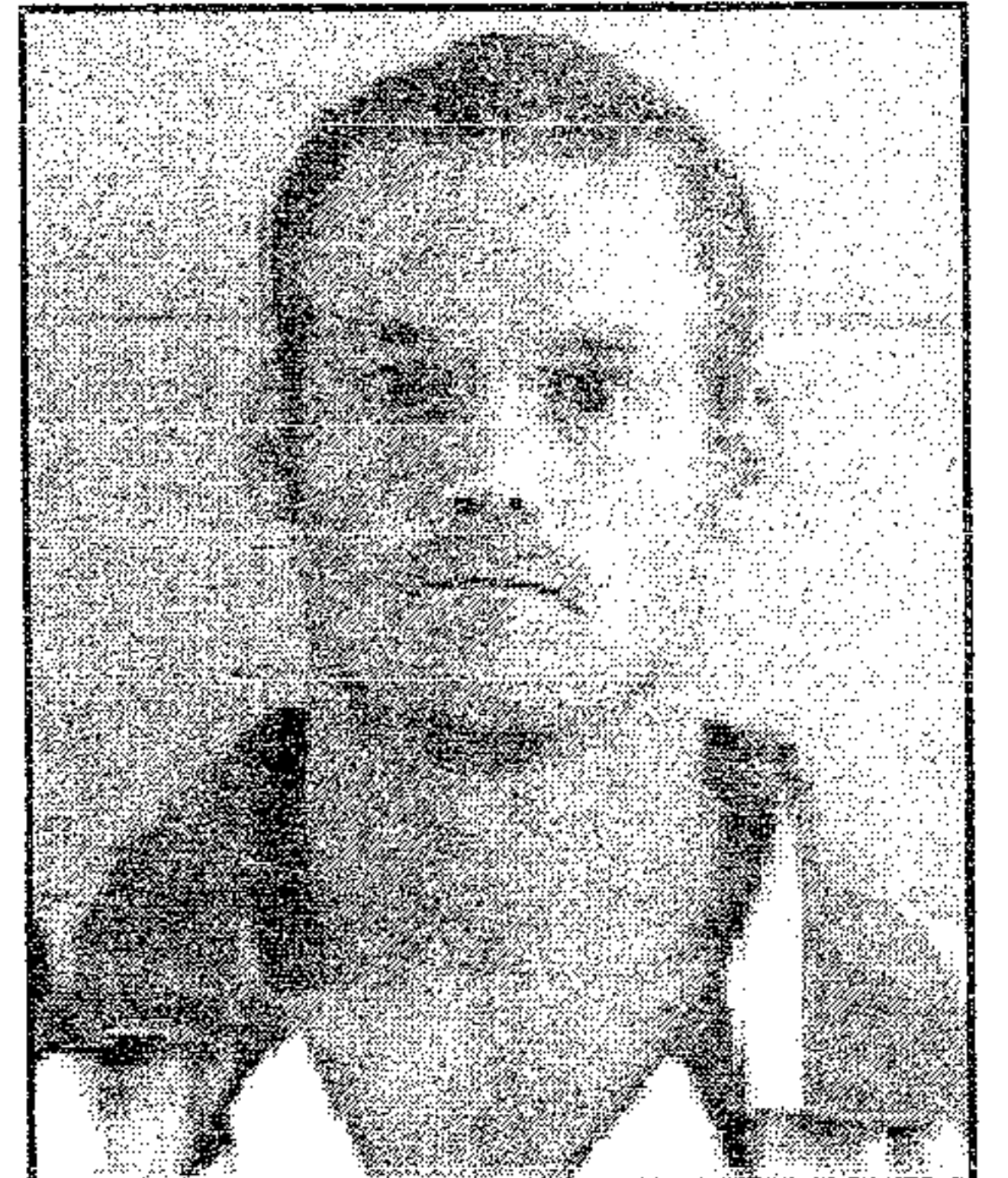
Man accused of stealing iodine

by Deputy Mike Williams, LCSO; based upon witness testimony and physical evidence collected at the scene,

there is probable cause to believe that on August 25th, 2010, at 10:00 AM, Dicky Gene Noah committed the offense of leaving the

