



According to an affidavit filed by Investigator Jason R. Smith, LCSO-CID; Michael Lynn Scott is a registered sex offender with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office. On June 23rd, 2010, Mr. Scott reported to the LCSO Sex Offender Registrar and stated he was living at 150 Scott Street in Philadelphia.

Mr. Scott also signed the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation sexual offender instructions on the same date. These instructions state, upon

changing a primary residence, the offender shall report to the designated law enforcement agency within 48 hours.

Information was obtained that Mr. Scott has been residing at 130 Scott Street with a woman and her children, ages ten and eleven, since December 2010. This violates the sanctions of the sex offender program registry of disclosing required information to designated law enforcement.

A search warrant was executed on February 18th, 2011, and items were located that showed Mr. Scott had been residing at the residence.

Investigator Smith made the arrest Friday.



NCIC revealed Thornton's license was not valid and he was placed under arrest.


Marco Antonio Gonzalez, 20, Beals Chapel Road, Lenoir City was charged Saturday with driving without a license.


