



The lawman opened the right rear door and removed the coat from the passenger's lap and reported that as he pulled the coat, the man's arm seemed to be stuck in the coat.

The man was not armed and stated he was reaching for his cell phone, although no phone was immediately found. Trooper Morton performed a pat down of the coat and noticed a large object in the coat and looked in the pockets, but nothing was found. He laid the coat on top of the car and continued with the business at hand.

The driver was identified as Jordan Helton. The owner of the car was identified as Bertha Ellsworth, one of the backseat passengers. The driver was visibly shaking and stumbling over his words.

The lawman asked the driver to exit the vehicle. While performing the license, vehicle and warrants check, Mr. Helton stated he was returning from a trip to Georgia where he did some drinking with a buddy, but he did not know the name of the town, what they did while there, and was unsure of when he left home or where they stayed while in Georgia. Helton said all he did was stayed in the hotel and drank alcohol.

The owner of the vehicle, Ms. Ellsworth, gave a conflicting account of the purpose of the trip, where they stayed and who was there.

granted consent to search the vehicle from the owner and the driver. Consent was also obtained from the two other passengers in the car. They were identified as Mark Paul and Jammy Poore.

Inside the lining of Mr. Poore's coat were

several medicine bottles, which were clearly missing approximately half of hydrocodone and alpraxolam, even though the bottles were filled that day. Two more medicine bottles were found in the coat and according to their labels the bottles were

filled on Monday, but again more than half of the medication was missing.


A pat down of Poore's person revealed a bottle with an assortment of medication and a contact lens case with different medication. He stated Ms. Ellsworth was holding the rest of his medication for an unknown reason. Ellsworth, however, denied having any medicine

and stated she had not seen a doctor.

Records indicate criminal activity was apparent to the trooper and he escorted the group to the Loudon County Jail for further investigation.

Prior to a search of Ms. Ellsworth as she entered the jail, she pulled from her underwear a black pouch containing three bottles



of medication. The pills did not match labeling, her name, and had many different medicines inside. She also pulled a bottle from her bra, her pocket, and her leg brace. Ellsworth had \$1900 rolled in a rubber band in her left sock.

During the investigation, it was learned Ms. Ellsworth used her

money to fund the trips, including doctor visits, medication, MRI, hotel, food, gas, etc, of the other passengers in exchange for half of the medication. Ms. Ellsworth denied seeing a doctor on that particular trip and had no medication bottles from the trip time frame. However, she was in possession of approximately 273 pills of assorted types. The amount was roughly the number of pills missing from Mr. Poore and Mr Paul combined.

There were also ledgers in her purse, with pill milligrams and dollar amounts, as well as names. According to Trooper Morton, these ledgers are typically used to keep tally of what is owed to a person. Ms. Ellsworth, Mr.

Poore, and Mr. Paul were all charged with the intent to obtain, deliver and cell schedule II, III, and IV narcotics. Although Mr. Helton had seen a doctor, no medication was received and therefore no transaction was made. He was released with-

out charges.