scene of an accident. The accident occurred at the intersection of Highway 72 and Watkins Road in Loudon when Mr. Noah, who was driving a 2003 Nissan Sentra failed to yield at the stop sign on Watkins Road and collided with a 2004 Honda mini van operated by Daniel Stricklan, which was traveling on Highway 72. After the impact, Mr. Noah

failed to stop and render aid and fled the scene. Upon investigation by Deputy Williams, Mr. Noah's vehicle was found approximately three miles from the scene at a residence on Vonore Road in Loudon. Witnesses at the residence advised Mr. Noah was driving the Nissan Sentra when he arrived at the residence, but called someone to pick him up soon after. Mr. Noah

was already gone prior the deputy's arrival. Evidence collected at the scene, which included a headlight and front bumper, matched damages to the vehicle found, as well as the license plate number which Daniel Stricklan and passengers were able to get when Mr. Noah fled the scene. Deputy John Wilson, LCSO made the arrest Saturday, at the Monroe County Jail.

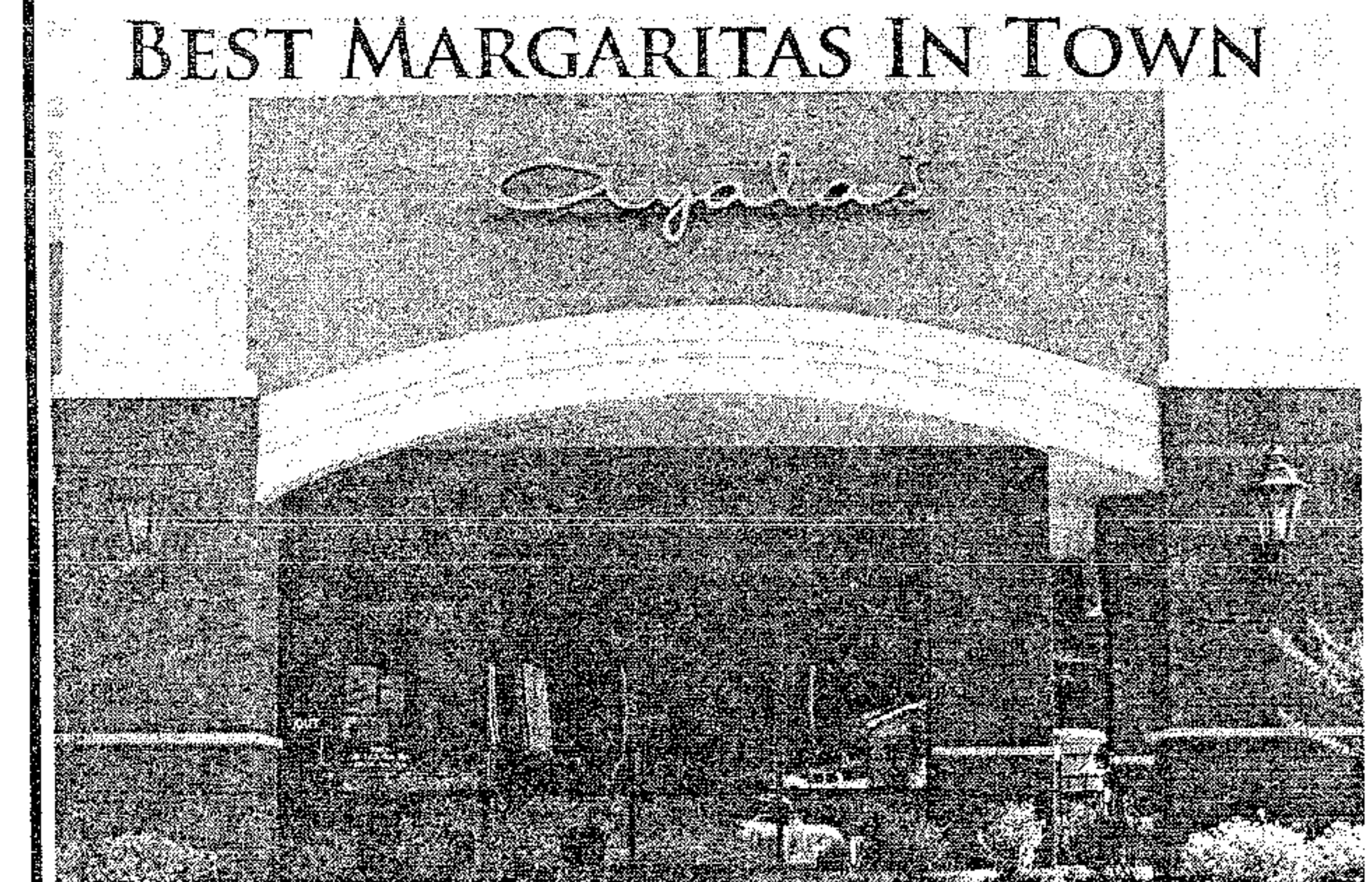

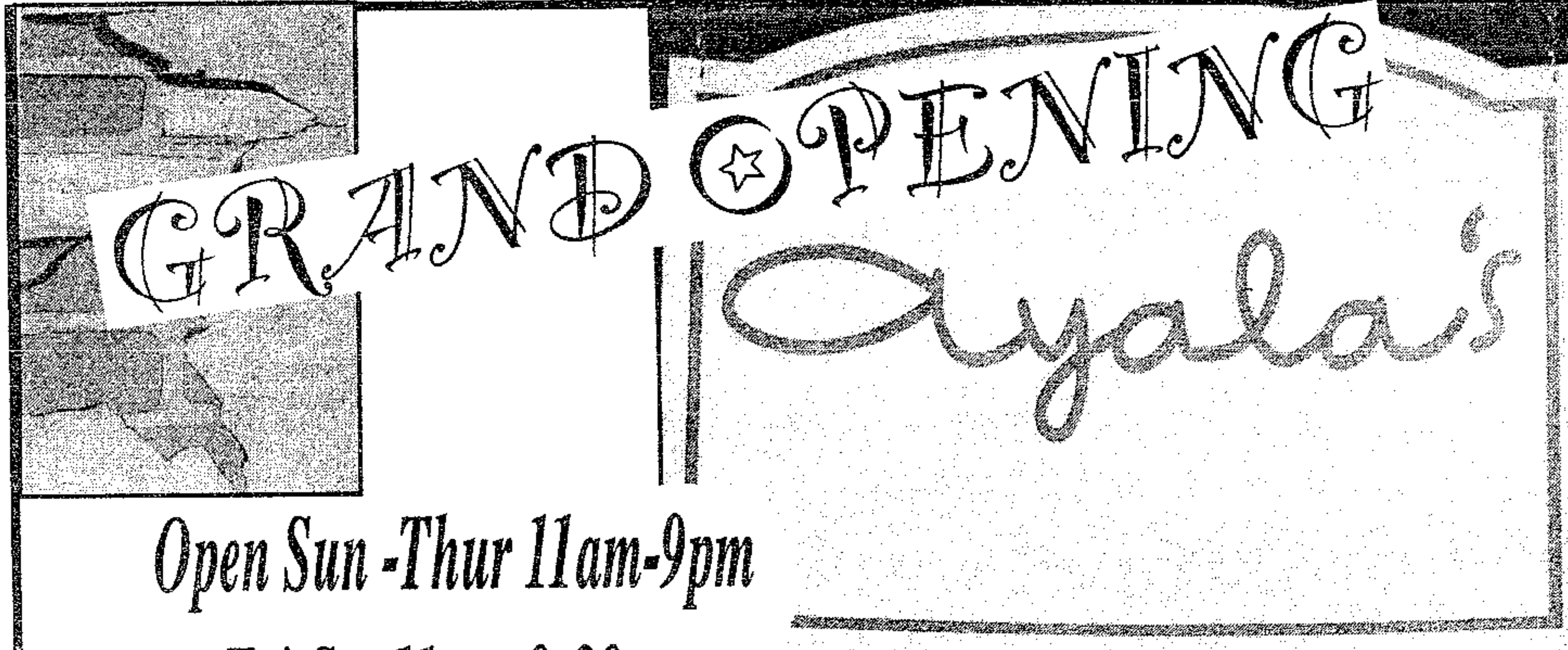

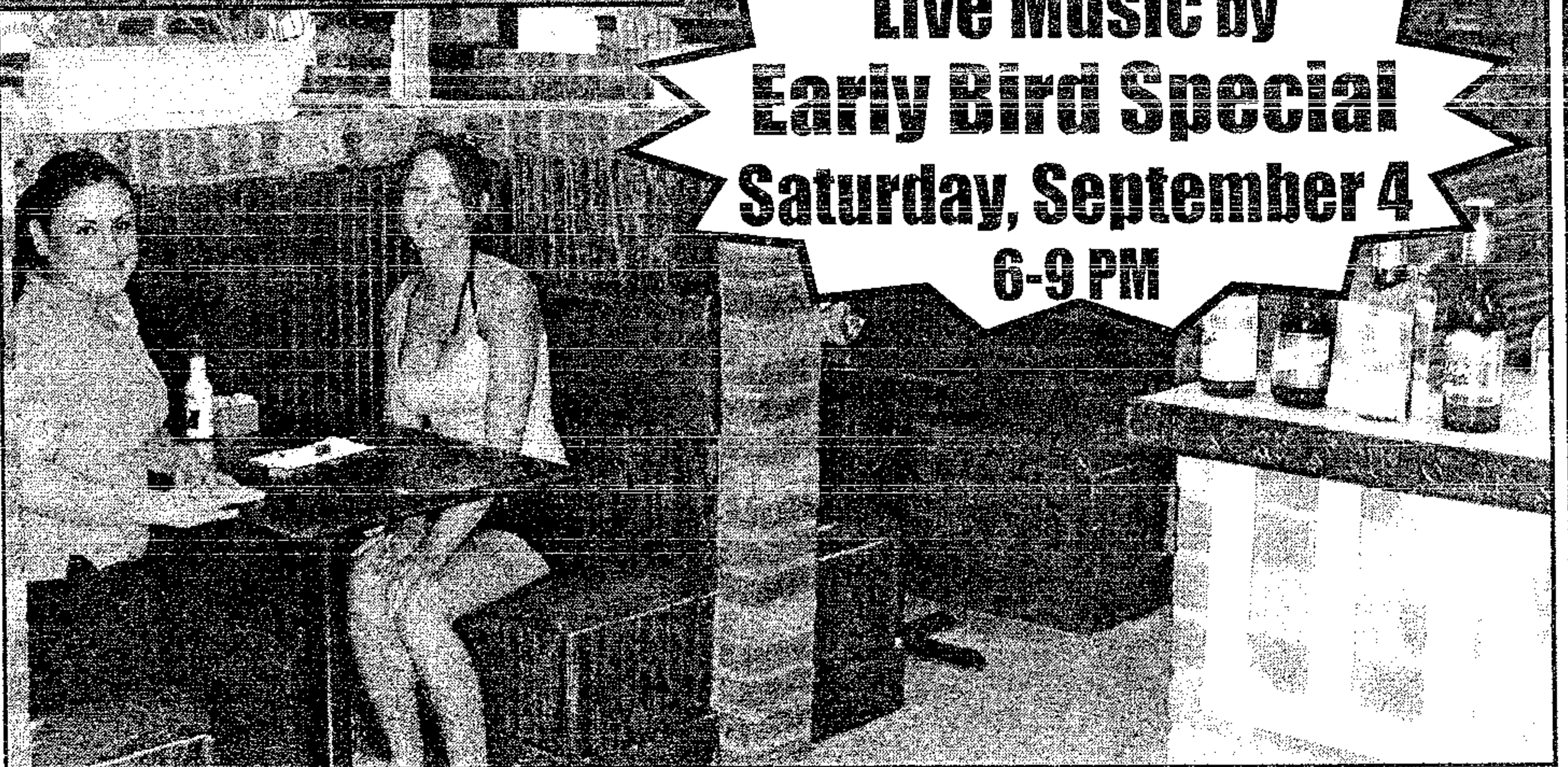
