



deer-related crashes. We want to remind all motorists to be especially alert at dawn and after sunset, and to exercise extra caution when not traveling on major thoroughfares."

In Tennessee, between 2006 and 2010, 9.2 percent of deer-related crashes occurred on interstate highways. In 2010, there were 5,406 deer-related crashes, including 281 that involved injuries and one that was fatal. That was up by 1.6 percent from 5,320 the previous year. However, since 2006, deerrelated crashes in Tennessee have decreased 7.7 percent.

Additionally, State Farm®, the nation's leading auto insurer, estimates 2.3 million collisions between deer in the U.S. between July 1, 2008 and June 30, 2010. That's 21.1 percent more than five years earlier.

Safety and Homeland nearest THP Commu-Security and the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency has the following tips to help prevent deer-related crashes during peak lows deer killed in a mating and hunting seasons:

Be attentive; drive defensively, constantly scanning the roadside, especially at daybreak and dusk.

Do not swerve to avoid contact with deer. This could cause the vehicle to flip or veer into oncoming traffic, causing a more serious crash. Swerving also confuse the deer as to where to run.

•When you spot a deer, slow down immediately. Proceed slowly until you pass that point.

oIf you do collide with a deer, never approach the injured animal. They are powerful and can cause bodily harm to a human. Report any deer collision, even if the damage is minor.
