





As I watched and listened to stories of everything from dollhouses to fishing gear, my eyes became focused on one of my fellow classmates. This student was not wearing new "Christmas clothes" and he did not look excited. It finally dawned on me what was going on; he was dreading his turn to share because he didn't receive any Christmas gifts. There was no joy and excitement, just obvious fear and embarrassment. I could see it on his face and in his eyes

and I could almost feel the

When it was his turn to share I watched as he stumbled through naming something that we all knew was not true. He tried to hide his embarrassment with a lie but I could see right through it. Others did too and even began to call him out on his claim.

I felt horrible as I'm sure our teacher did at that moment but it was too late.

Imagine what it must have felt like to be that boy! Imagine how many kids will wake up this Christmas to a sack full of nothing? There's a lot of hurting families this year. God can really use us if we will just let Him.

Last week I encouraged Christians who were thankful for the blessings in their life to do something nice for someone else in the name of Jesus during Thanksgiving. If you did, I bet it felt good and God blessed you.

I'm worried that our world will continue to go

to hell in a hand basket unless we as Christians decide that we want God to be involved in our decisions, our lives, our finances and our future. There is not a larger coalition of Christians somewhere that is responsible for working with God in regards to our children, our community or our nation. It is you, it is me, and it is the person who sits beside you on Sunday morning that has to quit playing church and BETHE CHURCH!

After Jesus was crucified and raised from the dead He spent forty days on earth with the disciples.
