

female who indicated she was assaulted and placed in the trunk of the vehicle. Monroe County advised that the vehicle could be headed in the direction of Oakland Road towards Interstate 75. Sgt. Russell positioned his patrol unit on I-75 northbound at mile marker 76, where he observed the vehicle traveling north at approximately 12:30 a.m. EST.

a.m., Sgt. Russell, with the assistance of three additional-THP units, made a felony traffic stop on Interstate 40 eastbound at the Watt Road exit without incident.
